## BEFORE THE STATE WATER BOARD OF OREGON

UMATILIA COUNTY.

IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION OF
THE RELATIVE RIGHTS TO THE USE OF THE
WATERS OF PINE CREEK AND ITS TRIBUTARIES,
A TRIBUTARY OF WALLA WALLA RIVER (EXCEPT-)
ING SUCH RIGHTS AS HAVE HERETOFORE BEEN AD-)
JUDICATED ON JOHNSON AND DUGGER CREEKS).

FINDINGS AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

Now at this time the above entitled matter coming on for consideration by the State Water Board, and it appearing that all of the evidence and testimony taken in the above entitled proceeding has been duly filed in the office of said Board, and the Board having carefully considered all of said evidence and testimony, and the information and data gathered by the State Engineer, and being now fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in its office the following

FINDINGS AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

1.

Board a petition signed by F. R. Eastman; that on the 18th day of April, 1917, there was filed in the office of said Board a petition signed by F. E. Labadie and others; that on the 17th day of September, 1917, there was filed in the office of said Board a petition signed by Nellie F. Collett and others; all of said petitions requesting a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream, and all of said petitioners being water users upon said stream, or a tributary thereof. That thereafter the State Water Board, after a full investigation and due consideration of said petitions, finding the facts and conditions such as to justify the making of a determination of the rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries, made and entered an order in the records of its office, directing that such determination be made, and that the State Engineer proceed to make the necessary surveys and examinations and that the State Water Superintendent proceed to take and hear the testimony in support of the various claims to the waters of said stream, as provided by law.

2.

That a notice was prepared by said Board setting forth the date when the State Engineer or his assistants would begin the investigation of the flow of said stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and a time and place certain when the State Water Superintendent would begin the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters thereof, and said notice was published in two issues of the Freewater Times, a newspaper published weekly at Freewater, Umatilla County, Oregon, and of general circulation in the said County of Umatilla, said two issues being

those of January 6th and January 13th, 1922, and the date of the last publication of said notice being more than thirty days prior to the date fixed for the beginning of the measurements of the stream by the State Engineer, and for the beginning of taking testimony by the State Water Superintendent.

3.

Examination of said stream was set for Tuesday, the 14th day of February, 1922, and the time and place when the State Water Superintendent or his duly authorized assistant should attend and take the testimony of the various claimants was set as follows: On Wednesday and Thursday, the 15th and 16th days of February, 1922, in the I. O. O. F. Hall, in the City of Freewater, Umatilla County, Oregon; and for a period of 30 days beginning on Monday, the 20th day of February, 1922, in the office of the State Water Superintendent at La Grande, Oregon.

4.

send by registered mail, to each person, firm or corporation claiming a right to the use of the waters of said stream, or any tributary thereof, and to each person, firm or corporation, owning or being in possession of land bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, insofar as said claimants, owners, firms or corporations could be reasonably ascertained, a similar notice to such published notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer would commence the examination of the stream and the time and place when the State Water Superintendent would commence the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream or its tributaries. And said Superintendent did enclose with each of said notices a blank form upon which the said claimant or person in possession could present in writing all the particulars necessary for the determination of his rights to the waters of said stream or a tributary thereof, under oath. That due proof of the publication of said notice and of the sending of said notice by registered mail has been made and is duly filed as a part of the record hereof.

5.

That at the time specified in said original notice, a duly qualified assistant of the State Engineer did proceed to make an examination of the said stream and its tributaries, and of the ditches diverting water therefrom, and of the lands irrigated from said ditches and canals, which observations and measurements were reduced to writing and made a matter of record in his office. And the State Engineer did cause to be prepared a set of maps or plats, on a scale of measurement of four inches to the mile, showing with substantial accuracy the course of said stream and its tributaries, and the lo-

cation of the various ditches diverting water therefrom, and the number of acres of land which had been irrigated in each legal subdivision, blue prints and copies of the said maps being now on file herein and a part of the record hereof.

6.

That during the period specified in said notice for the taking of testimony of the various claimants, a duly authorized representative of the State Water Superintendent did attend and take the testimony of the various claimants, and that statements and proofs of claim to the use of the waters of said stream or its tributaries were filled by the following named parties, to-wit:

That the following named persons were duly notified by registered mail and by publication of said notice as hereinbefore set forth, and that each of them, although so notified, has failed, neglected and refused to appear herein and submit proof of a right to the use of the waters of said stream, if any they have or claim, and that such parties

are in default, and that such default is here and now entered against them and each of them, and said parties are hereby enjoined and inhibited from using or asserting any rights to the use of the waters of said stream, or a tributary thereof, except by, through or under the rights of the persons whose water rights are defined herein, or under and by virtue of appropriations made subsequent to February 24, 1909:

That upon the completion of the taking of testimony and proofs of claim as aforesaid, the State Water Superintendent did on the 19th day of August, 1922, give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream or its tributaries that at the timesand places named in said notice, to-wit: for a period of two days, beginning Tuesday, September 5th, 1922, and ending with Wednesday, September 6th, 1922, in the I.O.O.F. Hall, in the City of Freewater, Umatilla County, Oregon; and for a period of ten days, beginning Monday, September 11th, 1922, and ending with Thursday, September 21st, 1922, (Sundays excepted), at the office of the State Water Superintendent at La Grande, Oregon, all of said testimony and proofs of claim would be open to inspection by the various claimants or owners. That a duly authorized representative of said Superintendent did, in accordance with said notice, attend at said times and places, and keep said evidence open to inspection for the per-

iods aforesaid. That said notice did also state therein the county in which the determination of the State Water Board would be heard by the Circuit Court, to-wit: the County of Umatilla. That due proof of the sending of said notice by registered mail, and the holding of said inspection has been made and filed as a part of the record herein.

9.

That within the time fixed by law therefor, the following contests were initiated by the filing with said Superintendent of notices of contest in writing:

Contest No. 1, W. E. Burnham, Contestant.

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Frank Harrington and Dean Harrington, Contestees.

Contest No. 2, D. O. Saunders and Annie Saunders, Contestants,

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Frank Harrington and Dean Harrington, Contestees.

10.

That after the filing of said notices of contest, the State Water Superintendent did fix a time and place for the hearing of said contests, as follows; to-wit: in the I.O.O.F. Hall, in the City of Freewater, Umatilla County, Oregon, at the hour of 10 o'clock A. M., on Saturday, February 17th, 1923. That the State Water Superintendent served notice of hearing of said contests on each of the parties to said contests, which said notice of hearing was served upon said parties more than thirty days and less than sixty days prior to the date set for said hearing. That due proof of the serving of such notice has been made and filed as a part of the record herein.

11.

That at the time so set by said notice, a duly authorized assistant of the State Water Superintendent did attend at the place designated by said notice, for the purpose of taking testimony upon said contests. That Contestants W. E. Burnham, and D. O. Saunders appeared in person and by their attorney Stephen A. Lowell, together with their witnesses. That no appearance was made by Contestees Frank and Dean Harrington, but that one James H. Sams, appeared and offered proof to the effect that he had purchased all the land for which said Harringtons had filed claims for water rights, and had succeeded to all the interests of said Harringtons insofar as said water rights were concerned. That said James H. Sams them and there filed a statement relinquishing all claim to the particular rights as contested by said Contestants as claimed by his predecessors Frank and Dean Harrington. That thereupon the said contests were dismissed.

That the land involved in said contests was described as 30 acres in the NW4NW4 of Section 36 and 5 acres in the SW4SW4 of Section 25, T. 6 N., R. 34 E.W.M., and was covered by a claim filed by said Harringtons for a water right from "Spring Branch," a tributary of Dry Creek, through the "Old Kelty" ditch, with priority of 1899. That this claim was withdrawn in its entirety by said James H. Sams, and said Sams shall therefore be barred and estopped from subsequently asserting any claim to a water right for said land, except under or by virtue of an appropriation made by filing an application with the State Engineer and securing a permit therefor. That Contestant W. E. Burnham filed in evidence a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County, dated July 21, 1917, wherein F. E. Labadie was plaintiff and Frank Harrington and James Harrington were defendants. That it appears that Contestant W. E. Burnham is successor in interest of said plaintiff F. E. Labadie, and that said James H. Sams is successor in interest of said defendants Frank and James Harrington. That in accordance with the terms of said decree said defendants were perpetually restrained and enjoined from in any manner interfering with the waters of the said "Spring Branch" or with plaintiff's use thereof in the irrigation of land in the  $N_2^1SE_4^1$  of Section 26, T. 6 N., R. 34 E.W.M., and for stock and domestic purposes. That said James H. Sams is bound by the terms of said decree and shall observe the same, and in appropriating water for his lands shall not interfere with the waters of said Spring Branch, as provided by said decree.

That said James H. Sams also filed a statement modifying the claim filed by his predecessors Frank and Dean Harrington as to 25 acres of land in the SW4SW4 of Section 25, T. 6 N., R. 34 E.W.M., lying north of Dry Creek. In accordance with said statement the date of priority of the right for said land shall be 1907 instead of 1899 as originally claimed. And the water rights of said James H. Sams shall be as hereinafter tabulated.

13.

That a stipulation was filed in this proceeding, between D. O., and Annie Saunders, and W. E. Burnham, wherein it was agreed that as to the waters of "Saunders Spring Branch," a tributary of Dry Creek, as claimed by said parties, said D. O. and Annie Saunders should be entitled to a perpetual right to one-half the flow thereof, and said W. E. Burnham should be entitled to one-half the flow thereof, at all times; and that the date of priority of the said rights should be the same as to each of said parties, namely, the year 1895; and that during the low water season said parties should have the right to rotate in the use of said water by mutual agreement. That in the distribution of the waters of said stream, the water master shall observe the conditions of said stipulation, provided the rights of other parties are not interfered

with; and provided further, that said stipulation shall be construed as dividing between said parties the use of only the amount of water to which said parties are collectively entitled according to the terms of these findings and as hereinafter tabulated, and shall not be taken as preventing other parties from hereafter appropriating the surplus water over and above said amount, if any.

14.

That as shown by the tabulation hereinafter contained, several parties have filed in this proceeding claims for water rights under permits issued by the State Engineer, or under water right certificates issued after the completion of an appropriation under such permits. That each and every appropriator holding a permit or permits covering the right to appropriate water from said Pine Creek or its tributaries, whether a claim thereunder was filed in this proceeding or not, shall have such water right thereunder as is provided by law, and the rights of such parties shall be completed and established in the mammer provided by law for the completion of such rights. That the rights of each and every appropriator holding a water right certificate or certificates covering a right to appropriate water from said Pine Creek or its tributaries, whether a claim thereunder was filed in this proceeding or not, shall be as defined and limited in such certificates.

15.

That Pine Creek and its tributaries form a natural, non-navigable water course, rising in the Blue Mountains and flowing with well-defined bed and banks in a northwesterly direction a distance of about thirty miles to the Oregon-Washington state line, and thence into the State of Washington to its junction with Walla Walla River. That during the early spring season the water flowing in said stream is sufficient to supply the needs of the various appropriators, but the flow of said stream and its tributaries, except Schwartz Spring Branch, fails early in the summer, after which there is practically no water available for the irrigation of the lands for which rights have been claimed herein.

That the soil irrigated from said stream and its tributaries consists generally of a volcanic ash, with some black loam. That the crops raised are mainly grain, alfalfa, pasture, garden, and fruit. That irrigation is necessary to produce profitable crops, and is carried on to some extent whenever there is water in the streams and the ground is not frozen. That the main irrigation season, however, commences as soon as the frost is out of the ground in the spring, which usually occurs some time in the month of March, and lasts until the water supply fails, which is usually about June 15th or July 1st.

16.

That considering the character of the soil, the kind of crops grown thereon, and the length of the irrigation season, three acre feet of water per acre is sufficient for the proper irrigation of any of the lands irrigated from Pine Creek and its tributaries

during the irrigation season beginning April 1st and ending October 1st, and not more than one acre foot per acre is necessary for use during any thirty-day period: That considering the character of the flow of Pine Creek and its tributaries, excepting Schwartz Spring Branch, it appears that there is a surplus of water in the streams during the beginning of the irrigation season when the spring runoff occurs, but that after the crest of the spring floods has passed, the stream fails rapidly until there is practically no water available during a part of June and for the remainder of the irrigation season thereafter. That due to the shortness of the period of runoff of Pine Creek and Dry Creek, it is necessary to use a large head of water in order to get over the ground while water is available.

tributaries, excepting Schwartz Spring Branch, shall be limited at all times to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and shall not exceed one acre foot per acre during any thirty-day period, nor three acre feet per acre during the irrigation season beginning April 1st and ending October 1st. That there shall be no limitation on the head of water diverted unless there is insufficient water flowing in either of said streams to provide all lands irrigated therefrom with one-sixtieth of a second foot per acre, and when that condition exists the head of water diverted shall be limited to one-sixtieth of a second foot per acre of land irrigated.

That considering the character of the soil, the kind of crops grown, the length of the irrigation season, and the constant water supply available for use on the lands irrigated from the Schwartz Spring Branch and its tributaries, water diverted at the of one-eightieth rate/of a second foot per acre of land is sufficient for the maximum requirements of the lands irrigated from said Schwartz Spring Branch, and the quantity of water diverted from said Schwartz Spring Branch and its tributaries shall be limited at all times to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, not to exceed one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre of land irrigated.

That when irrigation is practiced outside of the irrigation season as herein fixed, the quantity of water so diverted shall not exceed one acre foot per acre of land irrigated during such period, and such irrigation shall otherwise be governed by the same limitations as are herein fixed for diversion and use during the irrigation season proper.

17.

That all parties herein allowed a right to the use of water for irrigation shall be entitled to use such water for stock and domestic purposes, and that the right of use of water for stock and domestic purposes as hereby confirmed entitles the owner of such right to divert and use such a quantity of water as is reasonably necessary for his domestic and household use and for stock purposes; that the right to divert and use water for stock and domestic purposes shall continue throughout the year. That outside of the irrigation season the amount so diverted and used shall not exceed the rate of one-fortieth

of one cubic foot per second for each one thousand head of stock, but during the irrigation season appropriators of water for irrigation purposes shall not be entitled to divert any water for stock and domestic purposes in addition to the amount which they are entitled to divert for irrigation purposes.

18.

That the rights to the use of water for irrigation purposes hereby comfirmed are appurtenant to the lands herein described, and the rights of use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries by virtue of such rights are limited and confined to the irrigation of the lands described herein to the extent of said lands herein set forth, and the priorities of right herein confirmed, confer no right of use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries on any lands other than those specified tracts to which such rights are herein set forth as appurtenant, and each and every person shall be, and hereby is, prohibited, restrained, and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream on such other lands without lawful permit first obtained from the State Engineer.

19.

That the order of the rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of said stream and its tributaries, and in which order they are entitled to divert and use the said water shall be and is according to the date of the relative priority of the rights as herein set forth and determined, and the first in order of time according to the date of relative priority shall be and is the first in order of right and so on down to the date of the latest right, and these having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said stream and its tributaries when necessary for beneficial use in connection with the irrigation of their respective lands or other useful and beneficial purposes for which they are decreed the right of use, at all times against those having subsequent rights without let or hindrance, and whenever the water is not required by the appropriator having a prior right to its use for the purpose for which said water was appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down the natural channel of the stream as it was wont to flow in its natural course without hindrance or diversion thereof, and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of such water and to divert the same to the extent of their rights of appropriation according to the order of priority of their rights; and at all times the waters shall be beneficially, economically and reasonably used without waste by those having a right to the use of such water, and no rights of appropriation are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity of water into the head of the ditch or ditches of the appropriator having valid right to divert water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose to which the water is to be put.

The water master of the district in which Pine Creek and its tributaries is situated, shall arrange such system or systems of rotation as may be best applicable, either by giving a greater quantity of water for a proportionately less time, or by arranging such appropriators in groups or systems of rotation, first giving the appropriator who is first in priority, an amount of water equal to the combined appropriations of all the appropriators in said group or system for a length of time bearing the same ratio to the whole time required to make complete rotation through the whole group or system as the appropriation of the first appropriator bears to the combined appropriations of said appropriators, and shall serve the next appropriator in priority next with a like amount of water for his proportionate time, and so on until all the appropriators in said group are served. Then the distribution of water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigating season. In case any two or more appropriators in said group shall have the same priority, then the said water master shall distribute the water as between those having the same priority to the one whose ditch taps the stream next its source first, and the next lower down next, and so on. And when two or more appropriators agree among themselves as to a manner and system of rotation in the use of their water, the said water master shall distribute their water in accordance with such agreement. That in case the water flowing in the channel of Pine Creek sinks or fails to flow down the channel thereof so as to be of beneficial use to the appropriator having the prior right to its use, the water master shall allow the diversion thereof by the next in order of priority who can make a beneficial use of such water. Provided, however, that nothing contained in these findings shall operate to interfere with the prior rights of any appropriator not a member of any of such groups or systems of rotation.

21.

That the name and address of the various appropriators of water from said PINE CREEK and its tributaries arranged in a tabulated form, together with the date of relative priority of such appropriation, the number of acres to which such appropriation is applied, the use or uses for which said water was applied and is now limited, the name of the ditch or ditches through which the water so appropriated is diverted, the name of the stream or streams from which the water so appropriated is diverted, and the description of the lands upon which such water is used, the tabulated rights of each appropriator being set opposite and following the name and post office address of each appropriator, are as follows; to-wit:
