# School Censuses Show Unusual Growth Pattern

Some unusual school population growth patterns have evolved from the latest biennial census just completed in the Silverton Union High School Districts.

Most rural districts have shown substantial increases in the past two years since the 1964 census, but the school population growth in the 4C District, which includes Silverton, has been surprisingly negligible.

The census, which counts everyone from the age of four through 19, showed a total of 4611 in the 11 elementary districts in the 7J High School District, plus North Howell which lies in the Gervais Dis-

However, the Silverton 4C enrollment during the past two years has increased by only 10 children . . . from to 1819.
