IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE
RELATIVE RIGHTS TO THE WATERS OF SQUAW
CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF THE DESCHUTES RIVER,
IN CROOK COUNTY, OREGON.

FINDINGS AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

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Now on this 16th day of November, 1910, the above entitled matter coming on for the consideration of the Board of Control of the State of Oregon, at a regular meeting of said Board commenced and held on said date, and the said Board having considered the evidence and proofs filed herein and being now fully advised in the premises, finds as follows;

(1)

That a proper petition praying for an adjudication of the relative rights to the waters of said Squaw Creek, signed by P. Van Tassel and others, water users on said stream was heretofore and on the 9th day of April, 1909, filed with the Board of Control of the State of Oregon.

(2)

That upon an investigation, said Board of Control found the facts and conditions such as to justify the making of a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream and thereupon, by order duly made and entered on the 15th day of April, 1909, fixed the 16th day of August, 1909 as the time when the State Engineer of the State of Oregon would begin an investigation of the flow of said stream and of the ditches diverting water therefrom and the 29th day of September, 1909, as the time when, and the Sisters Hotel, in the town of Sisters, in Crook County, Oregon, as the place where the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 would commence the taking of testimony and proofs as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream.

That pursuant to such order, a notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer of the State of Oregon would begin the investigation of the flow of said stream and of the ditches diverting water therefrom, to-wit: the 16th day of August, 1909, and the time and place where the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 would commence the taking of testimony as to the rights of the parties claiming water therefrom, to-wit: the 29th day of September, 1909 at the Sisters Hotel in the town of Sisters, Crook County, Oregon; was duly and regularly published in two issues of the Crook County Journal, a weekly newspaper of general circulation within said County of Crook and published at Prineville, Crook County, Oregon, the date of last publication thereof being more than 30 days prior to the beginning of the taking of testimony by said division superintendent, or the examination of said stream and ditches by the State Engineer; due proof whereof being now on file in the office of said Board of Control and a part of the record herein; that said Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did, on the 13th day of July, 1909, send, by registered mail, a notice similar to such published notice, to each person, firm and corporation claiming a right to the use of any of the waters of said stream or its tributaries, and to each person, firm and corporation owning or being in possession of lands bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, in so far as such claimants could be reasonably ascertained, and that said Superintendent did, enclose with said notice a blank form on which said claimant, owner or person in possession should present in writing all of the particulars necessary for the determination of his rights to the use of the waters of said stream to which he should lay claim; due proof whereof being now on file in the office of the Board of Control and a part of the record herein.

That pursuant to such notice a duly qualified assistant to the State Engineer did proceed to make an examination of said stream and of the works diverting water therefrom, including the measurement of the discharge of said stream, and of the carrying capacity of the various ditches and canals diverting water therefrom, and an examination and approximate measurement of the lands irrigated and susceptible of irrigation from said ditches or canals, which said observations have been reduced to writing and made a matter of record in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Oregon; and the said Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, did, at the time and place in said notice specified, take testimony and proofs of claimants to the waters of said stream, said claimants being hereinafter named in the findings as to their respective rights, due proof of such hearing being on file herein, and a part of the records in this cause.

That upon the completion of the taking of testimony and proofs aforesaid by the said Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, he did, on the 8th day of January, 1910, send, by registered mail, a notice to each of the claimants to the waters of said stream that all of the evidence, testimony and proofs of the various claimants would be open to inspection for a period of ten days, (Sundays excepted), beginning January 19, 1910 and ending January 29, 1910, from 9:00 o'clock A. M. to 12:00 o'clock M. and from 1:30 o'clock P. M. to 5:00 o'clock P. M. of each day during said period, at the Bank Building in Laidlaw, Crook County, Oregon, and that the determination of the Board of Control in this cause would be heard by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Crook County; due proof whereof and of the mailing of said notices by registered mail being now on file herein.

That pursuant to said notice the said Superintendent did, at the time and place in said notice specified, hold such inspection, due proof whereof being now on file herein.

That all evidence, testimony and proofs filed with the said Division Superintendent in the above entitled matter has been transmitted by him in person to the office of the Board of Control and is now on file in said office.

That the following named persons were duly notified as declared in Finding No. 3 herein, but that each and all of them have failed, neglected and refused to file any claim to the waters of said stream and are in default herein and have no interest in or claim to the waters of said stream; said persons so being in default herein being as follows, to-wit: J. That the Squaw Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, claimant to the waters of Squaw Creek, commenced contests against the claims of the following named persons in said above entitled matter, to-wit: P. B. Davis; H.K. Allen; W. D. Burkhard; William T. E. Wilson; Elwood Roberts; Josephine Stockley; Edward White; Mrs. M. A. McCallister; George W. McCallister; Frederick Leverenz; Lewis McCallister; W. N. Cobb; C. E. Dennison, Robert Smith, R chael McCaffery and Frank McCaffery;

Robert H. Krug; R. J. Griffith; Guy C. McCallister; William A. and Jesse Wilt; J. W. Wilt; Robert Smith; Cloverdale Irrigation Company, a corporation; G.W. McFarlane; Roberts Brothers and Frank Paul. That Anna E. Dayton, claimant to the waters of said stream, commenced contests against the claims of the following named claimants to the waters of said stream, to-wit: Roberts Brothers; J. W. Wilt; Squaw Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, and R. J. Griffith. That Lewis McCallister, claimant to the waters of said stream, commenced contest as against the claim of the Squaw Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, claimant herein. That prior to the taking of testimony in said contests the same were, by order of said Superintendent, based upon the motions of counsels for contestants or stipulations entered into among the parties, dismissed.

That J. N. Quiberg filed a contest herein against the claim of J. B. Palmer and after issues joined the testimony was taken, from which it is determined that the matter in dispute is the right of way for the ditch of said J. B. Palmer over the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 8, Tp. 15 S. R. 10 E. W. M. in Crook County, Oregon, along the East line thereof; that said J. N. Quiberg is not a claimant to the waters of Squaw Creek nor the owner of said land but is attorney-in-fact for his brother, Carl Quiberg, who holds a mortgage upon said land for \$4,000.00, unpaid and past due; that said J. B. Palmer commenced the construction of his ditch in 1903 and continued work thereon with reasonable diligence until the spring of 1908 when he completed the same, tapping Squaw Creek near the southeast corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 8, Tp. 15 S. R. 10 E. W. M., said ditch extending north from said Squaw Creek along and near the east line of said section; that in the construction of said ditch along the east line of said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 8, said J. B. Palmer enlarged and used a waste ditch and an old headgate and a few feet of an irrigating ditch appurtenant to said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 8; as to whether or not said headgate and irrigating ditch had been used for a long period of years, and as to whether or not said Palmer had permission from the owners to so construct his said ditch, the testimony is somewhat conflicting but the Board of Control is convinced and finds that said J. B. Palmer had permission from the owner of said land to so construct his said ditch and should be decreed the right to use and maintain the same as now located subject to the use of the owner of the said SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 8, for irrigation, domestic use and as a conduit for waste water.

That claimants J. N. Wilt and E. C. Wyman are given their appropriations for their respective lands out of Pole Creek but if they or either of them shall not be able at any time to secure sufficient water from said Pole Creek to satisfy their or either of their appropriations as hereinbefore determined, then they or either of them, their heirs or assigns may take such deficiency from Squaw Creek as of the same priority as if taken from said Pole Creek.

That Squaw Creek is a natural water course rising in Crook County, Oregon, flowing in a north easterly direction to the Deschutes River, to which it is tributary within said County; and that Pole Creek and Big Slough are tributaries of said Squaw Creek.

(13)

That the soil of the irrigable lands along said stream is chiefly decomposed granite and volcanic ash and is chiefly cultivated to crops of hay, alfalfa, clover, wild grasses and grains.

(14)

That each of the several appropriators of water for the purpose of irrigation as hereinafter set forth, is limited to an amount of water sufficient for the irrigation and reclamation of the lands described herein as being the lands to which such water is appurtenant and the total volume of water so appropriated and hereby confirmed in each case, shall not exceed the rate of one (1) cubic foot per second of time for each fifty (50) acres of the said land.

That a system of rotation in the use of water, among the several appropriators of small amounts of water in the same neighborhood, has been in use, more or less, upon the said stream, and adds greatly to the duty which said water may be made to perform; and that in the absence of an agreement between such appropriators arranging for such rotation and the manner in which such water shall be used in such rotation, the water master of the water district in which such water is situated shall arrange such appropriators in groups or systems of rotation, first giving to the appropriator who is first in priority an amount of water equal to the combined appropriations of all the appropriators in said group or system for a length of time bearing the same ratio to the whole time required to make the complete rotation through the whole group of appropriators as the appropriation of said first appropriator bears to the combined appropriations of said appropriators, and shall next serve the next appropriator in priority with a like amount of water for his proportionate time and so on, until all the appropriators in said group are served; then the distribution of the water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigating season; that in case of two or more appropriators in said group having the same priorities, then the said water master shall distribute the water as between those appropriators having the same priorities to the one whose ditch taps the stream nearest its source first, and the next lower down next and so on; and where two or more appropriators agree as between themselves as to a manner and system of rotation in the use of their water, the said water master shall distribute their water in accordance with such agreement; Provided, and this whole Finding No. 15 is upon the condition, that such arrangement into groups and systems shall not interfere with the prior rights of any appropriator not a member of such group or system.

That the name of each appropriator of water from said stream, arranged in alphabetical order hereunder, with his postoffice address, in the following tabulated statement, the date of relative priority of such appropriation, the amount in cubic feet per second of time to which such appropriation is entitled, the number of acres to which such water is applied and is appurtenant, the use to which such water is applied and is now limited, with the season during which such water is used for irrigation in each case, the name of the ditch or ditches through which such appropriation is diverted and a description of the legal subdivisions in which such irrigated land is situated, arranged in tabulated form and under the particular heading indicating the same are as follows to-wit: —

That Arthur P. Donahue, Anna E. Dayton, Robert G. Sturgeon, Henry Schumacher and T. M. Post have heretofore been granted a permit, numbered Enlargement Permit No. 6, by the State Engineer of the State of Oregon, under the provisions of Chapter 216, General Laws of 1909, for the enlargement of what is known as the Burkhard lateral out of the Squaw Creek Irrigation Company's ditch, diverting water from said Squaw Creek, and having filed claims herein the said claimants shall complete their said enlargement in accordance with the terms of said enlargement permit No. 6, as the same appears of record in the office of the State Engineer.

That the appropriations of water from said stream as found in Finding No. 16 herein, are limited to a beneficial use by the appropriators for the purposes specified therein.

That the use of water for domestic purposes includes household use and water for live stock throughout the year.

(21)

That all appropriations of water from said stream for domestic purposes as found in Finding No. 16 herein are limited to a sufficient amount for the needs of the appropriator, not to exceed the rate of one-fortieth (1/40) of one second foot to each one thousand (1000) head of stock; Provided that the amount of water for irrigation specified in Finding No. 16 herein includes the water for domestic purposes to which said appropriation is entitled during the irrigating season.

By order of the Board of Control of the State of Oregon made at a regular meeting of said Board commenced and held the 16th day of November, 1910.
