IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE RELATIVE RIGHTS TO THE USE OF THE WATERS OF DREWS CREEK, ANTELOPE CREEK, COTTONWOOD CREEK, THOMAS CREEK AND COGSWELL CREEK, AND THEIR TRIBUTARIES, TRIBUTARIES OF GOOSE LAKE.

FINDINGS OF FACT
A N D
ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

Now on this 19th day of April, 1922, the above entitled matter coming on before the State Water Board at a meeting of said Board commenced and held on said date, and it appearing that all of the evidence and testimony taken in said proceeding has been duly filed in the office of the Board, and the Board having carefully considered all of said evidence, and being now fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered in its office the following

FIND INGS OF FACT AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

1.

That on June 21, 1918 there was filed in the office of the State Water Board a petition signed by J. E. McCoul and others requesting a determination of the relative rights of various claimants to the waters of Thomas Creek and its tributaries, a tributary of Goose Lake; that on July 31, 1918 there was filed in the office of said Board a petition signed by R. M. Corbett and others, requesting a determination of the relative rights of claimants to the waters of Coftonwood Creek and its tributaries, a tributary of Goose Lake; that on December 24, 1918 there was filed in the office of said Board a petition signed by the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, requesting a determination of the relative rights to the waters of Thomas Creek, Cottonwood Creek, Muddy Creek, Drews Creek, Antelope Creek, Dry Creek, Willow Creek and Barnes Slough, all tributaries directly or indirectly of Goose Lake; that on April 24, 1919 there was filed in the office of said Board a petition signed by E. C. Thruston, requesting a determination of the relative rights to the waters of Coggwell Creek and its tributaries, a tributary of Goose Lake; all of said petitioners being water users upon the streams named in their respective That thereafter the State Water Board, after a full investigation and petitions. due consideration of said petitions, finding the facts and conditions such as to justify the making of a determination of rights to the waters of said streams and

their tributaries, made and entered an order that such determination be made, fixing a time for beginning and taking of testimony and the making of such examination as would enable the Board to determine the rights of the various claimants to the waters of all of said streams in one proceeding.

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That a notice was prepared by said Board setting forth the date when the State Engineer or his assistants would begin the investigation of the flow of said streams and the ditches diverting water therefrom and the time and place certain when the State Water Superintendent would begin the taking of testimony as to the That the time and place where rights of the parties claiming water therefrom. smid State Engineer or his assistants should begin the examination of said streams was set by said Board for Monday, the 15th day of September, 1919; and the time when the State Water Superintendent should attend and take the testimony of the various claimants was set by said Board for Monday, the 15th day of September, 1919, and Tuesday, the 16th day of September, 1919, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House in the city of Lakeview, Lake County, Oregon, and for a period of sixty days, beginning on Monday, the 29th day of September, 1919, in the office of the State Water Superintendent at La Grande, Oregon. That said notice was published in two issues of the Lake County Examiner, a newspaper published weekly at Lakeview, Lake County, Oregon, and of general circulation in said county, said two issues being those of August 7th and August 14th, 1919, the date of the last publication of said notice being more than thirty days prior to the date fixed for the making of said examination by the State Engineer and for the beginning of the taking of testimony by the State Water Superintendent.

3.

That on August 7th, 1919, the State Water Superintendent did send by registered mail, to each person, firm or corporation, claiming a right to the use of any of the waters of said streams, or any tributary thereof, and to each person, firm or corporation owning or being in possession of lands bordering on and having access to said streams or their tributaries, insofar as such claimants and owners and persons in possession could reasonably be ascertained, a notice similar to such published notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer or his assistants would begin the examination of said streams and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and also the date when the Superintendent would commence the taking of testimony as to the rights to the waters of said streams; the mailing of said notice being more than thirty days prior to the date set therein for making the examination of the streams or the taking of testimony.

That the said Superintendent did enclose with each of said notices a blank form upon which the said claimants or owners should present in writing all the particulars necessary for the det ermination of their rights to the vaters of said streams, or a tributary thereof, under oath.

That due proof of the publication of said notice and of the sending of said notice by registered mail has been made and is duly filed as a part of the record herein.

4.

That at the time specified in said notice, a duly qualified assistant of the State Engineer did proceed to make an examination of said streams and their tributaries, and of the works diverting water therefrom, and of the lands irrigated and susceptible to irrigation from the various ditches and canals, together with the measurements thereof; which observations and measurements were reduced to writing and made a matter of record in the office of said State Engineer. And the said State Engineer did cause to be prepared a map on a scale of 4 inches to the mile, showing with substantial accuracy the course of said streams, the location of each ditch or canal diverting water therefrom, and the legal subdivisions of land irrigated or susceptible to irrigation from the ditches and canal, already constructed; copies of the said observations and maps, duly certified to by the State Engineer, being now on file as a part of the record herein.

That upon the completion of the taking of testimony by the State Water Superintendent, said Superintendent did, on the 28th day of July, 1920 give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the waters of said streams and their tributaries, that at the times and places named in said notice, td-wit: for a period of 6 days, beginning on Monday the 16th day of August, 1920 and ending on Saturday, the 21st day of August, 1920, at the County Court House in Lakeview, Lake County, Oregon: and for a period of 12 days beginning on Monday the 30th day of August, 1920, and ending on Saturday, the 11th day of September, 1920 (Sundays excepted) at the office of the State Water Superintendent at La Grande, Oregon, all of said evidence would be open to inspection of the various claimants or owners. That a duly authorized representative of the said Superintendent did, in accordance with said notice, attend at said times and places and keep said evidence open to inspection for the period of time named in said notice. That said notice did also state therein the county in which the determination of the State Water Board would be heard by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, to-wit: the County of Lake.

That after the close of the public inspection held as above set forth, a question was raised as to whether all claims filed were included among the claims so placed on inspection, and in order to cure any such possible defect in the proceeding, the State Water Superintendent did, on the 1st day of March, 1921, again give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the waters of said streams and their tributaries, that at the times and places named in said notice, to-wit: for a period of 10 days, beginning on Monday the 14th day of March, 1921, and ending on Friday, the 25th day of March, 1921 (Sundays excepted) at the office of the State Water Board at Salem, Oregon, all of said evidence would again be open to inspection by the various claimants or owners. That in accordance with said notice said evidence was kept open to inspection at said place for the period named in said notice. That said notice did also state therein the county in which the determination of the State Water Board would be heard by the Circuit Court, to-wit: The County of Lake. That due proof of the holding of said inspections and of the sending of said notices by registered mail has been made and filed as a part of the record herein.

That within five days from the close of the public inspection of the statements and proofs of claim of the various parties, notices of contest were filed with the State W ater Superintendent, as follows:

That after the filing of said contests the State Water Superintendent did fix a time and place for the hearing of each and every of said contests, and served notice of hearing of said contests on each of the parties to each and every of said contests, which said notice of hearing set the date for said hearing at more than thirty days and less than sixty days from the date the said notice of hearing was served upon said parties. That due proof of the service of said notices has been made and filed as a part of the record herein. That at the time so set by said notices the taking of testimony upon said contests was commenced before a duly appointed reporter, and continued until each and every of said contests were fully heard, settled or otherwise disposed of. That thereafter the evidence taken in said contests, together with all evidence taken in the original hearing before the Superintendent, was transmitted by the Superintendent to the office of the State Water Board, and such evidence was thereupon filed with the Board.

10.

That Drews, Antelope, Cottonwood, Thomas and Cogswell Creeks rise in the mountains which surround Goose Lake in the southern part of Lake County, Oregon, and all of said streams, except Drews Creek and Cogswell Creek, flow in a general southerly direction and become tributary to Goose Lake, while Drews Creek on the west flows in an easterly direction into said Lake and Cogswell Creek on the east flows in a westerly direction into said Lake. That water is diverted from each of said streams and used for irrigation and other purposes. That the land irrigated from said streams and their tributaries is arid land, and irrigation is necessary for the raising of profitable crops. That said streams are perennial streams, and their waters are subject to appropriation under the laws of the State of Oregon.

11.

CONTESTS NOS. 1,2,3,4 & 10. Simon Juanto, D. O. Tracy, E, Smalley, Howard Cattle Company, A. M. and Edith M. Smith and Arthur E and Otha D. Perkins, CONTESTANTS, v. Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, a corporation, CONTESTEE.

That the above contests came on for hearing and testimony was taken on the same. That said contests involve the rights of the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company to the use of the waters of Drews Creek and its tributaries. Contests No. 1 and 10 of Simon Juanto and Smith and Perkins allege a prior right over Contestee, while the other contests allege that Contestee's rights have been abandoned by reason of the fact that since 1913 the water has not been used in Drews Creek Valley as originally, but has been stored for lands in Goose Lake Valley.

As to the question of priority, the evidence shows that Elizabeth Roush and Geo. Penland settled in Drews Valley and commenced using water from Drews Creek in 1874, and from that time on gradually increased their holdings until they embrace all of what is known as the Heryford ranch, now owned by Contestee; while Wm. Tullock, the earliest predecessor of Contestants, settled at a later time in the same year. It is also shown that Chas. Christopherson, the predecessor of Contestee as to the Tracy Ranch on LaSieur Creek, initiated his rights on that stream in the year 1878, prior to the time the predecessor of Contestants settled and began using the waters of LaSieur Creek. The rights of Contestee are therefore found to be prior in time and superior in right to those of Contestants to the waters of said streams.

It is shown that the lands originally irrigated by Contestee's predecessors in Drews Valley and comprising the Heryford ranch have an area of 1306 acres, while the Tracy ranch which was irrigated from LaSieur Creek comprises about 258 acres. Contestee's priority for the waters of Drews Creek and its tributaries above LaSieur Creek is therefore fixed at 1874 for 1306 acres, and the priority for the waters of LaSieur Creek shall be 1878, for 258 acres.

It is contended that Contestant has acquired a superior right to contestee by adverse user; that the rights of Contestee have been abandoned; that a transfer of the water rights for the irrigation of lands in Drews Valley to which they were originally

appurtenant, to the storage of water in Contestee's reservoir for use on lands in Goose Lake Valley, would injuriously affect the rights of Contestants. It appears that there has always been sufficient water for the irrigation of the lands of both Contestant and Contestee, and that the use of water by Contestants has not impaired or infringed in any way upon the rights of Contestee. Therefore, no rights adverse to Contestee can have been acquired by Contestants.

appurtenant to the lands in Drews Creek Reservoir in that the same has been stored in said reservoir and used for the irrigation of lands under its system in Goose Lake Valley. In fact conditions are such that it seems practically impossible that any other conditions could have obtained. The water used in the irrigation of said lands has continued to flow down Drews Creek and over the lands of Contestants onto the lands of Contestee and thence into the reservoir, inundating in whole or in part the said lands of Contestee. This use of water has been continuous and cannot therefore be deemed to have been abandoned.

Contestee now makes application to have said transfer of water officially recognized and record thereof made.

It appears that the change from the irrigation of lands in Dreus Creek Valley to the storage of water for the irrigation of land in Goose Lake Valley may if unrestricted, result in Contestee requiring the water to reach Drews Creek Reservoir at different times, in different quantities, and by different methods than in the past, preventing the successive use of water by each tract as the same passes down the Valley or otherwise, through conditions now unforseen, be injurious to the rights of Contestants. It is therefore ordered that the transfer by the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company of water rights appurtenant to the 1564 acres hereinbefore mentioned, to storage in Drews Creek Reservoir for the irrigation of lands under said Company's irrigation system in Goose Lake Valley, be, and the same is hereby approved. without loss of priority to the rights heretofore established, except as to such existing rights to which such change is a detriment or injury, but said rights (the transfer of which is hereby approved), are hereby made subject and subsequent to any and all rights so injured by such change, to the extent of such injury. As conditions are liable to change, this approval is also subject to its being shown to the Water Board at any time that such storage in any material way injures any vested right.

The priority date of said right of the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company to store said water in Drews Creek Reservoir shall be the date upon which said right was transferred, and the water when stored in the reservoir shall be diverted therefrom for the irrigation of the lands under the irrigation system of said Company in the Goose Lake Valley to each acre entitled to a water right from said reservoir, sharing

proportionately in the water stored under the transferred rights. The amount of water to be diverted and stored to supply the rights so transferred shall not at any time exceed the amount said company would have been entitled to divert for the lands to which said rights were originally appurtenant, if the change had not been made, and said rights shall be subject to all the limitations and restrictions hereinafter placed as to water diverted for other lands in Drews Creek Valley. And the water shall be used by the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company from its various sources of supply in such a manner so that the appropriators next in priority shall receive the full quantity of water to which they are entitled in order of their priority, insofar as practicable.

12.

CONTESTS NOS. 5 & 7. Simon Juanto and W. R. Bernard, CONTESTANTS, v. David Handbury, CONTESTEE.

That Contest No. 5 of Simon Juanto against the claim of David Handbury, was set for hearing, the parties thereto having been duly served with notice, but neither of said parties appeared or submitted any testimony in said contest.

That Contest No. 7, of W. R. Bernard against the claim of David Handbury, was settled by a stipulation, whereby Contestee, David Handbury reduced his claim as to the acreage covered by his appropriation to 15 acres in the SEESE of Section 23, T 38 S. R. 19 E. And the rights of said David Handbury to the waters of Thomas Creek shall therefore be limited in accordance with said stipulation and as hereinafter tabulated, and the rights of contestants Simon Juanto and W. R. Bernard shall be as hereinafter tabulated.

13.

CONTESTS NOS, 6 & 8. Simon Juanto and W. R. Bernard, CONTESTANTS, v. Wm. Woods, successor in interest to W m. A. Bailey, CONTESTEE.

That on Contest No. 6 of Simon Juanto against W m. W cods coming on for hearing, pursuant to notice duly served, no appearance was made by either party, and no testimony was taken therein; but in Contest No. 8 of W. R. Bernard against Wm. Woods a stipulation was entered into between the parties, whereby Contestee Wm. Woods reduced his claim to 16 acres in the SW\(\frac{1}{4}\)SW\(\frac{1}{4}\) of Section 24, T 38 S.R. 19 E., and changed his priority date from 1879 to 1895. That the rights of said Wm. Woods to the waters of Thomas Creek shall therefore be limited in accordance with said stipulation and as hereinafter tabulated.

14,

CONTEST NO. 9. W. R. Bernard, CONTESTANT, v. Simon Juanto, CONTESTEE

That this contest was settled by stipulation whereby Contestee Simon

Juanto reduced the acreage under his claim to the waters of Thomas Creek from 148

acres to 110 acres, and the description of the lands under said claim shall therefore be changed to conform to said stipulation, and the rights of said Contestee to the waters of Thomas Creek shall be limited as hereinafter tabulated.

15.

CONTEST No. 11 C. W . and Nell Reed, CONTESTANTS, v. F. M. Miller and F. Zim Baldwin, CONTESTEES.

That this contest involves the use of the waters of Cottonwood Creek, and was settled by a stipulation, whereby the Contestees reduced the acresse claimed by them and changed the priority for certain lands to a later date.

And the rights of said parties shall be limited as hereinafter tabulated.

16.

CONTEST NO. 12 C. W. and Nell Reed, CONTESTANTS, v Ralph M and Wm P. Corbett,

That this contest involves rights to the use of the waters of Cottonwood Creek, and alleges that Contestees are entitled to sufficient water for only about 13.8 acres in the SU SE of Section 34, T 39 S. R. 19 E., instead of for 32 acres as set forth in the claim of said Contestees. That said contest was set for hearing by notice duly served on said parties, but no testimony was offered by any of said parties. That the maps of the State Engineer show only 22 acres irrigated in said subdivision, and the acreage in this forty will therefore be reduced in this amount. And the rights of said Contestees shall be limited as hereinafter tabulated.

17.

That all volaimants to the use of the waters of said streams who hold State Engineer's permits for the appropriation thereof or who have proved up under such permits and received certificates of water right, shall have the right to use such water in accordance with their dates of priority as established by said permits or certificates, as the case may be, and in accordance with the laws of Oregon covering said permits and certificates of water right.

18.

That in order to successfully irrigate a piece of land it is necessary to have a sufficient head of water. That for lands of the character of those involved in these proceedings  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acre feet of water per acre during each season measured at the point of diversion is sufficient. That a flow of one-eightieth of one second foot pf water per acre for 100 days will approximately supply such amount. That a head of one-eightieth of a second foot per acre is inadequate for the purpose of irrigating said lands. That in order to irrigate any land it is not necessary to keep a continuous flow of water upon each and every acre of the same. That it is

necessary to irrigate each tract of land at more or less regular intervals throughout the growing season. That the intermittent use of water upon each acre of land makes it possible for a system of rotation to be used, so that the head of water necessary for the irrigation of such land may be obtained.

That the rights to the use of water from the streams involved herein shall be limited to such amount as may be beneficially used on the lands for which water rights are herein granted, and (except for lands served by the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company's system) the water diverted for any lands shall be limited to a continuous flow of one-fortieth of one second foot per acre, and the total quantity diverted shall not exceed three-fourths of one acre foot per acre during any period of thirty days prior to June 1st, and one-half of one acre foot per acre during any period of 30 days after June 1st, of each year; and shall not exceed  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acre feet per acre during any irrigation season.

That the amount of water diverted during any irrigation season from the reservoir or other sources of supply of the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company for lands under its system shall not exceed such amount as will furnish one and one-half acre feet per acre delivered on the land.

That in determining the proper duty of water for any lands many factors must necessarily be considered, including the nature of the water supply, manner of irrigation, and the kind of crops raised. That the present practice of irrigating the wild hay meadows on said streams by damming the sloughs and causing a large amount of water to spread over the land, while necessary until artificial flood control is provided, is not an economical method of irrigation. That with artificial flood control it will be possible to adopt a more modern and economical method and secure a higher state of cultivation, which will require a less quantity of water per acre than granted herein. Anticipating the possibility of such a development, the right is reserved to the State Water Board to receive and consider further evidence on this point, at such time in the future as the flood waters of said streams are more subject to control by storage or other means, and a more dependable water supply is available and the present wild flooding system has given way to a method of irrigation by ditches and rotation in the use of the water, and if circumstances justify it, to revise the duty of water herein fixed to a duty more in conformity with such changed conditions.

19.

That it appears that certain users on Cogswell Creek have by mutual consent adopted a certain plan for the division of the water among themselves each season, for the purpose of avoiding litigation or controversy as to the water, said plan being as follows:

From the time when the irrigation season begins in the spring and until the first day of July of each year sufficient water is diverted from the creek to irrigate the Sam W Smith ranch, George Fitzgerald ranch, the Ed Hartzog ranch, Hurley Vernon ranch and Barrington ranch, now owned by Geo Barrington, W. J. Barrington and Elizabeth Kingsley, to the extent that there is water in the creek.

Beginning with the first day of July of each year the water flowing in said creek is divided equally, one-half flowing south through the Brown and Studley Ditch to the Smith ranch and Fitzgerald ranch; the remaining one-half flowing in said creek is diverted and carried north in the old Snelling Ditch to the Barrington Ranch, Vernon Ranch and Hartzog Ranch. The half of the water that is diverted and carried south through the Brown and Studley ditch is divided 10/24 to the Smith ranch and 14/24 to the Fitzgerald Ranch; of the half of the flow that is diverted and carried north through the old Snelling ditch, the Barrington ranch is entitled to one-half thereof, and the Vernon Ranch two-thirds of the remainder and the Hartzog Ranch one-third.

The Water Master shall distribute the waters of Cogswell Creek in accordance with the terms of the aforementioned agreement. But if the water to be delivered to any individual under the terms thereof exceeds the quantity to which such individual is entitled as otherwise herein determined, then such individual shall be limited to the quantity to which he is entitled, and the excess shall be pro-rated to the other parties in accordance with the acreage irrigated by each.

20.

A decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Lake County, was filed in these proceedings, wherein Alice R. Bunting was plaintiff, and Howard Cattle Company, a corporation, was defendant. In accordance with the terms of said decree, the waters of Smith Creek shall be divided equally between plaintiff and defendant, or their successors in interest, during the period beginning January 1st and ending June 30th of each year, and on and after the first day of July, of each year, the plaintiff or her successors in interest, shall have all of the water flowing in said Smith Creek until the beginning of the next year.

That insofar as the rights of Alice R. Bunting, or her successors in interest are affected thereby, the defendant shall not be restricted in the manner of applying his portion of said waters in the irrigation of his said lands and may apply said waters to such part of his said lands as his judgment may dictate, but when said waters are applied to any part of said lands in such manner or quantity that any part of said water would naturally flow to and upon the lands of the plaintiff, after having been spread over defendants lands, defendant shall not prevent said waters that have completed their service on defendant's lands from naturally wasting upon the lands of plaintiff. As against all other claimants in thisproceeding, the rights of both said plaintiff and defendant, or their successors in interest shall be as hereinafter defined and determined.

21.

That a decree of the Circuit Coart of the State of Oregon for the County of Lake was filed in this proceeding, wherein Daniel Chandler was plaintiff and Frank Howard was defendant. Said decree was filed with the claim of Simon Juanto, who, it appears, has succeeded to the interests of plaintiff, Daniel Chandler, insofar as the ownership of the SENNE of Section 33, Township 38 South, Range 17 East of Willlamette Meridian, and the right to use water on the same from Dent Creek, is concerned.

Said decree recites that Frank Howard was then the power of the SW\_NE\_,

W\_SE\_a and SE\_SE\_b of Section 32, T 38 S. R. 17 E., but since no claimant has appeared in this proceeding and claimed a water right for said lands, the water right appurtenant to them, if any, has become void and the right of Simon Juanto is as otherwise defined and determined.

22.

That Charkes M. Batman filed an amendment to his Statement and Proof of Claimant in which he claimed that his right was initiated in April 1875, and not in the year 1879 as first claimed. A certified copy of the amendment was duly served on C. W. Reed, Nell Reed, Emma T. Carlson, J. M. Baker, Jones and Lane, E. W. Buhmanne, James A. Carper, Peter A. Ellerson, Louis Moravee and Henry Oliphant. No contests were filed contesting said amended Statement and Proof of Claimant, but a protest against the amendment was filed by Emma T. Carlson, who also filed therewith a copy of a decree of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon in re Cox, et al., v. Bernardy et al. According to the terms of said decree it appears that the rights of Charles M. Batman are subsequent in and inferior to the rights of said Emma T. Carlson, and the Water Master will not allow Charles M. Batman, or his successors in interest to divert water in any manner which will interfere with the prior right of said Emma T. Carlson.

There is no evidence before the Board which shows who has succeeded to the interests or rights of the other parties whose rights were adjudicated in the above mentioned decree.

23

That W. K. Verling filed with his Statement and Proof of Claim a copy of the decree of the Circuit Court of the County of Lake, in which F. M. Barnum was plaintiff and Adam Schmidt and J. W. Bloomingcamp were defendants. In accordance with the terms of said decree, said W. K. Verling as against the successors in

interest of Barnum, is entitled to use one-half of the flow of Muddy Creek to irrigate that part of his lands situated in the E2SE2 and in the SW2SE2 of Section 12, T 39 S., R 18 E., except when such quantity exceeds the amount as otherwise herein determined as sufficient to properly irrigate said lands.

24.

That a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Lake was filed with the claim of Simon Juanto in this proceeding, in which Simon Juanto was plaintiff and G. H. White was defendant, in which it is recited that Simon Juanto has appropriated 50 miners inches of water under date of priority of February 10, 1879 for the irrigation of the ELNE of Section 26, T 38 S. R. 19 E. W. M. It appears that said suit was caused by a dispute over plaintiff's right of way for a ditch across defendant's land and the water rights of Simon Juanto are as otherwise defined and determined herein.

25.

That a stipulation was entered into by W. R. Bernard and Amelia Wilcox wherein it was agreed that said Amelia Wilcox is entitled to the use of sufficient water from Warner Canyon Creek for the irrigation of 59 acres of land under date of priority of the mear 1878; that said right is prior to the right of said W. R. Bernard, and that it is appurtenant to the following described land: 17.1 acres in the NELNWL; 2 acres in the NW LNWL; 18.2 acres in the SWLNWL and 21.7 acres in the SELNWL of Section 22, T 38 S. R. 20 E W. M.

26.

That a stipulation was entered into by S. J. Hubbard, Edith L. Hubbard and Charles M. Batman, wherein it was agreed that S. J. Hubbard and Edith L. Hubbard are entitled to sufficient water from Antelope Creek for the irrigation of 40 acres in the NW2NE2 of Section 15 and 37 acres in the SW2SE2 of Section 10, T 40 S. R.

19 E. W. M., and that the said Charles M. Batman is entitled to sufficient water from said stream for the irrigation of 10 acres in the NE2NE2; 21 acres in the SW2NE2;

38.6 acres in the SE2NE2; 10.4 acres in the NW2SE2 of Section 15, T 40 S. R, 19 E.,
W. M., and that the rights of each are equal in date ofpriority and shall be fixed as of the date September 9, 1878.

27.

That a stipulation was entered into by G. W. Wright, Harry A. Hunter, Favell-Utley Realty Company, H. L. Mitchell, F. M. Miller, A. F. Peelman, Hinnie C.

Gramlich, J. G. Benolkin, C. E. Conrad, F. Zim Beldwin, Louis Moravee, J. M. Baker, E. W. Buhmanne, James A. Carper, Peter A. Ellerson, Claude J. Kennedy, Jones and Land and John M. Flynn, wherein it was agreed that George H. Stevens is entitled to the use of water from Muddy Creek, under date of priority of the year 1881 for the irrigation of 110.5 acres and that said Stevens is entitled to the use of the waters of Cottonwood Creek, under date of 1874 for the irrigation of 296.8 acres, and in accordance therewith the rights of said Stevens are as more fully defined in the tabulation herein contained.

28.

That a stipulation was entered into by Frank J. Struck and Amalia Wilcox wherein it was agreed that the said Amelia Wilcox is entitled to the use of water from Warner Canyon Creek for the irrigation of 50 acres of land, as of the year 1878, and in accordance with the terms of said stipulation, the right of said Amelia Wilcox are as otherwise defined and determined herein.

That the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, has filed statements and proofs of claim in these proceedings, claiming water rights from Drews, Antelope,

Cottonwood and Thomas Creeks and their tributaries. That the rights of said Company as initiated in the year 1874 for lands now in the Drews Creek Reservoir

are described and set forth in Paragraph 11 hereof.

That said Company claims rights under a notice of appropriation posted January 21, 1907 and recorded January 22, 1907, signed by Creed H. McKendree, to the storage of 80,000 acre feet of the waters of Drews Creek in Drews Reservoir, and to the appropriation of 300 second feet of the waters of Drews Creek, 100 second feet of the waters of Antelope Creek, 50 second feet of the waters of Muddy Creek, and 200 second feet of the waters of Thomas Creek.

Said Company also claims rights under a notice of appropriation posted

July 31, 1908 and recorded August 5, 1908, signed by Oregon Valley Land Company, to

the storage of 18,000 acre feet of the waters of Cottonwood Creek in a reservoir to

be constructed on said stream, and the appropriation of 200 second feet of the waters

of Cottonwood Creek and its tributaries. That the general plan of the predecessors of

said Company appears to have been the construction of a system of reservoirs and canals

and the irrigation eventually of an area of about 60,152.4 acres of land. Two storage

reservoirs were to be constructed, one on Drews Creek with a capacity of about 80,000 acre feet; the feet, and one on Cottonwood Creek with a capacity of about 18,000 acre feet; the water stored in such reservoirs to be supplemented by the direct flow of the streams crossed by the main canals. It appears that immediately after the formulation of said plan the predecessors of the claimant herein began work on the system, and thereafter prosecuted such work with diligence, and the dam for the Drews Creek reservoir was completed in the year 1913 to a height sufficient to impound about 65,000 acre feet of water. The main canals of the system have been completed, and about 10,000 acres of land had been irrigated under the system up to the time of the beginning of these proceedings.

That the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company therefore has valid appropriations under said notices, and having priority dates of January 21, 1907 and July 31, 1908, respectively, for not to exceed the amounts of water from the various sources as named above. That the lands to be irrigated under such appropriations are hereinafter described. And inasmuch as all of the irrigable lands under said system have not yet been put under irrigation, the 1st day of January, 1928 is hereby fixed as the time within which the water shall be completely applied to beneficial use under said appropriations. And said appropriations shall be limited to the arounts which have been applied to beneficial use from the various sources of supply on or before said date (or such further time as may be granted by the State Water Board for good cause shown). At the expiration of said time or any extension thereof, the said Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, or its successors in interest, shall report to the State Water Board, giving an accurate description of the number of acres of land to which water has been applied from each of said sources of supply. And the water rights thereafter confirmed and granted for any of said lands shall become and remain appurtenant to the lands upon which they have been used, and said Company or its successors shall be entitled to water right certificate or certificates as evidence thereof.

And it appearing that the normal water supply of the streams covered by said appropriations is inadequate to irrigate all of the lands for which said appropriations were made and it being inadvisable that water rights be allowed for an acreage largely in excess of the amount which can be irrigated from said sources, it is considered proper that a limitation be placed on the total amount of land for which water rights may be sold under said system. Therefore it is ordered that said Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company shall not sell water rights or contract to furnish water for an acreage in excess of that to which it is in a position to deliver an adequate supply of water.

That said Company also has certain rights under and by virtue of permits issued by the State Engineer, Nos. R.299 and 2186, which said appropriations shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the State Engineer and the laws pertaining to the proving up and completion of rights under such permits.

That the lands under the irrigation system of said Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, and upon which water may be used under the appropriations of 1874, 1907 and 1908 are described as follows:

That all claimants herein to water for irrigation shall be entitled to use such water for stock and domestic purposes. That the right to the use of water for stock and domestic purposes is hereby confirmed and entitled the owner of such right to divert and use such a quantity of water as is reasonably necessary for his household and stock use. The amount so diverted and used shall not exceed the rate of one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second for each one thousand (1000) head of stock, and the quantity diverted for irrigation purposes during the irrigation season shall include when it is so diverted such amount as may be reasonably necessary for said stock and domestic purposes, and the right to divert and use the waters of said streams and their tributaries for stock and domestic purposes continues throughout the year.

31.

That the rights of appropriation hereby confirmed are appurtenant to the lands herein described for irrigation purposes, and the rights to the use of the waters of said streams and their tributaries by virtue of such rights of appropriation, are limited and confined to the irrigation of the lands herein described to the extent of said lands as herein set forth, and the priorities herein confirmed confer no right of use of the vaters of said streams and their tributaries, on lands other than those specified tracts to which such rights of appropriation are herein set forth as appurtenant, and each and every person shall be and hereby is prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said streams on such other lands without lawful permit from the State Engineer.

32.

That the order of the rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of said streams and their tributaries, and in which order they are entitled to divert and use the said water, shall be and is according to the date of relative priority of the rights as herein set forth and determined, and the first in order of time according to the date of relative priority shall be and is the first in order of right, and so on, down to the date of the latest priority, and those having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said streams and their tributaries, when necessary for beneficial use in connection with the irrigation of their respective lands, or other useful and beneficial purposes for which they are decreed a right of use, at all times and against those having subsequent rights without let or hinderance, and whenever the water is not required by the appropriator having a prior right to its use for the purpose

for which water was appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down in the natural channel of the streams as it was wont to flow in its natural course, without hinderance or diversion thereof, and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of such water and to divert the same to the extent of their rights of appropriation, according to the order of their priority rights; and at all times the waters shall be beneficially, economically and reasonably used without waste by those having a right to do so by virtue of the priority of their rights, and no rights of appropriation are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity of water into the head of the ditch or ditches of the appropriator having a valid right to divert the water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose to which the water is to be put.

That in the distribution of water, the Water Master may arrange systems of rotation in either of the following manners:

- 1. By arranging a period of irrigation for the lands of a number of appropriators, then by giving to one of such appropriators all of the water belonging to the lands included in the system of rotation for a length of time proportionate to the period of irrigation as the amount of water to which he is entitled bears to the whole amount of water to which all the appropriators in such system are entitled, and so on, until all of the appropriators under the system of rotation are served; and such distribution of water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigation season.
- 2. When two or more appropriators agree among themselves as to the manner of rotation as to the use of water the Water Master shall distribute the water in accordance with such agreement, provided rights of other parties are not interfered with, and provided further that such agreement is in writing and on file with the Water Master.
