Now at this time the above-entitled matter coming on for consideration by the State Engineer, and it appearing that all evidence and testimony have been taken in the above-entitled proceeding, and the State Engineer having carefully considered all such evidence and testimony and the engineering data and information gathered in accordance with law, and being fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in his office the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION

Rickreall Creek, a tributary to Willamette River, has its origin on the eastern slope of the Coast Range bounded on the north by Rickreall Ridge; the South Fork being within Section 12, Township 8 South, Range 8 West, W.M., and the main stem being within Section 32, Township 7 South, Range 7 West, and Section 6, Township 8 South, Range 7 West, W.M., and flows easterly to its confluence with Willamette River just South of Eola, within SE½ SE½, Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

The upper watershed of Rickreall Creek is a narrow basin, three or four miles in width west of the City of Dallas where it narrows to two miles, and widening to seven to nine miles in width five miles above its mouth, all being within Polk County.

Early reference indicate that there was a difference of opinion about the name of this stream in the early days of pioneer settlement. The name La Creole Creek appears in the suit of Dallas vs Hallock (44 Or. 246) in 1903-04, and the G.L.O. Plats use the name "La Creole River." La Creole is thought to derive from an Indian name or from the French Canadians; also it is the belief of some that Rickreall is a perversion of La Creole. The U. S. Bureau of Geographic Names has adopted the name Rickreall Creek and Rickreall is the name of the post office established June 30, 1851.

The highest elevation of the drainage basin of Rickreall Creek is Laurel Mountain, approximately 3500 feet, with the main stem draining from about 3000 feet elevation and South Fork from about 2600 feet elevation; with approximately seven square miles of the basin above 2000 feet. Rockhouse Creek heads at elevation 2000 feet; Applegate Creek at elevation 1800 feet; Canyon Creek at elevation 1700 feet; and Ellendale Creek at elevation

1600 feet. The stream falls rapidly till it reaches the valley floor above Dallas and then flattens to a fall of about 24 feet per mile until its confluence with Willamette River at approximately 120 feet mean sea level.

While Rickreall Creek is a perennial stream, its runoff is derived principally from precipitation in the form of rain, with some snow melt likely to occur any time in the winter following snowfall. The flow of this stream usually becomes quite low from the middle of July through September, depending on the summer rains.

Tributary streams to Rickreall Creek which contribute the major portion of the flow, in the order of their occurrence downstream are: Rockhouse Creek, Applegate Creek, Canyon Creek, Ellendale Creek, Mud Slough and Hayden Slough.

Rockhouse Creek rises in Sections 25 and 34, Township 7 South, Range 7 West, W.M., and flows in a southeasterly direction to its confluence with Rickreall Creek within Section 1, Township 8 South, Range 7 West, W.M., and is within the City of Dallas Reservoir.

Applegate Creek rises in Section 32, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and flows in a southeasterly direction to its confluence with Rickreall Creek within Section 4, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Canyon Creek rises in Sections 21 and 28, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and flows in a southerly direction to its confluence with Rickreall Creek within Section 4, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Ellendale Creek rises in several small branches within Sections 14, 22 and 26, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and flows in a southeasterly direction to its confluence with Rickreall Creek within the SE½ of Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Mud Slough rises in Sections 4, 5 and 6, Township 7 South, Rnage 4 West, W.M., and flows in a southerly direction to its confluence with Rickreall Creek in SEZ, Section 28, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M. Several small tributaries of Mud Slough make it the largest drainage area of any of the streams which comprise the Rickreall Creek drainage area. The main tributaries being Baskett Slough (also, sometimes spelled Basket Slough), which flows into Mud Slough from the west, McMahan Branch, Goodwin Branch and McNary Branch which flow into Mud Slough from the north and easterly directions. All the drainage area of Mud Slough is below about 400 feet elevation.

Hayden Slough rises in many small branches in Section 1, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M., and Sections 6, 7 and 16, Township 8 South, Range 4 West, W.M. It is the second largest tributary to Rickreall Creek and enters this stream approximately one-half mile above the confluence of Rickreall Creek and the Willamette River, in SEZ SWZ, Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

That on the 29th day of September, 1958, there was filed in the Office of the State Engineer a petition for the determination of the water rights to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, tributary of Willamette River, signed by eight water users of said stream. Said petition for the determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said stream system being made to the State Engineer in accordance with the provisions of the Oregon Water Code, now the Oregon Water Rights Act.

That the State Engineer thereafter fixed a time for the making of the necessary surveys and examinations and the beginning of the taking of such testimony as would enable him to determine the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, as provided by law.

That a notice was prepared by the State Engineer setting forth the date on or about which the State Engineer, or his assistants, would begin the investigation of the flow of water in Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, and the existing works for the utilization of the waters thereof, said notice was published in two issues of the Oregon Statesman, a newspaper printed and published daily at Salem, Marion County, Oregon, and of general circulation in Polk County, and in the Polk County Itemizer-Observer, a newspaper printed and published weekly at Dallas, Polk County, Oregon, and of general circulation in said county; said two issues of said newspapers being those of October 3 and 10, 1963, the date of the last publication being more than ten days prior to the date fixed for the beginning of taking of measurements and the collection of other data relating to said stream system by the State Engineer, as provided by law.

That the State Engineer did send by certified mail to each person, firm or corporation, owning or being in possession of lands in, or bordering on or having access to said stream or any of its tributaries, in so far as said claimants and owners and persons in possession could reasonably be ascertained, a notice similar to such published notice as described in Finding 2, and included therewith an explanatory statement and a blank form upon which the claimant or owner could prepare in writing his notice of intention to file a statement and proof of claim of his right to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, if any he had.

By notice dated September 20, 1963, the following named persons, firms or corporations were duly notified of the proceeding by certified mail, as provided by law, of the commencing of the investigations by the State Engineer, or his duly authorized assistants, and were furnished an explanatory statement and pamphlet of information and a form upon which to declare their notice of intention to file a claim to the use of the waters of said Rick-reall Creek and its tributaries:

That duly qualified assistants to the State Engineer did proceed to make examinations, surveys and measurements of said Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, and of ditches, canals and other works diverting water therefrom, and surveys of the lands irrigated, and gathered such other data and information as were essential to the proper determination of the relative rights of the parties interested, which observations and measurements were reduced to writing and made a matter of record in his office. And the State Engineer did cause to be prepared a set of maps or plats, showing with substantial accuracy, the location of all streams in the drainage basin, the location of each canal, ditch or other means of conveyance of appropriated water and the points of diversion thereof, and the number of acres of land being irrigated in each legal subdivision, or other character of use of water, prints of said maps or plats being on file and a part of the record herein.

That after the completion of the taking of such statements and proofs of claim, the State Engineer did, on the 4th day of May, 1970, give notice by certified mail to each of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, as provided by law, that at the times and places named in said notice, to wit:

On Monday, May 18, 1970, in Conference Room No. 107, of Polk County Courthouse Annex, Dallas, Oregon.

And for a period of nine days, beginning with Tuesday, May 19, 1970, and ending with Friday, May 29, 1970, (Saturdays, Sundays and holidays excepted) at the office of the State Engineer, 516 Public Service Building, Salem, Oregon.

the statements and proofs of claim theretofore filed would be open to public inspection between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 M and from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each of said days. That said notice did state therein the county in which the determination of the State Engineer would be heard by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, to wit: the County of Polk.

- 14 -

That the State Engineer did, in accordance with said notice as described in the preceding Finding No. 13, keep said statements and proofs of claim open to public inspection at said times and places.

- 15 -

That the time set by law for filing of statements of contest, within fifteen days after the expiration of the period for public inspection, would expire on June 15, 1970, and it appearing that no additional time was requested for filing such statement of contests, and no contests were initiated by the filing with the State Engineer, the statements and proofs of claim are more particularly set out in the following paragraphs.

- 16 -

The City of Dallas submitted Proof No. 1 claiming a right to the use of 0.77 cubic foot per second of the waters of Canyon Creek, tributary of Rickreall Creek, for city water supply (municipal) diverted within the SE½ SE½, Section 33, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., for use within the corporate limits of the City of Dallas, with a date of priority of March 23, 1903.

An intake box was built on Canyon Creek and a seven inch pipeline extended down Canyon Creek to Rickreall Creek and thence down Rickreall Creek to a reservoir. Service to the City of Dallas was commenced in 1904. The seven inch pipeline was replaced with a ten inch pipeline in 1913 or 1914.

The suits of Dallas v. Hallock (1904) 44 Or. 246 and Dallas v. Boise (1904) 44 Or. 302 were for condemning rights-of-way for conducting water from Canyon Creek and 500,000

gallons of water per day. Flowing continuously, 0.77 cubic foot per second will produce approximately 500,000 gallons per day.

The City of Dallas also submitted Proof No. 2 claiming a right for the use of 0.50 cubic foot per second of the waters of Rickreall Creek with a date of priority of 1909, said water was pumped by a Hercules type pump, gas powered, with a four inch suction and four inch discharge, directly into said seven inch pipeline at the crossing of Rickreall Creek, near the present pumping station, in SW^{1}_{2} SE^{1}_{2} , Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Based on the above information it appears the City of Dallas should be awarded a right for the use of not to exceed 0.77 cubic foot per second of the waters of Canyon Creek, tributary of Rickreall Creek, to be diverted within the SE½ SE½, Section 33, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of March 23, 1903, as claimed under Proof No. 1. Also, a right for the use of not to exceed 0.50 cubic foot per second of the waters of Rickreall Creek with a date of priority of 1909, to be pumped into said pipeline within the SW½ SE½, Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., said rights being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 17 -

Clay Fox submitted Proof No. 3 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Baskett Slough, tributary of Mud Slough, for the watering of nine head of cattle, pump and stock trough located in NW½ SE½, Section 19, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., and the watering of stock directly from Baskett Slough in SE½ NW½, NE½ SW½, and NW½ SE½, said Section 19, with a date of priority of about 1850.

Cattle were first allowed to drink from the stream, later water was drawn from the stream and placed in troughs; pump and electric motor are presently used.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock use with a date of priority of 1850. Paragraph 34 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 18 -

Arthur W. George, Jessie L. Ness and Charlotte A. George, partners, submitted Proof No. 5 claiming a right for the use of the waters of a spring located within the SE½ NW½, Section 26, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1905, for domestic, including irrigation of not to exceed 0.5 acre of lawn and garden, and watering of forty-five head of stock. A storage tank was constructed near the spring and a two inch pipe was

installed to the buildings, with stock tanks located within SE½ NW½ and NE½ SW½, and domestic use in NE½ SW½, Section 26, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The irrigation of 0.2 acres of lawn and garden was found at the time of the State Engineer's survey and investigation.

It appears this right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic, including not to exceed 0.2 acre of irrigated lawn and garden, and 0.005 cubic foot per second of the waters of a spring for stock use, with a date of priority of 1905, said rights being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 19 -

Norm G. Holgate, as contract purchaser, submitted Proof No. 6 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek with a date of priority of December 15, 1908, for irrigation of 1.0 acre of lawn and shrubs within the SW\(^1\) SE\(^1\), Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M. The claim did not contain any description of the pump claimed to have been used to water the lawn and garden under the date of priority of December 15, 1908, nor any data relative thereto. The present diversion is by a Myers Ejecto pump direct drive by a one-half horsepower electric motor, with one and one-fourth inch suction and three-fourths inch discharge; suction lift is twenty-two feet and the discharge eight feet. The State Engineer classified 0.4 acre as being irrigated.

Field investigations did not disclose any old ditch or diversion works whereby the waters of Rickreall Creek could be placed upon this land and the State Engineer requested additional information and/or evidence in support of this claim to the use of said waters with the date of priority of December 15, 1908, and received notarized statements from Betty L. Holgate and Forrest Martin. Mr. Martin stated that to his knowledge water was piped and flumed from Ellendale Creek, a tributary of Rickreall Creek, as early as 1903. Both affidavits stated that in the early 1940's electricity was available in this area and since that time water was pumped directly from Rickreall Creek to irrigate this land.

On September 29, 1970, Mr. Holgate was advised that the prior use of the waters of Ellendale Creek could not be accepted to substantiate the claim to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek prior to February 24, 1909, and was permitted additional time to submit evidence in support of said claim.

No additional evidence or testimony was submitted and by letter dated October 15, 1970, Mr. and Mrs. Holgate were advised that the evidence did not support their claim and that they should make application for a permit for the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek. Therefore, this asserted claim by Proof No. 6 is denied.

Stanley S. Klimczak submitted Proof No. 7 claiming the right to the use of 16 gallons per minute of the waters of unnamed springs, tributaries of McMahan Branch, for domestic use and irrigation of lawn and garden; springs located within NE½ SE½, Section 4, and place of use in SW½ SW½, Section 3, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., with a date of priority of July 1908. An affidavit was submitted by E. Lynn Harris, former owner, that the house was built in 1908, a concrete and brick reservoir was constructed to collect said spring waters and a gravity pipeline was installed and these waters used in the house and for irrigating lawn and kitchen garden. The flow of said springs was measured at 0.022 cubic foot per second by field engineers on July 17, 1970, being approximately 9.9 gallons per minute.

The State Engineer has classified 0.25 acre of lawn as irrigated.

It appears this right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second of the waters of unnamed springs for domestic use, including irrigation of not to exceed 0.25 acre of lawn, with a date of priority of July 1908, said right being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 21 -

Mrs. W. E. Knower submitted Proof No. 8 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Nelson Spring, tributary of Goodwin Branch, with a date of priority of May 12, 1906, for 750 cubic feet per month for domestic use and 2,500 cubic feet per month for irrigation of garden and lawn and watering of an average of thirty-five sheep, two horses, up to fifteen cattle and maybe thirty-five hogs. The diversion from Nelson Spring is within the NW½ SW½, Section 11, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., by a one inch pipeline to a 1,400 gallon concrete holding tank from which a shallow well pump furnishes pressure to the buildings for domestic and irrigation and for stock use all within SW½ NW½, Section 11, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Permit No. 13707, Certificate No. 13523, issued in the name of J. W. and Susan E. Delap, evidences the right for the use of not to exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second of the waters of Nelson Spring for stock use, domestic, including irrigation of not to exceed 0.5 acre of domestic garden, with a date of priority of May 13, 1939. This claimed right appears to be identical with that under Permit No. 13707.

As additional evidence, Mrs. Knower submitted a signed and notarized document from James B. and Clara Smith, dated May 22, 1912, granting permission to lay and install a one inch pipe to convey said spring waters across said Smith lands to the Delap property.

The State Engineer has classified 0.2 acre of lawn as irrigated.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic use, including the irrigation of not to exceed 0.2 acre of lawn, and not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second for watering of livestock, with a date of priority of May 12, 1906. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 22 -

Albert W. Kroeger submitted Proof No. 9 claiming a right to the use of the waters of McNary Branch for domestic, irrigation of 1.5 acres in NE½ NW½, and 0.5 acre in SE½ NW½, watering of one hundred thirty head of stock in NW½, Section 22, and stock watering in SE½ NE½, Section 21, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., with a claimed date of priority of "Homestead 1859." Diversion is from a hand-dug filtering well adjacent to the stream within NE½ NW½, Section 22, and was originally pumped by a one-half inch air pump with a one and one-fourth inch line for domestic, stock and irrigation; now has a 25 gallon per minute Berkeley centrifugal pump and electric motor.

The State Engineer's investigation located the house and stock trough in SE½ NW½, Section 22, and classified as irrigated 0.3 acre in NE½ NW½, 0.4 acre in NW½ NW½, and 1.3 acres in SE½ NW½, Section 22, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M. The claimant has accepted the map prepared by the State Engineer as correct.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.035 cubic foot per second, being 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic, 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock trough and 0.025 cubic foot per second for irrigation; also stock watering directly from stream in SE½ NE½, Section 21, NE½ NW½, NW½ NW½, and SW½ NW½, Section 22, all in Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1859. Paragraph 34 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 23 -

Kenneth E. Martin submitted Proof No. 10 claiming a right to the use of the waters of a spring located within Rickreall Creek Watershed, for domestic, irrigation of 1.0 acre and watering of eighty head of sheep, all within NE½ NE½, Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a claimed date of priority of 1904. The flow from the spring was originally utilized by means of an open ditch and gravity flow until 1907, when a pipeline was installed. A tank and Jacuzzi electric pump has been used since 1946, to furnish pressure to the house, stock tank and for irrigation.

The map prepared by the State Engineer, which has been accepted as correct by the claimant, classified 0.4 acre of lawn and garden as irrigated.

Permit No. 23562, Certificate No. 26043, issued in the name of Forrest Martin, evidences the right for the use of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second of the waters of a spring for domestic and stock use with a date of priority of July 11, 1955, which appears to be identical with this claimed right.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second, being 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic use, 0.005 cubic foot per second for irrigation of not to exceed 0.4 acre of lawn and garden and 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock, with a date of priority of 1904, said right being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights upder Finding 42 herein.

- 24 -

Muir & McDonald Company, by Eldon E. Bevens, President and Manager, submitted Proof No. 11 claiming a right to the use of 0.25 cubic foot per second of the waters of Rickreall Creek for industrial purposes, being a tannery process, for washing, boilers and other normal tannery uses, claiming a date of priority of 1863. He submitted two signed and sworn affidavits pertaining to known use by the company; also submitted a sketch of the location of various vats, tanks, etc., with dimensions of each.

There are forty-five vats and/or tanks used in the various processes of tanning hides with a total capacity of 13,250 cubic feet. The tanks are emptied and/or refilled at frequencies of daily, four times a week, once every two weeks and one tank of 1,300 cubic feet of capacity is changed once every three months.

The three pumps, all within the tannery building in NEt NEt, Section 32, Township 7 South, Range 5 West, W.M., have a rated capacity of approximately 0.18 cubic foot per second, with all in simultaneous operation, however, the boiler pump diverts water from a storage tank; other pumps divert from stream. The three inch centrifugal pump, rated at 0.11 cubic foot per second capacity, is claimed to be operated for about five hours during each eight hour day, the other pumps as required.

It appears that this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.18 cubic foot per second during their normal operation period of the day for tannery purposes with a date of priority of 1863. Claimant's right being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 25 **-**

LaVerne A. and Janet E. Perry, as contract purchasers, submitted Proof No. 14 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Ellendale Creek, tributary of Rickreall Creek, for irrigation of 5 acres and watering of five head of stock with a claimed date of priority of January 1, 1909, to be used within SE½ SE½, Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 6 West,

W.M., said waters to be diverted within SW_{4}^{1} SE_{4}^{1} , said Section 25, and conveyed to the place of use through a four inch pipeline and thence into a small pond.

The map prepared by the State Engineer, which has been accepted as correct by the claimants, classified 3.1 acres as irrigated.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.044 cubic foot per second, being 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock and 0.039 cubic foot per second for irrigation, with a date of priority of January 1, 1909, said rights being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 26 -

June L. Tallman submitted Proof No. 16 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Baskett Slough, tributary of Rickreall Creek, for watering of an average of nine head of cattle with a claimed date of priority of about 1850. The cattle were allowed to drink directly from the stream, later water was drawn from the stream and placed in troughs; a pump is presently being used. Stock are also watered directly from the stream within NE½ SE½ and NW½ SE½, Section 19, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

The State Engineer's investigation located a pump with a pipeline to a stock trough all in NW\2 SE\2, Section 19, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

It appears that this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock watering facilities within NW½ SE½; and for stock watering directly from the stream within NE½ SE½ and NW½ SE½, Section 19, Township 7 South, Range 4 West, W.M., with a date of priority of about 1850. Paragraph 34 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made. Claimant's right for stock watering is more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 27 **-**

Albert E. Ullman submitted Proof No. 17 claiming a right to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek for domestic use of one family, place of use and diversion within SE½ NW½, Section 36, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a claimed date of 1900, and states continuous use since this date.

Present water system was installed in 1939, being a Montgomery Ward piston type pump and one horse electric motor, rated at two and one-half gallons per minute.

Mr. Ullman submitted six signed statements stating knowledge of the use of this water for campground uses ranging in time from 1905 to 1935, said water being diverted by

dipping directly from the stream. On September 21, 1970, the State Engineer received from Mr. Ullman five signed and notarized statements in regard to dipping water by a bucket from Rickreall Creek while vacationing on the property known as Siddons Camp Ground, located approximately in the vicinity of the present Ullman residence, during the years 1905 to 1938.

Permit No. 7920, Certificate No. 9484, in the name of Mary A. Siddons, evidences the right for the use of not to exceed 0.6 cubic foot per second of the waters of two springs, tributaries of Rickreall Creek, for domestic supply and campground use, with a date of priority of May 7, 1927, said springs located in SE½ NW½ and SW½ SW½, Section 36, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M. The application map locates the house within a different one-quarter section as that now claimed by Mr. Ullman, however, the campground as noted seems to be a part of the Ullman property.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic use of one family within the SE½ NW½, Section 36, Township 7 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1900, said right being more particularly described and set out in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

- 28 **-**

The following claimants submitted proofs for the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek Drainage for stock watering directly from specified streams with no direct diversions being made for such use:

It appears the above-named claimants should be allowed a right for stock watering directly from the above-stated streams with dates of priority as claimed. Paragraph 34 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made.

Claimant's rights for stock watering, as allowed herein, are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 42 herein.

DUTY OF WATER, HEAD OF WATER, FOR IRRIGATION USE

Taking into consideration all of the various elements and conditions having a bearing on the quantity of water essential for the irrigation of crops within Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, the duty of water, except where particularly defined in specific findings herein, hereby is fixed at not to exceed 2.5 acre feet per acre during any one irrigation season.

The rate of flow or head of water to be diverted, where not specifically stated in specific findings herein, or definitely fixed in a permit or certificate of water right, hereby is fixed at not to exceed 1/80 of one cubic foot per second for each acre irrigated.

It is further provided that the quantity of water which a claimant whose right has been determined herein shall be entitled to divert at any time shall be determined on the basis of the acreage actually prepared for irrigation and to which water may be beneficially applied in the production of crops.

- 30 -

DUTY OF WATER FOR RIGHTS EVIDENCED BY PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

Claimants who have asserted rights to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, based upon a certificate of water right issued by the State Engineer, recognized herein, or upon a permit issued by the State Engineer, which right has not yet been perfected, are limited to the quantity of water and rate of diversion set out in such certificate or permit. Provided, that the quantity of water for irrigation use, unless otherwise provided in the certificate of water right or permit, is limited to 2.5 acre feet per acre for each acre or fraction thereof, irrigated during any one irrigation season.

- 31 -

RIGHTS UNDER PERMITS ISSUED BY THE STATE ENGINEER

Subject to the terms and conditions and modifications herein, each and every appropriator of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, who has initiated a right to the use of said waters by filing an application with the State Engineer for a permit, where the right has not been confirmed by the issuance of a certificate of water right, or where in the specific findings herein no reference is made to a certificate of water right, whether a claim was filed in this proceeding or not, shall have such rights thereunder as provided by law, and such rights shall be perfected in the manner provided by law for the completion thereof.

DOMESTIC USE

Where a claimant in this proceeding asserted a right for domestic purpose and the same was allowed herein, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of water for household purposes and water for such animals as are required for the proper sustenance of the family.

If specifically listed, domestic use shall include the irrigation of a lawn and domestic garden.

- 33 -

STOCK USE BY DIVERSION

Where a claimant in this proceeding asserted a right to the use of water for stock purposes by diversion and it was allowed herein, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of the water for such animals as are essential to the proper sustenance of the family and also water for stock when the claimant is engaged in the raising of livestock or when the claimant takes in livestock for pasturage and is limited to the use of such quantity of water as is necessary for the number of stock claimed; provided that where the claimant was allowed a right herein for irrigation use through the same ditch, pipeline or other means of conveyance, no additional water shall be diverted for stock use while water is being diverted for irrigation purposes.

- 34 -

STOCK USE WHERE NO ARTIFICIAL DIVERSION IS MADE

A number of claimants in this proceeding have asserted rights by appropriation to the use of water for stock purposes where no artificial diversion of the water is made, the stock drinking directly from the stream as it flows through claimant's lands, or from springs which arise on claimant's lands. In these claims, a definite date of priority is asserted and the number of head of stock declared.

All claimants who have filed herein statements and proofs of claim wherein a right was asserted to the use of water from springs or streams for stock purposes by the stock drinking directly therefrom on lands owned by claimants, and which rights have been allowed herein, hereby are allowed, subject to the provisions herein, sufficient water from the springs or flowing in the streams from which the respective rights are claimed, for a reasonable number of stock, not exceeding the number of stock as asserted by claimant in connection with his statement and proof of claim. Provided, that at all times there shall remain flowing from said springs and in said streams such a reasonable quantity of water and in such a manner and amount that the streams shall not become stagnant.

DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE

Where a claimant asserted a right to the use of water for both domestic and stock purposes, and it was allowed herein, it is to be understood that domestic use includes only water for household uses.

- 36 -

DOMESTIC USE, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE, STOCK USE

The right to divert and use the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, as allowed herein, for domestic use, domestic and stock use, or stock use shall continue throughout the year.

- 37 -

HEAD-GATES AND MEASURING DEVICES

The owner or owners of any ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of diversion and conveyance, whether the rights are determined in this proceeding or subsequently initiated and perfected, shall maintain to the satisfaction of the watermaster a substantial headgate at the point of diversion, which shall be constructed so that it can be set and locked or closed and locked by the watermaster. And when in the distribution of water by the watermaster, he may require the installation of suitable head-gates or measuring devices, such owner or owners shall construct and maintain such suitable head-gates or measuring devices as may be necessary to assist the watermaster to determine the quantity of water that is to be diverted into said ditch, pipeline or other means of conveyance, from the spring, stream or other source of supply.

If the owner or owners shall refuse or neglect to install such head-gates or measuring devices after ten days written notice, the watermaster may close and post such ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of conveyance and the same shall not be opened or any water diverted from the source of supply under the penalties prescribed by law for the illegal opening of head-gates lawfully closed, until the requirements of the watermaster as to such head-gates or measuring devices have been complied with.

- 38 -

IRRIGATION SEASON

The irrigation season for Rickreall Creek and its tributaries hereby is fixed as commencing on April 1 and ending September 30 of each year.

PLACE OF MEASUREMENT

The place of measurement of the water to which any appropriator of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries is entitled, whether such appropriation was determined in this proceeding, or was initiated by the filing of an application with the State Engineer, hereby is fixed to be at the point of diversion from the stream or source of supply.

- 40 -

RIGHTS APPURTENANT TO LAND

The rights to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries for irrigation purposes, as herein confirmed, are appurtenant to the lands herein described in connection with such rights, and are limited and confined to the irrigation of the lands described herein, and the priorities of rights confirmed confer no right to the use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries on any lands than those specified tracts to which such rights are herein set forth as appurtenant, and each and every person, association or corporation, or their respective successors in interest, shall be and hereby are prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream or any of its tributaries on any other lands without lawful permit thereto first obtained from the State Engineer.

The rights to the use of water for other useful and beneficial purposes as herein confirmed are appurtenant to the lands and place of use as herein described and the priorities and rights herein confirmed confer no rights to the use of the waters of said Rickreall Creek or any of its tributaries on any lands other than those specified tracts to which such rights are set forth herein as appurtenant, and each and every person, association or corporation, or their respective successors in interest, shall be and hereby are prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream or any of its tributaries on any other lands without lawful permit therefor first obtained from the State Engineer.

DIVERSIONS GOVERNED BY PRIORITIES AND BENEFICIAL USE

Except as otherwise determined herein, the order of rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries, and the order in which they are entitled to divert and use said water shall be and is according to the date of relative priority of the rights as determined and set forth herein, and the first in order of time according to the date of relative priority shall be and hereby is first in order of right, and so on, down to the latest priority, and those having prior rights are entitled

to divert and use the waters of said stream and its tributaries, when necessary for the irrigation of their respective lands, or other useful and beneficial purposes for which they were allowed a right of use, and in accordance with such right at all times against those having rights of subsequent priority, without let or hindrance, and whenever the water is not required for beneficial use by the appropriator having such prior right to its use for the purpose for which such water was appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down the natural channel of the stream as it was wont to flow in its natural course, without let or hindrance or diversion thereof, and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of said waters and to divert the same to the extent of their respective rights, according to the order of priority of their respective rights; and at all times the water diverted by the appropriator whose rights have been determined herein, shall be beneficially and reasonably used without waste, and no rights of appropriation are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity of water into the head of the ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of conveyance of the appropriator having a valid right to divert the water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose to which the water is to be used, in accordance with his right.

ORDER OF DETERMINATION

To summarize and supplement the specific findings herein, the rights of the claimants to the use of the waters of Rickreall Creek and its tributaries as determined herein, are arranged in tabulated form, with the date of relative priority of such appropriation, the quantity or rate of flow of the water allowed such appropriator, the number of acres to be irrigated by such appropriation, the use or uses to which such water is applied, the means by which the water so appropriated has been diverted, the name of the stream or other source from which the water is appropriated and diverted, and the description of the lands upon which the water has been used and is fixed as appurtenant; the tabulated rights of each appropriator being set opposite and following his name and post office address, as stated in his statement and proof of claim as follows:
