Now at this time the above-entitled matter coming on for consideration by the State Engineer, and it appearing that all evidence and testimony have been taken in the above-entitled proceeding, and the State Engineer having carefully considered all such evidence and testimony and the engineering data and information gathered in accordance with law, and being fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in his office the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION

-1-

The watershed of Ash Creek and its tributaries is a small basin of approximately 34.5 square miles in area located entirely in the southeasterly part of Polk County, Oregon. It is bounded by low-lying, unnamed ridges, none of which exceed 1000 feet in elevation.

Ash Creek, a tributary of the Willamette River, has its beginning in Section 2, Township 8 South, Range 6 West, W.M., approximately three miles southwest of the City of Dallas, flowing thence in a southeasterly direction for approximately ten miles to its confluence with the Willamette River within the city limits of Independence. It has two main tributaries, Middle Fork, approximately four miles long, and South Fork, approximately five miles long, which drain an area south of the main stream. These tributaries join the main channel, or North Fork, of Ash Creek approximately two and one-half and one miles, respectively, above Ash Creek's confluence with the Willamette River.

Ash Creek is a perennial stream with runoff principally derived from rainfall, varying with the seasons.

That on the 21st day of October, 1970, there was filed with the State Engineer a petition for the determination of the waters of Ash Creek, tributary of the Willamette River, signed by Milo Jensen, a user of said stream, petitioner praying that a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream system be made by the State Engineer in accordance with the provisions of the Oregon Water Rights Act.

That the State Engineer thereafter fixed a time for the making of the necessary surveys and examinations and the beginning of the taking of such testimony as would enable him to determine the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, as provided by law.

That a notice was prepared by the State Engineer setting forth the date on or about which the State Engineer, or his assistants, would begin the investigation of the flow of water in Ash Creek and its tributaries, and the existing works for the utilization of the waters thereof; and said notice was published in two issues of each of the following newspapers:

Enterprise-Herald, Independence - Published each Thursday

Polk County Itemizer-Observer, Dallas - Published each Thursday

That each of said newspapers are of general circulation in their respective localities and that complete coverage of Ash Creek drainage basin was obtained. That said two issues of said newspaper were those of November 12, and 19, 1970, the date of the last publication being more than ten days prior to the date fixed for the beginning of the taking of measurements and the making of investigations of said stream system by the State Engineer, as provided by law.

That the State Engineer did send by certified mail to each person, firm or corporation, owning or being in possession of lands in, or bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, in so far as said claimants and owners and persons in possession could reasonably be ascertained, a notice similar to such published notice, and included therewith an explanatory statement and map, and a blank form upon which the claimant or owner could prepare in writing his notice of intention to file a statement and proof of claim of his right to the use of the waters of said Ash Creek and its tributaries, if any he had.

That the following named persons, firms or corporations were duly notified of the proceeding by certified mail, as provided by law, of the commencing of the investigations by the State Engineer, or his duly authorized assistants, and were furnished an explanatory statement and map, and pamphlet of information and a form upon which to declare their notice of intention to file a claim to the use of the waters of said Ash Creek and its tributaries:

That all persons, firms or corporations to whom notices were sent by certified mail, as tabulated under Findings 5 and 11, above, who have failed, neglected or refused to appear

herein and submit proof of a claim or right to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, initiated prior to the adoption of the Oregon Water Code on February 24, 1909, now the Oregon Water Rights Act, if any they have or claim, are in default; such default is here and now entered against them, and each of them, and such parties are hereby enjoined and inhibited from using or asserting any rights to the use of said Ash Creek or any tributary thereof, included in this proceeding, except by, through or under the rights of persons whose water rights are defined herein, or under and by virtue of permits issued by the State Engineer, as provided by law.

That after the completion of the taking of such statements and proofs of claim, the State Engineer did, on the 27th day of January, 1972, give notice by certified mail to each of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, as provided by law, that at the times and places named in said notice, to wit:

On Friday, February 11, 1972, in Room No. 14, Old Building, Polk County Courthouse, Dallas, Oregon;

And for a period of nine days, beginning with Monday, February 14 and ending with Friday, February 25, 1972, (Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excepted) at the office of the State Engineer, 1178 Chemeketa Street N.E., Salem, Oregon.

the statements and proofs of claim theretofore filed would be open to public inspection between the hours of 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon and from 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. on each of said days. That said notice did state therein the county in which the determination of the State Engineer would be heard by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, to wit: the County of Polk.

That the State Engineer did, in accordance with said notice as described in the preceding Finding 15, keep said statements and proofs of claim open to public inspection at said times and places.

That the time set by law for filing of statements of contest, within fifteen days after the expiration of the period for public inspection, would expire on March 13, 1972, and it appearing that no additional time was requested for filing such statement of contests, and no contests were initiated by the filing with the State Engineer, the statements and proofs of claim are more particularly set out in the following paragraphs.

K. A. Bursell, by Phillip E. Bursell, as agent, submitted Proof No. 7, claiming a right to the use of the waters of a spring and two unnamed streams, tributaries of Middle Fork Ash Creek, for domestic use of one family in SW½ NE½, Section 15, from a spring located in SE½ NE½, Section 15; the watering of one hundred sheep and four cows directly from two unnamed streams in SW½ SW½, Section 14; SE½ NE½, SE½ SE½, Section 15, all in Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of December 31, 1888.

The domestic water was hauled by barrel until 1928, when a pump system was installed. The present system was installed in 1942, and consists of a Myers one and a half by one and a quarter inch piston pump rated at ten gallons per minute and a Century three quarter horsepower electric motor.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second of the waters of a spring for domestic use with a date of priority of December 31, 1888. Paragraph 30 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

Chester Glen Davies submitted Proof No. 8, claiming a right to the use of the waters of a spring, tributary of North Fork Ash Creek, for the domestic use of one family and the watering of thirteen cattle and twelve goats; spring, house and barn being located within SW½ SW½, Section 6, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1898.

A Myers jet pump and a half horsepower electric motor were installed about fifteen years ago replacing a gravity system.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second from a spring, being 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic use and 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock use with a date of priority of 1898. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

Eugene D. and Claire MacCarthy submitted Proof No. 12, claiming a right to the use of the waters of Samuel's Spring, tributary of Middle Fork Ash Creek, for the domestic use of one family, irrigation of 0.9 acre and the watering of twenty sheep and one horse; spring and places of use in NE½ SW½, Section 9, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1900.

As additional evidence, Mr. and Mrs. MacCarthy submitted a notarized document from Ralph Howe, Polk County resident since 1899, and County Surveyor since 1938, stating his knowledge of the use of this water.

A log cabin and barn were claimed to have been built near the spring in 1900, with the water hauled to the place of use. In 1963, a house was built near the log cabin and a Jacuzzi three quarter inch centrifugal pump installed with a quarter horsepower electric motor. The lawn and garden was then moved to its present location.

The State Engineer has classified 0.9 acre as irrigated.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.021 cubic foot per second of the waters of Samuel's Spring; being 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic use, 0.011 cubic foot per second for irrigation of 0.9 acre and 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock use, with a date of priority of 1900. Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

The Estate of Olga Paige, by Glenda Neal, Executrix, submitted Proof No. 16, claiming a right to the use of the waters of a spring, tributary to Middle Fork Ash Creek, for the domestic use of one family, diversion and use in SE½ NW½, Section 11, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1908.

The water was carried to the house in buckets originally, with an electric pumping system installed more than thirty years ago. The present system is a Myers jet pump, rated at two gallons per minute, with a Century half horsepower electric motor.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second for domestic use, with a date of priority of 1908.

Claimant's rights are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

W. Landon and Thelma R. Regele submitted Proof No. 18, claiming a right to the use of the waters of a spring, tributary of the Middle Fork of Ash Creek, for the domestic use of one family, including the irrigation of a lawn and garden, and the watering of stock, with a date of priority of 1900. The spring is located in NE½ SW½, Section 11; the house and barn in SE½ SW½, Section 11, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

The early stock use consisted of cattle, hogs, sheep and goats. The present stock use is eighteen to twenty-nine cattle, twelve hogs, two horses and fifty to one hundred sixty-five sheep and lambs.

The water is pumped to the house and barn by a Webtrol submersible pump and onethird horsepower electric motor rated at twelve gallons per minute, which was installed in 1957. Earlier use was said to be made by a pitcher pump and also a siphon-gravity system.

The State Engineer has classified 0.2 acre of lawn and garden as irrigated in SE½ SW½, Section 11, Township 8 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second for domestic use, including the irrigation of not to exceed 0.2 acre of lawn and garden, and 0.005 cubic foot per second for stock use from a spring, with a date of priority of 1900, said rights being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

Willamette Industries, Inc., by Max E. Ross, Engineer and Agent, submitted Proof No. 21, claiming a right to the use of the waters of North Fork Ash Creek for the storage of 18.5 acre-feet of water in a pond for log storage and the use of 0.01 cubic foot per second for the maintenance of said pond in SW½ SW½, Section 33, Township 7 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1905.

Permit No. R-5590, issued to Willamette Valley Lumber Company, authorizes the storage of 18.5 acre-feet of water from Ash Creek for a log pond, with a date of priority of October 6, 1965. Permit No. 34925, issued to Willamette Valley Lumber Company, authorizes the appropriation of 0.01 cubic foot per second from Ash Creek and reservoir for the maintenance of a log pond, with a date of priority of February 24, 1970. This claimed right appears to be identical with those under Permits No. R-5590 and 34925.

It appears this claimed right should be limited to the storage of 18.5 acre-feet in a log pond and a rate of diversion of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second of the waters of North Fork Ash Creek for maintenance of a log pond, with a date of priority of 1905; said right being more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

It appears the above-named claimants should be allowed a right for stock watering directly from the above-stated sources with priority dates as claimed. Paragraph 30 of these Findings relates to stock use when no artificial diversion is made.

Claimants' rights for stock watering, as allowed herein, are more particularly set out and described in the tabulation of water rights under Finding 38 herein.

DUTY OF WATER, HEAD OF WATER, FOR IRRIGATION USE

Taking into consideration all of the various elements and conditions having a bearing on the quantity of water essential for the irrigation of crops within Ash Creek and its tributaries, the duty of water, except where particularly defined in specific findings herein, hereby is fixed at not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre during any one irrigation season.

The rate of flow or head of water to be diverted, where not specifically stated in specific findings herein, or definitely fixed in a permit or certificate of water right, hereby is fixed at not to exceed 1/80 of one cubic foot per second for each acre irrigated.

It is further provided that the quantity of water which a claimant whose right has been determined herein shall be entitled to divert at any time shall be determined on the basis of the acreage actually prepared for irrigation and to which water may be beneficially applied in the production of crops.

DUTY OF WATER FOR RIGHTS EVIDENCED BY PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

Claimants who have asserted rights to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, based upon a certificate of water right issued by the State Engineer, recognized herein, or upon a permit issued by the State Engineer, which right has not yet been perfected, are limited to the quantity of water and rate of diversion set out in such certificate or permit. Provided, that the quantity of water for irrigation use, unless otherwise provided in the certificate of water right or permit, is limited to 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre or fraction thereof, irrigated during any one irrigation season.

RIGHTS UNDER PERMITS ISSUED BY THE STATE ENGINEER

Subject to the terms and conditions and modifications herein, each and every appropriator of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, who has initiated a right to the use of said waters by filing an application with the State Engineer for a permit, where the right has not been confirmed by the issuance of a certificate of water right, or where in the specific findings herein no reference is made to a certificate of water right, whether a claim was filed in this proceeding or not, shall have such rights thereunder as provided by law, and such rights shall be perfected in the manner provided by law for the completion thereof.

DOMESTIC USE

Where a claimant in this proceeding asserted a right for domestic purpose and the same was allowed herein, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of water for household purposes and water for such animals as are required for the proper sustenance of the family.

If specifically listed, domestic use shall include the irrigation of a lawn and domestic garden.

STOCK USE BY DIVERSION

Where a claimant in this proceeding asserted a right to the use of water for stock purposes by diversion and it was allowed herein, it is to be understood that the claimant has a right to the use of the water for such animals as are essential to the proper sustenance of the family and also water for stock when the claimant is engaged in the raising of livestock or when the claimant takes in livestock for pasturage and is limited to the use of such quantity of water as is necessary for the number of stock claimed; provided that where the claimant was allowed a right herein for irrigation use through the same ditch, pipeline or other means of conveyance, no additional water shall be diverted for stock use while water is being diverted for irrigation purposes.

STOCK USE WHERE NO ARTIFICIAL DIVERSION IS MADE

A number of claimants in this proceeding have asserted rights by appropriation to the use of water for stock purposes where no artificial diversion of water is made, the stock drinking directly from the stream as it flows through claimants lands, or from springs which arise on claimants lands. In these claims, a definite date of priority is asserted and the number of head of stock declared. The Oregon Water Code is based on the Appropriation Doctrine which requires a physical diversion of a measurable quantity of water for beneficial use at a specific location. Stock drinking directly from a stream does not meet all the requirements of an appropriative right. The accessibility of water for this purpose was a prime consideration in the claiming of land by the early settlers of the Oregon country. Therefore, this use, which is a benefit to the claimant, is hereby recognized and made a matter of record, as a privilege but is not an appropriative right subject to change in use, place of use, or point of diversion.

All claimants who have filed herein statements and proofs of claim asserting a right to the use of water from springs or streams for stock purposes by stock drinking directly therefrom on lands owned by claimants, and which rights have been recognized herein, hereby are allowed, subject to the provisions herein, sufficient water from the claimed source for a reasonable number of stock, not exceeding the number of stock asserted by claimant in connection with his statement and proof of claim.

DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE

Where a claimant asserted a right to the use of water for both domestic and stock

purposes, and it was allowed herein, it is to be understood that domestic use includes only water for household uses.

DOMESTIC USE, DOMESTIC AND STOCK USE, STOCK USE

The right to divert and use the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, as allowed herein, for domestic use, domestic and stock use, or stock use shall continue throughout the year.

-33-

HEAD-GATES AND MEASURING DEVICES

The owner or owners of any ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of diversion and conveyance, whether the rights are determined in this proceeding or subsequently initiated and perfected, shall maintain to the satisfaction of the watermaster a substantial head-gate at the point of diversion, which shall be constructed so that it can be set and locked or closed and locked by the watermaster. And when in the distribution of water by the watermaster, he may require the installation of suitable head-gates or measuring devices, such owner or owners shall construct and maintain such suitable head-gates or measuring devices as may be necessary to assist the watermaster to determine the quantity of water that is to be diverted into said ditch, pipeline, or other means of conveyance, from the spring, stream or other source of supply.

If the owner or owners shall refuse or neglect to install such head-gates or measuring devices after ten days written notice, the watermaster may close and post such ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of conveyance and the same shall not be opened or any water diverted from the source of supply under the penalties prescribed by law for the 'illegal opening of head-gates lawfully closed, until the requirements of the watermaster as to such head-gates or measuring devices have been complied with.

IRRIGATION SEASON

The irrigation season for Ash Creek and its tributaries hereby is fixed as commencing on April 1 and ending September 30 of each year.

PLACE OF MEASUREMENT

The place of measurement of the water to which any appropriator of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries is entitled, whether such appropriation was determined in

this proceeding, or was initiated by the filing of an application with the State Engineer, hereby is fixed to be at the point of diversion from the stream or source of supply.

-36-

RIGHTS APPURTENANT TO LAND

The rights to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries for irrigation purposes, as herein confirmed, are appurtenant to the lands herein described in connection with such rights, and are limited and confined to the irrigation of the lands described herein, and the priorities of rights confirmed confer no right to the use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries on any lands than those specified tracts to which such rights are herein set forth as appurtenant, and each and every person, association or corporation, or their respective successors in interest, shall be and hereby are prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream or any of its tributaries on any other lands without lawful permit thereto first obtained from the State Engineer.

The rights to the use of water for other useful and beneficial purposes as herein confirmed are appurtenant to the lands and place of use as herein described and the priorities and rights herein confirmed confer no rights to the use of the waters of said Ash Creek or any of its tributaries on any lands other than those specified tracts to which such rights are set forth herein as appurtenant, and each and every person, association or corporation, or their respective successors in interest, shall be and hereby are prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream or any of its tributaries on any other lands without lawful permit therefor first obtained from the State Engineer.

DIVERSIONS GOVERNED BY PRIORITIES AND BENEFICIAL USE

Except as otherwise determined herein, the order of rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries, and the order in which they are entitled to divert and use said water shall be and is according to the date of relative priority of the rights as determined and set forth herein, and the first in order of time according to the date of relative priority shall be and hereby is first in order of right, and so on, down to the latest priority, and those having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said stream and its tributaries, when necessary for the irrigation of their respective lands, or other useful and beneficial purposes for which they were

allowed a right of use, and in accordance with such right at all times against those having rights of subsequent priority, without let or hindrance, and whenever the water is not required for beneficial use by the appropriator having such prior right to its use for the purpose for which such water was appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down the natural channel of the stream as it was wont to flow in its natural course, without let or hindrance or diversion thereof, and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of said waters and to divert the same to the extent of their respective rights, according to the order of priority of their respective rights; and at all times the water diverted by the appropriator whose rights have been determined herein, shall be beneficially and reasonably used without waste, and no rights of appropriation are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity of water into the head of the ditch, pump, pipeline or other means of conveyance of the appropriator having a valid right to divert the water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose to which the water is to be used, in accordance with his right.

ORDER OF DETERMINATION

To summarize and supplement the specific findings herein, the rights of the claimants to the use of the waters of Ash Creek and its tributaries as determined herein, are arranged in tabulated form, with the date of relative priority of such appropriation, the quantity or rate of flow of the water allowed such appropriator, the number of acres to be irrigated by such appropriation, the use or uses to which such water is applied, the means by which the water so appropriated has been diverted, the name of the stream or other source from which the water is appropriated and diverted, and the description of the lands upon which the water has been used and is fixed as appurtenant; the tabulated rights of each appropriator being set opposite and following his name and post office address, as stated in his statement and proof of claim as follows:
