Now at this time the above-entitled matter coming on for consideration by the State Engineer, and it appearing that all evidence and testimony have been taken in the above-entitled proceeding, and the State Engineer having carefully considered all such evidence and testimony and the engineering data and information gathered in accordance with law, and being fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in his office the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION

-1-

Calapooya River and its tributaries are located wholly within Linn County, Oregon. the main channel thereof having its origin in the high, western breaks of the Cascade Mountains within Township 15 South, Range 4 East, W.M. and flowing in a general north-westerly direction to its confluence with the Willamette River within Section 1, Township 11 South, Range 4 West, W.M. at the City of Albany.

The main channel, from its origin, traverses steep mountainous terrain for the first approximately 22 miles of its course to the community known as Calapooya within Section 30, Township 14 South, Range 1 East, W. M. where the terrain gradually widens for the next three miles forming a small valley which embraces several hundred acres of farm land. Below this valley the surrounding hills converge to form somewhat of a gorge through which the river flows for approximately one-eighth mile to again emerge onto the head of the main valley. Thence continuing in a general westerly direction for approximately 12 miles to the City of Brownsville within Section 31, Township 13 South, Range 2 West, W. M. where it emerges onto the main floor of the Willamette Valley.

From the city of Brownsville to its confluence with the Willamette River at Albany, the Calapooya River is a meandering stream having a relatively flat gradient. During periods of high water the river overflows its banks and inundates many acres of farm land, quite often causing considerable channel erosion and sometimes shifting its channel. A flood channel known as Sodom Ditch is an example of channel erosion and change. This channel presently diverges from the original channel within Section 27, Township 13 South, Range 3 West, W. M. and bears in a general northerly direction to its confluence with Butte Creek within Section 32, Township 12 South, Range 3 West, W. M., thence again joining the original channel of Calapooya River at the confluence of Butte Creek. Sodom Ditch is said

to be the eroded channel of a small drainage ditch constructed by the early settlers and which was gradually washed and scoured by overflow of Calapooya River during flood stage until at the present time said channel is much larger than the original river and carries the greater part of the flood flow. An attempt has been made to control the flow through Sodom Ditch by the construction of a concrete overflow weir a short distance below its head.

Calapooya River is a perennial stream, being fed by precipitation and the runoff from melting snow in the Cascade Mountains and by many springs and spring-fed tributary streams. The principal tributary streams, named in the order of their location from
the headwaters of the Calapooya River are: Brush Creek, Warren Creek, Courtney Creek,
Spoon Creek, Butte Creek, Lake Creek and Oak Creek. All of these streams arise in the
lower altitudes of the Cascade range and were in their original state, perennial streams
however, during the period of observation in connection with this determination it was
noted that all except Brush Creek are now intermittent in flow, being dry at their point
of confluence with Calapooya River during the dry season of the year.

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That on the 15th day of June, 1953, there was filed in the Office of the State Engineer a Petition for Determination of Water Rights bearing the signatures of six individual water users of the waters of Calapooya River and streams tributary thereto, praying that a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream system be made by the State Engineer in accordance with the provisions of the Oregon Water Code.

That the State Engineer thereafter fixed a time for making the necessary surveys and examinations and the beginning of taking of such testimony as would enable him to determine the rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Calapooya River and its tributaries, as provided by law.

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That a notice was prepared by the State Engineer setting forth the date on or about which the State Engineer, or his assistants, would begin the investigation of the flow of water in Calapooya River and its tributaries, and ditches or other means of diverting water therefrom, and said notice was published in two issues of the Albany Democrat Herald, a newspaper printed and published daily (except Sunday) at Albany, Linn County, Oregon, and in two issues of the Brownsville Times, a newspaper printed and published weekly at Brownsville, Linn County, Oregon, both newspapers being of general circulation in said County, said two issues of said newspapers being those of August 20 and August 27, 1953, the date of the last publication being more than ten days prior to the date fixed for the beginning of the taking of measurements of said stream and its tributaries by the State Engineer, as provided by law.

That duly qualified assistants to the State Engineer did proceed to make examinations, surveys and measurements of said Calapooya River and its tributaries, and of ditches, canals and other works diverting water therefrom and surveys of the lands irrigated, and gathered such other data and information as were essential to the proper determination of the relative rights of the parties interested, which observation and measurements were reduced to writing and made a matter of record in his office. And the State Engineer did cause to be prepared a set of maps or plats, showing with substantial accuracy the location of said streams in the drainage basin, the location of each ditch or canal or other works diverting water therefrom, and the number of acres of land which had been irrigated in each legal subdivision, prints of said maps or plats being on file and a part of the record herein.

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That as soon as practicable after the examinations and measurements were completed as described in the preceeding paragraph, the State Engineer did prepare a notice setting forth a place and time certain when he would begin taking testimony (statements and proofs of claim) as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said Calapooya River and its tributaries; that said notice was published in two issues of the Albany Democrat Herald, a newspaper printed and published daily (except Sunday); at Albany, Linn County, Oregon, and in two issues of the Brownsville Times, a newspaper printed and published weekly at Brownsville, Linn County, Oregon, both newspapers being of general circulation in said county, said two issues of said newspapers being those of July 14 and July 21, 1955, the date of the last publication being at least thirty days prior to the first date fixed for the taking of claims by the State Engineer.

That the State Engineer did send by registered mail to each person, firm or corporation owning or being in possession of lands in, or bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, in so far as said claimants and owners and persons in possession could reasonably be ascertained, a notice similar to such published notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer or his authorized assistants would receive the statements and proofs of claim of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries. That said notice was mailed at least thirty days prior to the date set therein for the receiving of such statements and proofs of claim in each instance. And the State Engineer did inclose with each of said notices a blank form upon which the claimant or owner could prepare in writing all the particulars necessary for the determination of his right, under oath, and a pamphlet of information for water users in connection with the adjudication of water rights.

That the times and places where the State Engineer, or his duly authorized assistants did attend and receive the statements and proofs of claim of the various parties were fixed in said notice as follows:

On Tuesday, August 23, 1955, in the Circuit Court Room of the County Court House at Albany, Oregon;

On Wednesday, August 24, in the City Hall at Brownsville, Oregon;

And for a period of 20 days, beginning with Thursday, August 25, and ending with Friday, September 23, 1955, at the office of the State Engineer in the State Office Building, Salem, Oregon.

That thereafter, it appearing that further time was necessary in which to file said statements and proofs of claim, the State Engineer did, on the 23rd day of September. 1955, enter an order directing that the time in which to file said statements and proofs of claim be, and the same thereby was extended, and continued to include the 30th day of September, 1955.

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That the following named persons, firms or corporations were duly notified of the proceeding by registered mail, as provided by law, of the commencing of the taking of testimony (statements and proofs of claim) of all parties claiming rights to the use of the waters of said Calapooya River and its tributaries:



Orval M. Thompson in behalf of Thompson's Flouring Mills, filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 11 asserting a right to the use of 35 cubic feet per second of the waters of Calapooya River for the development of 39.6 theoretical horsepower under a 10 foot head, and storage in Elder Slough, the race connecting the Calapooya River and the slough and in the Calapooya River during periods when the mill was not in operation, with a date of priority of December 1, 1858.



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Said statement and proof of claim is supported by a lengthy statement relating the history of the initiation and development of the right and the manner and purpose of its use.

To said Statement and Proof of Claim No. 11, Kenneth Groves filed herein Statement of Contest No. 3. The pertinent part of the issues as set forth therein are as follows:

- (a) Contestess fail to allege facts sufficient to support a claim of priority to 39.5 theoretical horsepower, specifically contestess allege facts which on the face of the claim demonstrate only enough fall and volume of water at establishment of priority claimed to equal 23.87 theoretical horsepower.
- (b) Contestees fail to allege facts sufficient to support a claim of right and priority to store the subject waters. Contestees' allegations provide no basis upon which an allocation of specific amounts of water over specific periods of time could be made, and upon which upstream users could thereby determine the remainder available.
- (c) Contestees fail to allege sufficient facts to demonstrate a beneficial use in regard to:
 - 1. The storage right claimed.
 - 2. The specific nature and character of the use made of the water at the mill.
 - 3. Whether or not there has been any substantial change in the use made of the water at the mill since the establishment thereof.
- (d) Contestees fail to state facts sufficient to demonstrate an actual, continuous, beneficial and reasonable use of the 35 cubic feet per second of water claimed.

It appears from the official records on file pertaining to the lands involved in this claim, an abstract of which has been introduced, identified and received as Contestees Exhibit #3 herein, that on February 5, 1866, patent was issued by the United States under act of Congress approved Sept. 27, 1850, to Americus Savage and Mary Ann Savage, his wife, covering certain lands designated as Donation Land Claim No. 50, Certificate No. 617, Notification No. 2049, being parts of Sections 5, 8 and 9 in Township 13 South of Range 3 West, W. M., being bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point 7.98 chains South and 5.86 chains East of the North West corner of said Section 9, in Tp. 13 S., R. 3 W. of the W. M., and running thence West 26.61 chains, thence North 36.85 chains, thence West 34.12 chains, thence South 68.40 chains, thence East 61.18 chains, and thence North 32.05 chains to the place of beginning, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Oregon City, Oregon, containing 321.02 acres.

That on November 29, 1858, said Americus Savage and Mary Ann Savage sold and conveyed by Warranty Deed to one, Richard C. Finley the following described portion of the aforesaid Donation Land Claim No. 50, together with other covenants:

A portion of our land Claim, situated in Section 8, Tp. 13 S. of R. 3 W., W. M. commencing on the road leading from Burlington (running from the South East corner of R. Farwells Land easterly) to the Calapooia Creek on the West side of the main channel of a slough between the West line of said claim and the Calapooia Creek, thence down along the bank of said slough to within ten rods of where said slough empties into the said

Calapooia Creek, thence East across said slough 50 feet from the Eastern bank, thence North to the center of the Calapooia Creek, thence West 16 rods west of the West bank of said slough, thence South to the aforesaid road, thence East 16 rods to the place of beginning, and containing 3½ acres, of land, more or less, and also the privilege of using all water that may run or that they may cause to run through our land claim, commencing at the South line in a slough northeast of Robert M. Elder's house, thence North down said slough to the Calapooia Creek; and the right to dig a race and to levee as much and wherever they may think proper for milling purposes.

That thereafter, during the year 1858, Richard C. Finley, Philemon V. Crawford and Alexander Brandon commenced the construction of a grist mill and the necessary dams and canals to utilize the waters of Calapooia Creek, (now officially known as Calapooya River) in the operation of said mill.

That millwrights were employed to construct two water turbines or wheels which were installed in said mill to furnish power for the operation of the necessary machinery.

That the mill was completed and placed in operation during the year 1859.

That through mesne conveyance, the original mill site together with other parcels of adjoining land, subsequently came into possession of one Martin Thompson. That said Martin Thompson was the father of O. M. Thompson and the grandfather of M. C. Thompson, present owners of the land and the flour and feed mill thereon, now known as Thompson's Flouring Mills.

From the testimony adduced at the hearing, it appears that the grist mill was constructed on the left bank of the main channel of Courtney Creek a short distance above its confluence with Calapooya River, near the N_{ij}^{1} corner of Section 8, that a dam was built in the channel of Courtney Creek at the mill site in order to raise the elevation of the water surface to provide sufficient head for the operation of the wheels. This also created a forebay in the channel of Courtney Creek.

That in order to utilize the waters of Calapooya River a dam was constructed in the river channel on the Donation Land Claim of Robert Elder near the north west corner of the SW_4^1 SE_4^1 of Section 8, T. 13 S., R. 3 W., W.M., which dam was originally known as Larson Dam but subsequently known as Shearer Dam.

That a ditch or canal was dug to divert the waters of Calapooya River from said Shearer Dam into the channel of Courtney Creek, used as the mill-race, and the forebay of the mill.

That another dam, known as the Spillway Dam, was built in an overflow channel of Courtney Creek at a point near the center of said Section 8, to prevent the water from returning to the Calapooya River during times when the forebay was near capacity.

That Courtney Creek usually ceased to flow during the late summer and fall months and it required the entire flow of the Calapooya River to operate the mill.

That it has always been the practice to allow the appropriated water to store in the forebay of the mill and the channels of Courtney Creek, the diversion canal and

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Calapooya River above the diversion dam now known as Shearer's Dam, during the night and other short periods of time when the mill was not being operated.

That in the operation of the mill during the dry season of the year when the river flow was low, usually during later part of July and August and September, it was necessary to place flash boards on the mill dam, Shearer's Dam and the Spillway Dam in order to create more pondage and at the same time, increase the head on the wheels so that the mill could be operated more uniformly and sconomically.

That about the year 1890, early settlers upon the lands along the Calapooya River within Section 27, said Township and Range, had constructed a small drainage ditch, that subsequently during flood stages, the overflowing waters had gradually eroded and enlarged said drainage ditch and it became necessary to construct a dam in said eroded ditch to prevent the Calapooya River from changing its course. That said dam was originally constructed by the land owners but has been maintained there to the present time mainly by the owners and operators of the Thompson's Flouring Mill in order to force the waters of Calapooya River, especially during the low flow months, to flow down the original channel for use in operating the mill.

That about the year 1911 it was found necessary to place a rock barrier in a high water channel diverting from Calapooya River near the northwest corner of the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄. Section 21, T. 13 S., R. 3 W., W. M., known as Wright's Ditch or Slough, in order to prevent the scouring out and deepening of said channel.

That, as originally constructed, the mill wheels were designed and set to operate under a head of ten feet during periods of low water in the river when the tail-water elevation was also low.

That one of the original wheels was replaced in 1894 and the other in 1900 by a 42 inch Perfection and a 24 inch double Perfection. That subsequently in 1932 said Perfection wheels were replaced with two 30 inch and one 35 inch Samson-Leffel turbine wheels and the following year an application for a permit was filed with the State Engineer to appropriate 145 cubic feet per second of the waters of Calapooya River to supply the additional capacity of the three turbines. This permit for 145 cubic feet per second is not herein involved.

That Contestee's claim for 35 cubic feet per second is predicated upon Power Claim No. 70 filed Dec. 13, 1912 in the name of Thompson Bros. & Co. (Boston Roller Mills) as required by Chapter 236, Session Laws of 1911, wherein the maximum amount of water claimed is set out as 35 cubic feet per second.

That said quantity of water was determined as the normal low water flow of Calapooya River from a current meter measurement of the stream made above all back water from the mill by a deputy from the office of the State Engineer about the month of August, 1911.

That 35 cubic feet per second, or as much thereof as was available in the river during the low flow months of July and August and until the fall rains start, has been diverted and used continuously, except for periods up to a few days duration during flood stage or while the mill was shut down for repairs, during each and every year since the mill was constructed in 1858 and to the present time.

The testimony does not disclose the capacity of the original wheels, either as to quantity of water or horsepower developed, however it appears that the mill was designed and the wheels set to operate under a head of ten feet. It further appears that the canal from the Calapooya River at Shearer's Dam to Courtney Creek was constructed sufficiently large to divert the normal summer flow of Calapooya River and that said canal has been maintained at its original capacity.

That in 1894 one of the original wheels was replaced with a 42 inch Perfection wheel with a rated capacity of 45 horsepower which was used to operate the mill during the summer.

From the formula: $\frac{Q \times h}{8.8}$ = theoretical horsepower, where Q is the quantity of water in cubic feet per second and h = the head in feet, it may be determined that it would require a flow of 39.6 cubic feet per second to deliver 45 theoretical horsepower under a 10 foot head.

It further appears that in 1932 the Perfection wheels which were installed in 1894 and 1900 were replaced by two 30 inch and one 35 inch Samson-Leffel turbines, that the manufacturer's rating for the 30 inch turbine, as disclosed by Bulletin No. 38 of James Leffel & Co., introduced, identified and received as Contestee's Exhibit No. 1., is 57.5 theoretical horsepower delivered by 62.6 cubic feet per second of water under a 10 foot head.

It further appears that during the year 1903 a small electric generator was installed to generate electrical energy for lights for the mill and adjoining residence property. That subsequently said generation plant was slightly increased in capacity and has been used for the aforesaid purpose continuously ever since. That all of such generated electrical energy has always been consumed on the premises and none sold or delivered to any other parties.

The records of the State Engineer disclose that a number of miscellaneous measurements have been made of the flow of water in Calapooya River at various locations in the vicinity of the Thompson Mill. These records are published in State Engineer's Bulletins No's. 4, 7, 9 and 10, but are tabulated here for convenience.

During the periods Dec. 1920 - - May 1922 and Oct. 1922 - - April 1923, a record of the flow of Calapooya River was obtained at a station at the Highway bridge in Section 32, T. 12 S., R. 3 W., W.M. just east of the Pacific Highway. This station was designated as Station No. 544 and while it was located below the Thompson Mill, does reflect the stream fluctuation during the period of its operation.

A portion of the record as published in State Engineer's Bulletin No. 7 at page 137, is here presented.

A water stage recorder and a staff-gage were installed in the forebay of the mill just above the mill dam, and operated during the periods July 30 to October 8, 1954 and July 19 to October 5, 1955. Levels were run from the U.S.C. & G.S. bench mark designated as number E 12, established in the concrete base of the railroad water tower at Shedd, from which zero gage elevation was determined as 254.695 feet, m.s.l.

From the recorder charts obtained during the stated periods, it was observed that the maximum water surface elevation in the forebay usually occured early Monday morning before the turbine gates were opened and the mill placed in operation, and that the maximum recorded stage to which water was stored was at gage-height 5.31 feet, corresponding to elevation 260.005 feet, m.s.l., occurring on September 13, 1954.

During the summer and early fall of 1956 the diversion dam on the Calapooya River, referred to as Shearer's Dam, was replaced with a reinforced concrete weir structure. The elevation of the weir crest was determined from the above mentioned U. S. C. & G. S. bench mark to be at 259.228 feet, m.s.l., from which it is noted that flashboards to an additional height of 0.777, say 0.78 foot, would be required to raise the water in the forebay to the maximum elevation to which it had been stored during short periods when the mill was not being operated.

It appears that the mill was constructed and has always been maintained to utilize beneficially the 35 cubic feet per second of water claimed, therefore Contestee's O. M. and M. C. Thompson, dba Thompson's Flouring Mills are allowed herein a right to the use of 35.0 cubic feet per second of the waters of Calapocya River for the development of water power, within the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 Section 8, T. 13 S., R. 3 W., W.M., with a date of priority of 1858. Said water to be diverted from Calapocya River at a point approximately 200 feet south and 100 feet east of the northwest corner of the SW_4^1 SE_4^1 said Section 8, and to be used for the development of water power to operate the mill machinery and to generate electrical energy for lights in the mill and adjoining residence. Claimants are also allowed the right to store water in the forebay to the mill, including the channel of Courtney Creek, the diversion canal and Calapocya River as said channels presently exist, to a maximum water surface elevation of 260.005 feet, m.s.l.

SODOM DITCH

Relative to the channel of Sodom Ditch and the control structure maintained near its head, located on property presently owned by Claimants O. M., and M. C. Thompson, it appears that Sodom Ditch is now an established water course and that the owners of the land traversed by said ditch have, for many years past, relied upon water flowing in said ditch from Calapooya River for stock watering purposes.

From the testimony adduced it appears that in about the year 1890 when the setthere first constructed a dam across said ditch near its head, a rectangular opening 6 inches by 8 inches in dimension was provided to allow some water to pass and that the head of water above the dam on said opening was about three feet. From the formula Q = cA/2gh, assuming a value of 0.6 for c, it may be determined that the quantity of water discharged under the stated conditions was approximately 2.8 second-feet.

It further appears that a small quantity of water has always been allowed to flow, or has leaked through the dam at the head of Sodom Ditch, therefore it is herein provided that not less than 2.5 cubic feet per second of the waters of Calapooya River shall at all time be allowed to flow in Sodom Ditch immediately below the control structure or dam near its head.

CALAPOOYA RIVER BELOW SHEARER'S DAM

Shearer's Dam on the Calapooya River just below the diversion of the canal diverting water to the forebay of Thompson's Flouring Mill is approximately 1-3/4 miles along the river channel above the confluence with the tail-race of Thompson's Flouring Mill. At the time of the adjudication survey this 1-3/4 miles of river channel traversed, or constituted the property line between, four individual property ownerships and it appears that said property owners have always relied upon water flowing in the original river channel for stock water.

During the time of the field investigations incident to this proceeding Shearer's Dam was observed upon numerous occasions and at no time was the leakage through the dam and the flow of water in the stream channel below the dam, entirely stopped.

A water stage recorder was installed in the channel of Calapooya River on the L. L. Swan property just east of Thompson's Flouring Mill, back of the Swan barn and approximately 250 feet downstream from the county road bridge. Daily discharge records were secured during the period July 20 - September 30, 1955, and a series of five discharge measurements were secured to rate the station. While it appears that the record secured does not reflect the quantity of water normally allowed to escape through the Shearer's Dam, it does indicate that a flow did exist in the channel below the dam and, undoubtedly, quite consistently throughout past years.

The record obtained at this station is here presented.

It appears that the owners of the land between the Shearer's Dam and the confluence of the Thompson's Flouring Mill tail-race with the Calapooya River channel have always relied upon and utilized a small flow of water leaking through or otherwise escaping from the Shearer's Dam to maintain a live stream for stock water upon their property.

It is therefore herein provided that, in the operation and maintenance of said Shearer's Dam, a continuous flow of not less than one second foot of water shall at all times remain in the original channel of Calapooya River immediately below said Shearer's Dam for stock water.

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CONTEST NO. 4

Contestee Mack M. Slate, Jr. filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 9 and supplement thereto, asserting a right to the use of the waters of Calapooya River for stock use and the irrigation of 179.0 acres of land with a date of priority of 1850. The CALAPOOYA RIVER - Linn Co. Page 34

land for which a right for irrigation is asserted is more particularly described as 10.0 acres in the SW_4^1 SW_4^1 , and 3.0 acres in the SE_4^1 SW_4^1 , Section 13; 14.0 acres in the SE_4^1 NE_4^1 and 18.0 acres in the NE_4^1 SE_4^1 , Section 23; 14.0 acres in the NE_4^1 NW_4^1 , 40.0 acres in the NW_4^1 NW_4^1 , 40.0 acres in the SW_4^1 NW_4^1 , 10.0 acres in the NE_4^1 SW_4^1 and 30.0 acres in the NW_4^1 SW_4^1 , Section 24, all being within T. 12 S., R. 4 W., W.M.

To said Statement and Proof of Claim No. 9 Kenneth Groves filed herein Statement of Contest No. 4. As a basis for contest, contestant sets out the following reasons:

- (a) Contestee fails to assert facts sufficient to demonstrate the establishment of any prior right to waters of the Calapooya River or its tributaries.
- (b) Contestee fails to state facts demonstrating the amount of beneficial use actually made of the waters involved for any particular time or period or to make a claim on that basis.
- (c) Contestee's application indicates on its face an insufficient record to justify the claim of rights made.
- (d) Contestee's claim substantially exceeds the applicable limitations.

It appears that the lands for which an irrigation right is asserted herein in Statement and Proof of Claim No. 9 are a part of the Donation Land Claim of John T. Slate, designated on the records and maps of the General Land Office as D.L.C. No. 59, Not. No. 2002, that said John T. Slate was the great grandfather of claimant and contestee herein, Mack M. Slate, Jr. and that the lands have been in the ownership of the Slate family ever since originally patented in 1850.

Practically all the testimony adduced at the hearing in support of this claim was presented by Mack Slate, Sr., father of the claimant herein, who testified that he was born on the place and had lived there most of his life, that his earliest recollection relative to the issue involved dated back to the time of the World's Fair in Portland in 1905, that within his knowledge irrigation had always been practiced upon the lands for which a claim for irrigation was asserted and that the acreage irrigated was approximately 70.0 acres situate south of the Calapooya River and approximately 40.0 acres situate north of the river. That the lands south of the river were irrigated by pumping water into a main ditch and thence into lateral ditches and allowing the water to soak or sub-irrigate between the lateral ditches.

That the lands north of the river were irrigated by means of smaller portable pumps, the water being pumped from the river at convenient locations, to the higher knolls and then allowed to flood-irrigate by gravity.

The testimony adduced at the hearing on this contest appears quite indefinite and unconclusive as to the amount of irrigation which may have been practiced as early as February 24, 1909 and to the method or manner in which the water may have been applied to the land so as to constitute an actual appropriation and diversion within the meaning of the water code. A re-examination of the lands and remaining visible evidence was made subsequent to the hearing.

Relative to the lands south of Calapooya River for which a claim for irrigation was asserted, random levels were secured on the remains of the main ditch or canal, from the pump site on the river bank to the edge of the field, and along the bottom of the depressions across the field which, it is assumed, were the main ditch and lateral ditches referred to at the hearing by claimant's witness.

The levels secured indicated that the grade or slope of the main ditch and laterals in the field is toward the river instead of toward the field, from which it appears that said main ditch and laterals were maintained for drainage of the lands rather than for irrigation.

The bed and banks of the main ditch or canal, outside the cultivated field, were well sodded and bore no evidence of having been disturbed by erosion of the elements or from any other cause, for many years past.

The levels secured along the east or riverside bank of the main canal, outside the cultivated land, indicated that if water was maintained in said ditch to the maximum elevation of the ditch bank, the water would probably flow to the end of the field ditches but would not flow over the land for flood irrigation.

The witness for claimant testified that the method of irrigation of the lands here under consideration was to pump the canal and ditches full of water and keep them full until the water "soaked" across the land between the laterals. Said laterals, as they presently exist, vary in spacing from approximately 200 feet upward. It appears highly improbable that, considering the texture of the soil, the water would "sosk" as much as 100 feet from the lateral ditch in any reasonable length of time and that, if it did, the land adjacent to the ditches would become water-logged and too wet for the growing of crops.

It thus appears that, even though an attempt may have been made to irrigate the lands in the manner to which the witness testified, the method proved unsuccessful and was not continued.

Relative to the tract of land west of the river within the NW4 NW4. Section 24, and the lands north of the river for which a claim for irrigation was asserted, no visible evidence remained to indicate that the lands were irrigated as early as 1909. Claimant's witness testified that portable pumps and pipe lines were used to convey the water to the high knolls from which points the water was allowed to flood over the adjacent lands.

Said lands were re-examined subsequent to the hearing and were found to be too uneven for successful flood irrigation, except perhaps for some small areas. It would appear that any appropriator who wished to successfully flood irrigate a tract of land would attempt to level the land sufficiently so that a relatively uniform distribution of the water could be accomplished. It did not appear that any attempt had ever been made to prepare and maintain the land under consideration for beneficial flood irrigation.

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Neither the testimony produced at the hearing on this contest, nor the visible evidence remaining on the land, is considered sufficient to prove that irrigation of the lands claimed was practiced as early as February 24, 1909 when the Oregon Water Code became effective. Relative to the asserted claim for stock use, it appears that stock were allowed to drink directly from the river or other water as it existed naturally upon the land. Such use does not constitute an appropriation of water under the provisions of the water code and cannot be recognized as the initiation of a water right. Therefore, Claim No. 9 filed by Mack M. Slate, Jr. contestee herein, is denied.

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STANLEY M. & ELDORA P. BETZ, Route 1, Brownsville, Oregon

Claimants filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 1 wherein a right is asserted to the use of the waters of Calapooya River for the irrigation of 10.15 acres in the NW_4^1 NE_4^1 and 4.0 acres in the SW_4^1 NE_4^1 , Section 11, T. 14 S., R. 2 W., W.M., with a date of priority of July 5, 1951.

It appears that the rights asserted under Statement and Proof of Claim No. 1 are based upon an application made by Harvey and Norma Reeser to the State Engineer for a permit to appropriate the public waters of the State of Oregon which application was filled in the office of the State Engineer on July 24, 1951, and assigned number 26243. On November 16, 1951, permit was issued therefor and recorded in State Record of Permits, Vol. 50, Page 20451. On July 26, 1955, said permit was assigned to Stanley M. & Eldora P. Betz, claimants herein, said assignment being recorded in Miscellaneous Record of the State Engineer, Vol. 3, Page 943.

Of the lands for which a water right is asserted in Statement and Proof of Claim No. 1, it appears that claimants had irrigated only 7.5 acres in the $NW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ and 1.2 acres in the $SW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, said Section 11, that final proof was made thereon and on February 10, 1956, said right was confirmed by the issuance of a water right certificate recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Vol. 15, Page 21009. Claimant's rights herein shall be as set out and defined under said Certificate of Water Right.

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CLYDE C. & DAISY K. BRYANT, Route 4, Albany, Oregon

Claimants filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 2 asserting a right to the use of the waters of Calapooya River for the irrigation of 11.2 acres in the $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, 3.6 acres in the $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 11; 5.0 acres in the $NW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ and 0.1 acre in the $SW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NW_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 12, T. 11 S., R. 4 W., W.M., with a date of priority of August 11, 1953.

It appears that the rights asserted under Statement and Proof of Claim No. 2 are based upon an application made by claimants herein, to the State Engineer for a permit to

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appropriate the public waters of the State of Oregon which application was filed in the office of the State Engineer on August 11, 1953, and assigned number 28702. On January 22, 1954, permit was issued therefor and recorded in State Record of Permits, Vol. 58, Page 22600.

Claimants herein must rely upon the perfection of the rights designated under their permit in the manner provided by law for the completion thereof.

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ROBERT FORSTER, Sweet Home, Oregon

Claimant filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 3 wherein he has asserted a right to the use of the waters of Erush Creek, a tributary of Calapooya River, for stock use and the irrigation of 26.0 acres of land with a date of priority of July 11, 1951, said right being predicated upon the filing of an application with the State Engineer for a permit to appropriate water.

It appears that on June 11, 1951, the application of one John A. Miller of Crawfordsville, Oregon, for a permit to appropriate water from Brush Creek for the irrigation of 26.0 acres of land, was received in the office of the State Engineer, was filed and assigned number 26019. That subsequently on November 16, 1951, a permit therefor was granted and was recorded in State Record of Water Right Permits, Vol. 50, page 20378.

That on October 31, 1955, said permit was assigned to claimant Robert Forster, said assignment being recorded in the Miscellaneous Records of the State Engineer, Vol. 3, page 978.

That said Robert Forster perfected the water right acquired under said permit 20378 and that on February 10, 1956, the State Engineer issued a Certificate of Water Right confirming the rights acquired and perfected under Permit 20378, said certificate being recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Vol. 15, page 21008. Claimant's rights herein shall be as set out and defined under said certificate of water right.

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J. R. GIVENS, Albany, Oregon

Claimant filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 4 asserting a right to the use of the waters of Calapooya River for the irrigation of 26.5 acres of land in Sections 23 and 26. T. 11 S., R. 4 W., W.M. with a date of priority of September 28, 1951, under State Engineer's Permit No. 20780.

It appears that on September 28, 1951, there was received in the office of the State Engineer an application for a permit to appropriate the waters of Calapooya River for the irrigation of 26.5 acres of land, in the names of James Robert and Georgia Lorayne Givens. That said application was filed and assigned number 26513. That subsequently on March 31, 1952, a permit was granted and recorded in State Record of Water Right Permits, Vol. 51, page 20780.

That applicants perfected their water right in accordance with the provisions of the Water Code and that on November 14, 1955, a certificate of Water Right was issued confirming the rights acquired, being recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Vol. 15, page 20945.

Claimant's rights herein shall be as set out and defined in said Certificate of Water Right issued in the names of James Robert and Georgia Lorayne Givens.

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KENNETH S. & VIVA SMITH GROVES, Sweet Home, Oregon

Claimants filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 5 wherein a right is asserted to the use of the waters of Calapovya River for the irrigation of 16.5 acres of land within the SE_4^1 SE_4^1 , Section 33, T. 14 S., R. 1 E., W.M., with a date of priority of July 19, 1951.

It appears that the right asserted by claimants herein is based upon an application for a permit to appropriate 0.25 cubic-foot per second of the waters of Calapooya River, which was filed in the office of the State Engineer on July 19, 1951, and assigned number 26215. That thereafter on November 16, 1951, a permit was granted, being recorded in State Record of Water Right Permits, Vol. 50, page 20442.

That claimants herein, also being the applicants for a permit, perfected their water right in accordance with the provisions of the permit and that on April 29, 1955, a water right certificate was issued by the State Engineer confirming the rights acquired, said certificate being recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Vol. 15, page 20783.

The rights of claimants herein under Statement and Proof of Claim No. 5 shall be as set out and defined under said certificate of water right, designated as number 20783.

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J. T. or MINNIE E. ILER, Lebanon, Oregon

Claimants filed herein Statement and Proof of Claim No. 6 asserting a right to the use of the waters of Warren Creek, tributary to Calapooya River, for domestic and stock use including the irrigation of a home garden, with a date of priority of 1840. The description of the lands owned by claimants, to which their asserted claim of appropriation is appurtenant, is set out in said statement and proof of claim as the W_2^1 NE_4^1 , E_2^1 NW_4^1 and SE_4^1 of Section 25, T. 13 S., R. 2 W., W.M.

It appears that the source of the water for which this claim of appropriation is made is actually two springs, tributary to Warren Creek and not Warren Creek proper. From a field examination of the premises made during the period of investigations relative to this proceeding, it was found that the original homesite and buildings were located in the N_2^1 SE $_4^1$ said Section 25; that water from two separate springs appeared to have been piped

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to the buildings for domestic and stock use, one spring being located approximately 900 feet south and 150 feet east and the other approximately 600 feet south and 100 feet west of the NW corner of the NE_4^1 SE_4^1 , said Section 25, being in the NE_4^1 SE_4^1 and NW_4^1 SE_4^1 respectively.

Claimants had constructed and were residing in a new and modern home located adjacent to the county road within the SW_4^1 NE_4^1 , said Section 25. Water from the spring located in the NE_4^1 SE_4^1 was piped to a concrete eistern located near the NE corner of the NW_4^1 SE_4^1 . Section 25, and thence from the cistern to the new home and other buildings, to two stock troughs located in the NW_4^1 SE_4^1 and to a domestic garden tract of 0.3 acre located in the SW_4^1 NE_4^1 , all places of use being within Section 25, T. 13 S., R. 2 W., W.M. on property owned by claimants.

That the waters of the other spring located in the $NW_{\pi}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $SE_{\pi}^{\frac{1}{4}}$, which were formerly used in a "spring house" or "cooler room" and for stock water, was still being used for stock water about the premises of the old homesite.

It appears that beneficial use has been made of the water of these two springs, tributary to Warren Creek as set out in Statement and Proof of Claim No. 6 and that said claim has not been contested.

A right is herein allowed in the name of claimants J. T. or Minnie E. Iler to the use of 0.02 cubic foot per second of the waters of a certain spring, tributary to Warren Creek, located approximately 900 feet south and 150 feet east of the northwest corner of the NE_4^1 SE_4^1 , Section 25, T. 13 S., R. 2 W., W.M., for domestic use including the irrigation of a lawn and domestic garden not to exceed one-half acre within the SW_4^1 NE_4^1 said Section 25, and for stock use within the SW_4^1 NE_4^1 and the NW_4^1 SE_4^1 , said Section 25, being 0.01 c.f.s. for domestic use and 0.01 c.f.s. for stock use, with a date of priority of 1840.

A right is also allowed to the use of 0.01 cubic foot per second of the waters of a spring, tributary to Warren Creek, located approximately 600 feet south and 100 feet west of the northwest corner of the NE_{4}^{1} SE_{4}^{1} , Section 25, T. 13 S., R. 2 W., W.M., for stock water within the NW_{4}^{1} SE_{4}^{1} , said Section 25, with a date of priority of 1840.

Said rights being more particularly set out in the tabulation herein.

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HIRAM G. OLSEN, Tangent, Oregon

Statement and Proof of Claim No. 7, which was filed herein by Ruby Muller of Tangent, Oregon, Mother of and agent for claimant, Hiram G. Olsen, asserts a right to the use of the waters of Calapooya River for the irrigation of 30.0 acres of land located within Section 19, T. 12 S., R. 3 W., W.M., with a date of priority of September 15, 1938.

It appears that claimant is title owner of the lands to which a water right certificate issued in the name of F. E. Pesheck of Tangent, Oregon, on July 15, 1948, is

appurtenant, said certificate being recorded in State Record of Water Right Certificates, Vol. 13, page 15390.

It appears that beneficial use of the waters of Calapooya River is still being made as allowed in said certificate of water right upon the lands therein designated, therefore claimant's rights herein shall be as set out and defined in the above mentioned Certificate of Water Right, designated as number 15390.

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DUTY OF WATER, HEAD OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION USE.

The right to the use of water for irrigation purposes, as herein defined, except where the right was initiated by application to the State Engineer for a permit under the 1909 Water Code, now Oregon Water Rights Act, shall entitle the owner thereof to the diversion of a quantity of water which may be applied to a beneficial use upon his lands to which such right is appurtenant; provided that the quantity of water diverted, shall not exceed one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre of land irrigated, with a total limitation during each irrigation season of $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet per acre; all to be measured at the point of diversion from the stream or source of supply, or the nearest practical place thereto, provided further that where storage water is being used the rate of diversion shall not exceed the quantity which may be beneficially applied and shall not exceed the season limitation of $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet per acre irrigated.

DOMESTIC USE BY DIVERSION.

Where a claimant in this proceeding asserted a right to the use of water for domestic purposes and the same was allowed as domestic use or for domestic purposes, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of water for household purposes, the irrigation of a lawn or garden or both not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ acre, and water for such domestic animals as are required for proper sustenance of the family, and where a definite quantity of water was not allowed in the specific finding herein, the claimant is allowed to divert not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second and that such right shall continue throughout the year.

STOCK USE BY DIVERSION.

where a claimant asserted a right to the use of water for stock use or stock purposes by diversion from the stream or other source of supply and it was allowed herein, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of water for such animals as are essential for the proper sustenance of the family and also water for stock when the claimant is engaged in the raising of livestock or when the claimant takes in livestock for pasturage. Where a definite quantity is not set forth in the specific finding herein, the claimant is allowed a right to divert for this use not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second throughout the year; provided, that where a right was allowed herein for irrigation

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purposes through the same ditch, pipe-line or other means of conveyance, no additional water shall be diverted for stock use while water is being diverted for irrigation purposes.

DUTY OF WATER FOR RIGHTS EVIDENCED BY PERMITS OR CERTIFICATES OF WATER RIGHT.

Claimants who have asserted rights to the use of water based upon a permit issued by the State Engineer under the provisions of the Oregon Water Code, which rights have not been perfected, or evidenced by certificates of water right, as allowed herein, are limited to the diversion of the quantity of water at the rate set forth in the respective permits and certificates; provided that the total quantity for irrigation use, unless otherwise provided in the permit or certificate of water right, is limited to $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet per acre irrigated during any irrigation season.

ROTATION

To get sufficient rate of flow or head of water, the watermaster may arrange such system or systems of rotation as may be best applicable: (1) By giving a greater amount of water to a water user for a proportionately less time; provided, that the giving of such greater amount does not infringe upon any of the rights affirmed by this proceeding or any rights subsequently initiated; (2) where two or more water users agree as between themselves as to the manner of said rotation in the use of water and such agreement is in writing and filed by such water users with the watermaster, and such rotation system shall not interfere with the prior rights of any water user not included in the rotation plan, the watermaster shall distribute the water according to such agreement.

To get a sufficient head of water where there is no agreement providing for a system of rotation, the watermaster may arrange such water users in groups or systems of rotation; first, giving the water user who is first in priority in such group a quantity of water equal to the combined appropriations of all water users in said group or system for a length of time bearing the same ratio to the whole time required to make the complete rotation of the whole group of water users as the said appropriation of said water user bears to the combined appropriations of said group, and next, serving another water user with a like quantity for his proportionate time, and so on until all the water users of the said group or system are served; then the distribution of water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigation season; provided, that no system of rotation shall be established by the watermaster without the consent of the water users, except by order of the Circuit Court after an opportunity to be heard; provided, always, that such arrangement of groups or systems of rotation shall not interfere with prior rights of any water user not a member of such group or system.

The total quantity of water measured at the source of supply where rotation is practiced shall not exceed, except where otherwise provided herein, $2\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet per acreduring any irrigation season.

IRRIGATION SEASON

The irrigation season hereby is fixed as beginning on May 1, and ending on September 30, of each year.

RIGHTS APPURTENANT TO LAND

The rights to the use of waters of Calapooya River and its tributaries, for irrigation or any other beneficial and useful purpose as herein confirmed are appurtenant to and limited to the lands or place of use herein described, and the priority of rights herein confirmed confer no right of use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries on any lands or other place of use than those specific tracts to which such rights are herein set forth as appurtenant. And each and every person, association or corporation shall be and hereby is prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said Calapooya River and its tributaries on such other lands or places of use without lawful permit or license first obtained from the State Engineer or Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon

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To summarize and supplement the specific findings herein, the rights of the claimants to the use of the waters of Calapooya River and its tributaries, as determined herein, are arranged in tabulated form with the dates of relative priority of such appropriations, the quantity of water allowed, the use or uses to which such water is applied, the name of the ditch or other means by which such water so appropriated has been diverted, the name of the stream or other source from which the water has been used and the description of the lands upon which the water has been used and to which such right is appurtenant; the tabulated right of each appropriator being set opposite and following his name and post office address, as follows:
