FINDINGS OF FACT AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION.

Now on this 17th day of November, 1915, the above entitled matter coming on before the State Water Board of the State of Oregon, at a meeting of said board, commenced and held on said day, and it appearing to the said board that all the evidence taken at the original hearing and in all contests herein has been duly filed in the office of the said board, and the said board having carefully considered all of the said evidence, proofs and testimony taken, and the information and data gathered by the State Engineer, and being now fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in its office, the following

FINDINGS OF FACT:

1.

That on the 27th day of May, 1909, there was filed in the office of the State Water Board of the State of Oregon, a petition signed by H. A. Mitchell, G. H. Perkins, B. A. Chambers, and Carl Parker, water users upon said stream, requesting a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream, and that said petitioners are actual users of the waters of the said Powder River and its tributaries, as appears from the order of determination herein; that thereupon the said State Water Board, after a full investigation and due consideration of said petitions, found the facts and conditions such as to justify the making of a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants of the waters of said stream and its tributaries thereto, and made am entered its orders in the records of said office, fixing a time and place for the beginning and making of such an examination of said stream by the State Engineer, as would enable the said board to determine the rights of the said claimants and also the time and place for the beginning and taking of testimony by the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2; that said time when said State Engineer or his assistants, did begin the examination of said stream was set by said order of said board, as follows, to-wit: on Monday the 10th day of June, 1912, at the City Hall in the City of Sumpter, Baker County, Oregon; on Wednesday the 12th day of June, 1912, and on Thursday the 13th day of June, 1912, at the City Hall in the City of Hall in North Powder, Union County, Oregon; on Tuesday, the 18th day of June, 1912, at the City Hall in Flohland, Baker County, Oregon, and from Thursday the 20th day of June, 1912, to

That a notice was premared by said board setting forth the date when the State Engineer or his assistants would begin the investigation of the flow of said stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the time and place certain when the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 would begin the taking of testimony as to the rights of the various claimants to the waters thereof, and said notice was published in two issues of the Baker City Herald, a daily newspaper published at Baker, Oregon, and of general circulation in the Counties of Baker and Union, Oregon, beginning with the 22nd day of April, 1912, and ending with the 24th day of April, 1912, the date of the last publication of said notice being more than thirty days prior to the date fixed for the making of said exemination and measurement of the said streams and ditches by the State Engineer, and for the beginning of taking of testimony by the Division Superintendent.

3.

That on the 6th day of May, 1912, the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did send by registered mail, to each person, firm, and corporation claiming a right to use the water of said stream, or any tributary thereof, and to each person, firm and corporation owning or being in possession of land bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, in so far as said claimants, owners, firms, or corporations in possession could be reasonably ascertained, a similar notice to such published notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer would commence the examination of said stream and its tributaries, and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the time and place certain when the Superintendent of said Water Division would commence the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of the various claimants to said stream and its tributaries, and said Superintendent did enclose with each of said notices a blank form upon which the said claimant or person in possession should present in writing all the particulars necessary for the determination of his rights to the waters of said stream, or a tributary thereof, under oath.

4.

That due proof of publication of said notice and of the sending of said notice by registered mail has been made and is duly filed and is now a part of the record hereof.

5.

That upon the date named in said notice herein published and sent, and at the place specified therein, an assistant to the State Engineer did commence the examination of said stream and its tributaries, and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did commence the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of said claimants, and did continue taking same until completed; that the following named persons, firms and corporations, were duly notified by registered mail, and by publication of said notice, as hereinbefore set forth, but that each and all of them although so notified, have failed, neglected, and refused to appear herein, and submit proofs of their rights to said stream, if any they have or claim, and that each of said parties are in default and that said default should be, and hereby is entered against them, to-wit: Adams, J. That upon the completion of the taking of testimony by the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, said Superintendent did, on the 28th day of August, 1913, give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the waters of said stream and its tributaries, that at the time and place named in said notice, to-wit: Beginning on Monday the 15th day of September, 1913, and ending on Saturday, the 27th day of September, 1913, (Sundays excepted) from nine o'clock a.m. to twelve o'clock M., and from two o'clock p.m. to five o'clock p.m. at the following places in Baker and Union Counties, Oregon, to-wit: At the Court House in the City of Baker, Baker County, Oregon, from Monday the 15th day of September, 1913, until Saturday the 20th day of September, 1913, and at the office of the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, in the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, from Monday the 22nd day of September, 1913, to Saturday the 27th day of September, 1913, inclusive, all of said evidence would be opened to the inspection of the various claimants or owners, and that said Division Superintendent did, in accordance with said notices, attend at said times and places and keep said evidence open to inspection for a period of twelve full days, and said notice did also state forthwith, the County in which the determination of the said Water Board would be held, by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, to-wit: Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, due proof of the holding of said inspection and of the sending of said notices, by registered mail, being filed herein. That at said times and places named in said notices, for said public inspection, the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did open to public inspection, all proofs and evidence of the rights to the water and the Findings of the State Water Board in relation to the relative rights to the use of the waters of North Powder River and its tributaries, a tributary of Powder River, which said North Powder River had already been duly adjudicated, and the rights to the waters of said stream had heretofore been duly determined by the State Water Board as provided by statute; that no contest was filed by any of the claimants to the right of the use of water from North Power River and its tributaries against any of the water users of the water of North Powder River.

That seventy-one contests were filed with the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, within five days after the close of the public inspection of the statements and proofs of claim of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said river; the names of the respective contestants and contestees involved in each of said contests, together with the number and disposition of each contest, being fully set out in the following findings numbered 11 to 81 inclusive.

10.

That after the filing of said contests, the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did fix the time and place for the hearing of each and every of said contests, and served notices of hearing of said contests on each of the parties to each and every of said contests, which notices of hearing set the date for said hearing at more than thirty days and less then sixty days from the date said notices of hearing were so served upon said parties. That due proof of said notices of hearing, and of the services thereof upon each of the parties to each and every of said contests is on file in these proceedings. That upon the date set for the hearing of said contests, the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2 did attend and begin said hearings upon said contests, and did continue said hearings upon said contests from time to time until each and every of said contests were fully heard, settled, or otherwise disposed of as hereinafter more fully appears.

Contest #1. Patrick Burke, contestant, v. C. C. Olsen, contestee, was stipulated by the parties thereto to the effect that each party shall have equal rights to the waters of Willow Creek as of date 1872, and it appearing to the State Water Board that contestant irrigates 156 acres of land from Willow Creek under date of 1872, and 108 acres from Rock Creek under date of May, 1884, and 48 acres are also irrigated from Willow Creek through the North Willow Creek Ditch as a supplemental supply to Rock Creek, and contestee irrigates 163.6 acres from Willow Creek under date of 1872, and that the dates of priority stated in said stipulation are within the dates stated in the statements and proofs of claimants, the State Water Board hereby finds, that said parties are entitled to the equal use of the waters of said Willow Creek with a priority date of 1872, subject to the general findings herein and the water master shall distribute the water to the parties hereto, equally, provided, that when such distribution interferes with other rights, then such distribution shall be according to priority, and provided further, that this finding shall not prevent the establishment of any better system of rotation.

Contest #2. W. A. Green, J. O. Maxwell, H. K. Fisher, Asa L. Brown, W. L. Toney, Killimacue Lake Reservoir & Rock Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, and Rock Creek Protective Association, contestants, v. Rock Creek & North Powder Irrigation Company, a corporation, Davis Wilcox, P. Basche, P. Basche as administrator of the Estate of Nat Cooper, deceased, Amanda C. Moore, Susan H. Moore, Cecile Moore and Amanda C. Moore, and Susan H. Moore, Trustees of the Estate of Frank L. Moore, deceased, contestees, was stipulated by the parties thereto to the effect that contestees make no claim to the priority date of the Waggy Ditch nor to the stored water of the Killamacue Reservoir, nor to more than 1392 miners inches of water for the land described in contestee's claims and no other and in accordance with such stipulation, the State Water Board finds the dates of priority as hereinafter tabulated, and the amount of water to be used shall be in accordance with the general findings herein.

Contest #3. Fountain Seacat, contestant, v. George F. Gardner, contestee, and Contest #17, George F. Gardner, contestant, v. Fountain Seacat and Henrietta Seacat, husband and wife, A. V. Swift, Edna Stuchell, D. F. Indermuhl, Ida F. Lachner and Mary S. Gardner, contestees, were heard by the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, and the testimony and all the proceedings in said contests were reported, transcribed am filed with all exhibits in this proceeding, and from all the testimony, proceedings, exhibits, data and information filed in these proceedings and applicable to these contests, the State Water Ecard finds that the first irrigation ditch upon the place now owned by G. F. Gardner was constructed in 1864, and covered about 21.5 acres; the second ditch was constructed in 1867, and covered about 40.5 acres, and the third ditch was constructed in 1896, and covered about twenty acres of land. That the irrigation of the place now owned by Fountain Seacat began in 1867. That the irrigation of the lands now belonging to Mary S. Gardner and Edna Stuchell began in 1875 (49 Or. 617-618); those belonging to D. F. Indermuhl in 1875; A. V. Swift in 1884 (49 Or. 616), and Ida F. Lachner in 1893. That said dates of priority shall be set out in the tabulation herein as herein found. That D. F. Indermuhl by stipulation has waived all priorities as to the lands of G. F. Gardner, and in the distribution of water such waiver shall be observed so long as no other rights are infringed. That except as otherwise herein provided, the water master shall distribute the water according to the dates of priority herein found, subject to the general findings herein.

Contest #4. W. A. Green, J. O. Maxwell, H. K. Fisher, Asa L. Brown, W. L. Toney, Killamacue Lake Reservoir & Rock Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, and Rock Creek Protective Association, contestants, v. Eilert Eilertson, contestee, was settled by stipulation to the effect that contestee shall have the right to use water from Rock Creek to irrigate 15 acres under priority date of 1901, and for mining purposes under priority date of 1900, and that any rights claimed by contestee for sale or power, said contestee shall secure additional permits as may be required by law at time such permits are secured, and such development undertaken. That in accordance with said stipulation, said dates are established in the tabulation herein. That the amount of water to be used for irrigation shall be governed by the general findings as to the duty of water. That the amount of water to be used for mining shall not exceed five second feet, which is the present maximum capacity of contestee's ditch. That the amount of water to be stored in any one year for irrigation shall not exceed thirty acre feet, and for mining shall not exceed seventy acre feet.

Contest #5. The City of Baker, a municipal corporation, contestant, v. Gardner & Stuchell, Fountain Seacat and Arthur Swift, contestees, was called for hearing on the 12th day of May, 1915, and contestees each appeared before the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, acknowledged the priority right of contestant and refused to appear further in this contest. It further appears that contestees were each served with notice of the hearing of such contest on the 25th day of March, 1914, and that the City of Baker has the following rights to the use of water: That in the year 1862, water rights for mining purposes were initiated and thereafter the Auburn Canal was constructed for the purpose of utilizing such water right. That the Auburn Canal diverts the waters of a number of streams beginning in the Swing of Sec. 34, Tp. 8 S. R. 38 E. W. M., at Goodrich Creek, diverting five second feet, thence said canal runs in a southeasterly direction and takes water from the following springs and streams in the following amounts: - Coyote Springs, 0.5 sec. ft; Little Mill Creek, 5.0 sec. ft; Big Mill

Creek, 5.0 sec. ft; Hawk Springs, 0.5 sec. ft; Little Marble Creek, 1.25 sec. ft; Big Marble Creek, 5.0 sec. ft; Campers Springs, 0.625 sec. ft; Herman Springs, 0.5 sec. ft; Big Salmon Creek, 5.0 sec. ft; Henry Springs, 0.625 sec. ft; Finley Springs, 0.625 sec. ft; Little Salmon Creek, 1.25 sec. ft; Slum Town Springs, 0.625 sec. ft; Rock Springs, 0.5 sec. ft; North Prong of Washington Gulch, 0.5 sec. ft; Middle Prong of Washington Gulch, 0.5 sec. ft; South Prong of Washington Gulch, 0.5 sec. ft; South Prong of Washington Gulch, 0.5 sec. ft; Comm Springs, 0.625 sec. ft; Byam Springs, 0.25 sec. ft. Elk Creek, 3.75 sec. ft; being a total of 39.25 second feet. That in the year 1862 and after the appropriation for the Auburn Camal, a water right was initiated through the Kelly Ditch for 6.25 second feet from Mill Creek, and 6.25 second feet from Merble Creek. That in 1868, a water right was initiated through the Nelson or Newton & Sturgill Ditch for 1.25 second feet from Gee Creek, 6.25 second feet from Marble Creek, 6.25 second feet from Marble Creek; that each of sain water rights were perfected and the water applied to beneficial use in placer mining and such use continued until the years 1899 to 1901, during which years, the Auburn Canal and the Nelson Ditch together with the water rights connected therewith were transferred to the City of Baker, who is the present owner thereof, and the Kelly Ditch and the water rights connected therewith were transferred to the City of Baker, who is the present owner thereof. That the City of Baker proceeded to change the use and the place of use of the waters under such water rights to municipal purposes. That in making such change it was necessary to expend large amounts of money and time, and during such time said city leased some of the ditches and rights for irrigation purposes. That said Pocahontas Mining & Irrights amounts of money and time, and during such time said city leased some of the ditches and rights for irrigation purposes. That said Pocahontas Mining & Irrigh

That since the purchase of the ditches and water rights by the City of Baker as aforesaid, and until the decision of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon in the case of Sherred vs. City of Baker, 63 Ore. 28, said city leased a part of the waters claimed under said water rights to the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch Company; that since said decision of the Supreme Court the City of Baker has not made any use of that part of the waters theretofore leased to said ditch company. That said City of Baker has, since the purchase of said water rights always used a part of said water; that all of the parties using water from said streams have at all times recognized the rights of the City of Baker as being prior to any of said water users, and all of the improvements upon all of their farms have been made under conditions created by such recognition in such rights. That the decision of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon in the case of Bowen et al. vs. Spaulding et al., 63 Ore. 392, and in the case of Sherred vs. Baker City, each recognized the right of the City of Baker as being absolute an Aprior to all others using water from said streams.

The amount of water as herein set forth as having been appropriated from the several streams for the water rights now owned by said City of Baker, is hereby reserved and expressly confirmed unto said City of Baker forever, as of the dates of priority as herein set forth.

That heretofore said Pocahontas Mining & Irrigation Company and said City of Baker made and entered into an agreement, in writing, respecting the water rights of Marble and Mill Creeks, wherein and whereby it was agreed that when water was used through said Auburn Canal that all the water rights above the intake of said canal should be long exclusively to said City of Baker. That when the water is not used through said canal, when the flow of water in said Marble Creek is under 500 miners inches, said water in Marble Creek shall be divided equally, and when the flow in Mill Creek is under 500 inches, miners measurement, said water in Mill Creek shall be divided equally, and so long as the flow in Marble Creek is over 500 inches, said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company shall

be entitled to the first 250 inches, and said City of Baker to the balance of the flow of said stream, and when the water is used through said Auburn Canal, except all the waters rising and flowing in said creeks below the intake of said canal, said Pocahontas Mining & Irrigation Company shall be entitled to the first 250 inches flowing in each of said Marble and Mill Creeks, and all above such amount shall belong to said City of Baker.

That said stipulation as to the rights of said City of Baker shall be given full force in the distribution of water, provided, that in no case shall the amount of water taken from said creeks exceed the amount of the appropriation from said Mill and Marble Creeks as hereinabove set forth.

16.

Contest #6. The City of Baker, a municipal corporation, contestant, v. Fred Cole and R. W. Littlefield, contestees, was stipulated to the effect that the contestant has the first and prior rights as against the contestees to the full flow of the waters of Elk Creek, and it appearing that the Cole & Littlefield appropriation was made as of date 1865 from Elk Creek, such appropriation was after the appropriation to which the City of Baker, the contestant, has succeeded in its rights as is more fully set out in Finding #15. It further appears that R. W. Littlefield has succeeded to the rights of D. S. Littlefield, as administrator.

17.

Contest #7. Fred Cole and Rufus W. Littlefield, as administrator of the Estate of David Littlefield, deceased, contestants, v. Bert

Spalding and W. B. Vaughn, contestees, was called for hearing, and at said time M. G. Haskall and O. M. Haskall petitioned to intervene in said hearing; that
insofar as said petition of intervention was attemted to contest the claims of the contestees herein, bert Spalding and W. B. Vaughn, such intervention is disallowed as the time for filing had expired. That as between the contestants and the contestees, and as between said contestants and said intervenors, a stipulation was entered into which said stipulation is to the effect that the contestants had a right to the use of the waters of Elk Creek to the extent of 150
inches of water, miners measurement under a six inch pressure, with a priority of 1865, and that said right to the use of such water was prior in time and
superior in right to that of the contestees, the intervenors, and it was further stipulated that said contestants should have and recover of the contestees
herein, their costs and disbursements in this suit in the sum of \$69.50, and that said contestants have judgment against said contestees for said sum.

18.

Contest #8. Henry H. Moody, Geo. M. Moody, Bertha Morrison, Dan W. Jones, Mrs. C. S. McCarty, Henry L. Zeigler, Carl C. Mason and C. S. Summers, successors to heirs of Charles and Zarissia Zeigler, deceased, contestants, v. Catherine D. Vernon, now Catherine D. Owens, contestee, was stipulated to the effect that contestants and each of them have rights to the use of the water of Little Eagle Creek, a tributary of Powder River, prior in time and superior in right to that of the contestee. That by said stipulation the dates of priority of said contestee has been waived, and the water shall be distributed by the water master in accordance with said stipulation, and this decree.

19.

Contest #9. City of Baker, a municipal corporation, contestant, v. John Steiger, Estate of Ferry Baisley, Hattie Baisley executrix, J. H. Baisley and S. B. Baisley, contestees, was stipulated to the effect that the contestant is the owner of the Auburn Capal and water rights appertaining thereto,

and the contestees are the owners of the Upper Never Sweat Ditch and Lower Never Sweat Ditch, and the water rights used through said ditches. That their predecessors in interest of said ditches and water rights settled their rights in a case in the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Oregon, entitled David McClure, Jr., complainant, vs. Moses Carpenter, defendant, and that the relative rights to the use of water through said ditches was thereby settled, and that said decree so settling said rights should determine the rights of said contestant and contestees. That the rights of said contestant as heretofore found in Finding #15, as to the use of water from Salmon Creek through said Auburn Canal, is prior in time and superior in right to the rights of the contestants herein, and the water shall be distributed in accordance therewith. It further appearing that contestee, John Steiger, was not served in said proceedings, contestant in open court dismissed said contest as to said John Steiger.

20.

Contest #10. Amos Gard, contestant, v. Ross Wilson and H. Van Nordheim, contestees, was stipulated to the effect that the contestant have a date of priority for the use of the waters of Beaver Creek or Willow Creek, prior im time to that of the contestees, and the tabulation hereinafter set forth shall so state this in accordance with said stipulation; and it further appearing that the contestant has heretofore used the water in the irrigation of his premises in a manner that such water finds its way into the channel of said creek, and said contestant has so agreed to use such water in the future in consideration of this stipulation, the water master shall distribute the water to said contestant under such date of priority so long as the use of such water by said contestant is carried on in said manner, and in case such use be not carried on in said manner, then and in that event should such use interfere with the use of water by said contestees, then the water shall be distributed first to said contestees, and then to said contestant.

21.

Contest #11. W. A. Green, J. O. Maxwell, H. K. Fisher, Asa L. Brown, W. L. Toney, Killamacue Lake Reservoir and Rock Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, and Rock Creek Protective Association, contestees, v. Hattie H. Olsen, C. J. Osborn and A. B. Ringling, contestants, was dismissed upon the motion of the contestants herein.

22.

Contest #12. Eastern Oregon Light & Power Company, a corporation, contestant, v. Frank Vanderwall, Frank Leonnig and Peter Poulson, contestees, was dismissed upon motion of contestant.

23.

Contest #13. W. A. Green, J. O. Maxwell, H. K. Fisher, Asa L. Brown, W. L. Toney, Killamacue Lake Reservoir & Rock Creek Irrigation Company, a corporation, and Rock Creek Protective Association, contestants, v. D. M. Cartmill, contestee, was dismissed upon motion of contestants.

24.

Contest #14. W. B. Vaughn & Bird Spaulding, co-partners as Spaulding & Vaughn, contestants, v. Ed Bowen, contestee, was stipulated to the effect that contestants and contestee shall each be entitled to sufficient waters of Elk Creek as of date of priority of 1872, for the irrigation of 67.3 acres of land each, said water to be divided at a point near where Elk Creek crosses the west line of Section 6, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M., and that all water in said Elk

Creek at said point in excess of a sufficient amount to irrigate said 67.3 acres by the contestants, and said 67.3 acres by the said contestee, may be used by the contestants, and that at any time the waters of said Elk Creek at said point of diversion are insufficient to irrigate 134.6 acres, such water shall be divided equally between the said contestants and said contestee at said point of diversion, and that the said contestee makes no further claim to any of the waters of said Elk Creek, prior in time to any of the contestant's rights, and the water master of the district shall distribute the waters of said Elk Creek to said contestants and said contestee, in accordance with said stipulation.

25.

Contest #15. W. B. Vaughn and Bird Spaulding, co-partners as Spaulding and Vaughn, contestents, v. W. L. Smith, contestee, was stipulated to the effect that the contestee's statements and proofs of claim for those ditches which date from 1875, 1876 and 1877 are correct, and that contestee is entitled to receive water in accordance with those dates for the lands described in said claims; that contestee's claim for the ditch under date of 1906 named upon contestee's map as Spaulding and Vaughn Ditch No. 1 is correct for the date and description of land; that in addition thereto, the parties at the time of the construction of said ditch agreed that the water taken through said ditch should be used only upon land lying below said ditch, and above any other ditch which the contestee might have, and said statement and proof of claim, with this addition, is hereby agreed to be correct, and said contestee shall take and receive water through said ditch in accordance with said claim and the agreement contained in this stipulation. That contestee's statement and proof of claim for water through the ditch named by contestee as the Logic Ditch, and by the contestants as the Culvertson Ditch, which said ditch takes water from Elk Greek in the 38½ of the 58½ of Section 34, Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E. W. M., and conducts the same to a point in the SW½ of the NB½. Section 1, Tp. 10 S. R. 39 E. W. M., shall be changed and amended in accordance with this stipulation, and the date of priority of 1891 which is claimed in said statement and proof of claim is hereby specifically relinquished, and it is agreed by and between the parties hereto, that said contestee shall have the right, subject at all times to the claims and rights of contestants as evidenced herein by their statements and proofs of claim, to take sufficient of the surplus waters of Elk Creek for the irrigation of five acres in the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter, 7 acres in the SW‡ of the NB½ and eight acres in the SB½ of the NB½ of Section 1, Tp. 10 S. R. 39 E. W.

Contest #16. W. C. Hawk, J. E. Bacon, and J. E. Bacon administrator, contestants, v. J. L. Yantis, contestee, was stipulated to the effect that the contestee should have sufficient of the waters of Deer Creek, a tributary of Powder River to irrigate fifty acres as of the date of priority of 1879, and 104.2 acres as of the date of priority of 1887. That the contestant, J. E. Bacon, personally, and as administrator, should have sufficient of the waters of Deer Creek to irrigate 160 acres, as of the priority date of 1886, and that contestant, W. C. Hawk, should have sufficient of the waters of Deer Creek to irrigate twenty acres as of the date of 1880, and 53 acres as of the priority date of 1888, and that the proofs of W. C. Hawk relative to the waters of Noyes and Minor Creeks should be taken as established in accordance with said proof, and the tabulation hereinafter contained shall set out the rights of said parties in accordance with said contest.

Contest #17. G. F. Gardner, contestant, v. Fountain Seacat and Henrietta Seacat, husband and wife, A. V. Swift, Edna Stuchell, D. F. Indermuhl, Ida F. Lachner, and Mary S. Gardner, contestees, is settled by finding #13.

28.

Contest #18. Eastern Oregon Light & Power Company, a corporation, contestant, v. Thomas Leffler and Frank Steward, contestees, was stipulated to the effect that contestee Frank Steward is entitled to use twenty miners inches of water through the Chase Ditch, each and every year up to and including the 15th day of July. That after said date said contestee shall divert no water through said Chase Ditch or Chase Ditch #1, nor through any ditches between contestant's diversion plant and its power plant, except such water as contestees may have a right to use through what is known as the Olsen Ditch, which right is not in dispute in this contest, and nothing shall in any wise effect said right. Whenever the said diversion may interfere with or diminish the waters of Rock Creek by said contestant, and after said date of each year, said contestant shall not be compelled to allow any water to pass through its diversion dam for either of said ditches, provided, however, that contestee shall have a right at all times to use such waters as arise in said stream below the diversion dam of said contestant. It was further stipulated as to the contestee, Thos. Leffler, that all of the rights of said Thos. Leffler to the use of the waters of Rock Creek was inferior in right to that of the contestant, and that the date of priority of said Thos. Leffler should be 1906. That the tabulation hereinafter set forth shall fix the dates according to this finding, and the water master shall distribute the water in accordance herewith.

29.

Contest #19. Harlow J. Evans, Heman B. Jordan, Mary B. Jordan, John Steiger, J. W. Adams, Wm. T. Buchaman, Martha Buchaman, W. A. Buchaman, Pansy Buchaman, and Hattie Baisley, Executrix of the Estate of Perry Baisley, decessed, contestants, vs. Pocahontas Parmer's Diton Company, a corporation, contestee. Was heard, and the parties hereto offered evidence and all of the testimony was taken down, reported and filed herein, and it appearing that the lands irrigated by the parties hereto are situated at the foot of the Powder River mountains, west of the City of Baker, and from the numerous canyons of said mountains and from the bases thereof, flow numerous streams and numerous serings; that Mill Creek is situated farthest north of said creeks in question, and is sometimes known as Waggie Creek, then Marble Creek in the center of the district, and Salmon Creek the farthest south in said district. That the waters of Mill, Marble and Salmon Creeks, together with the springs that rise along the side hills, have been heretofore used by the irrigators in this district; that all of the water of Mill Creek can be turned into Marble Creek, and all of the water of Marble Creek, one be turned into Marble Creek, and all of the water of Marble Creek, and all of the water of Marble Creek, as the irrigators may desire, is located below the Nelson Ditch, but above all of the irrigated lands of said stream; that the waters of Marble Creek can be turned into Salmon Creek at what is known as Kelley Slough, and at a point below where Mill Creek can be turned into Marble Creek, and just above the Evans place. That such method of use has been carried on since irrigation began to be followed to any extent in this district. That the ontestants, Harlow J. Evans, Heman B. Jordan and Mary E. Jordan, have a water right out of Mill, Marble and Salmon Creeks for 128.7 scres with a priority date of 1875, and 5.72 acres with a priority date of 1867, and out of Mill or Waggie Creek for 20 acres of a priority date of 1867, and out of Salmon Creek

or Waggie Creek, under date of 1867 for 40 acres, with a right to irrigate 80 acres during the high water period from said creek in April and May. From the Spring Creek rising on the Stores of Sec. 33, for 80 acres with a priority date of 1867. From Salmon Creek for the whole Swtof Sec. 34 with a priority date of 1880, and for the NEt of Sec. 3, Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E., the water right shall be with a priority date of 1867 from Salmon Creek, Spring Creek, and seepage and springs located in the Nt of Swtof Section 3. That W. A. Buchanan and Pansy Buchanan have a water right from Salmon Creek for 20 acres as of the date 1871, and 14 acres as of the date 1873. That W. T. Buchanan and Martha Buchanan have a water right from Salmon Creek for 20 acres as of the date of 1871, and 18 acres as of the date of 1873. That the Estate of Perry Baisley has a water right from Salmon Creek for 75 acres as of the date of 1864, and from Salmon Creek, sloughs, Waggie or Mill Creek and Spring Creek for 365 acres as of the date of 1867, and 190 acres as of the date 1898.

That the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch Company delivers water to its stockholders, and such water is taken from Mill, Marble and Goodrich Creeks under date of 1906; that for some of the stock holders the water is used as a supplemental supply, while for others, it is used as of that date; that State Engineer's Permit No. 1339, for the same lands, does not work an abandonment of the rights theretofore acquired. The stockholders and water users from the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch Company are as follows: A. Caviness has a water right from Salmon Creek and Hibberd Creek for 68 acres as of the date 1866; 5.28 acres as of the date 1906, with a supplemental supply from Pocahontas Farmers Ditch with a priority date of 1906 for all the lands. John H. Lew has a water right from Hibberd and Salmon Creeks for 62 acres as of the date 1866, and 11.28 acres as of the date 1906, with a supplemental supply from Pocahontas Farmers Ditch with a priority date of 1906 for all the lands. A. N. Young has his whole water right for all of his water from the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch as of the date 1906. J. M. Masters has a water right for water from certain springs and seepage on his own land, and upon the lands of A. N. Young for 165 acres as of the date 1872, and 75 acres as of the date 1906, with a supplemental supply from Pocahontas Farmers Ditch with a priority date of 1906 for all the lands. The lands of G. F. Gardner and J. W. Adams have all their rights from the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch as of the date 1906. That Fountain Seacat has a water right SW NW, Sec. 11, Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E. W. M., and also a water right through the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch for 120 acres with a priority date of 1906, for the land described in the tabulation under the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch, 16 acres of which is an original water right and the balance of the 120 acres is supplemental the water from such ditch only as a supplemental supply, under a priority date of 1906. The lands of D. F. Indermuhl use the waters from said ditch for a supplemental supply for that part of the lands described as SE SW., Sec. 2, Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E. W. M., and is an original right for 50 acres as of the date 1906 as tabulated under the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch.

That Mill Creek is a tributary of Salmon Creek and enters Salmon Creek in the SW NE Of Sec. 35, Tp. 8 S. R. 39 E. W. M., which is upon the lands of the Estate of Perry Baisley. That Marble Creek is a tributary of Salmon Creek and enters Salmon Creek in the NE Of Section 4, Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E. W. M., upon the lands of Evans & Jordan.

That no appropriation of water from Salmon Creek above the point where any tributary joins Salmon Creek appropriated any of the waters of such tributary by reason of the conveyance of waters of such tributary by mining ditches and discharging the water into Salmon Creek above the diversion point

of such appropriation. That in the distribution of water, the water master shall establish such a system of rotation as will best serve all the irrigators, having regard for all rights.

Contest #20. Andy Augustus, David T. Allen, C. E. Barber, W. E. Barber, M. E. Beck, W. T. Bennehoff, E. A. Bennehoff, George Binheimer, Susie Binheimer, Rachel Bradford, Eugene Brown, H. T. Babcock, Cora M. Blue, J. W. Carnahan, Eugene Chandler, Bertha Corsen, John Chapman, David H. Conrad, C. H. Craig, Ianthus Chandler, David Clark, Charles Coble, T. A. Cobb, George W. Coble, M. J. Cropp, W. C. Cundiff, G. A. Davis, J. A. Davis, W. J. Densley, Eleanor Duffey, Ascenith Evans, George W. Evans, Eagle Valley Cemetery Association, Eagle Valley Cannery, a corporation, John Fraser, Medora L. Givens, Rebecca Gover, W. L. Gover, Walter A. Gover, O. A. Gover, Julia Gibson, George W. Gorden, Leonard Goss, J. P. Halley, Amelia Hartley, Joseph Hartley, Candace E. Holcomb, Corintha E. Holcomb, J. N. Holcomb, Charles A. Howell, Jennie Healey, L. M. Healey, F. G. Hewitt, Howell Ditch Company, a corporation, Dry Gulch Ditch Company, a corporation, Nash Ditch Company, a corporation, Waterbury and Allen Ditch Company, a corporation, F. G. Jasper, W. C. Jasper, Fannie Jennings, George W. Jones, Laura A. Jones, Alberta Kendall, Oscar Kendall, Mary Kirby, W. W. Kirby, Paul Knoblauch, Mary Long, Minnie E. Martin, R. A. Masterson, P. A. Moody, Henry H. Moody, George M. Moody, Orson Moody, T. L. Morris, M. H. Mulvahill, Charles W. Perry, John B. Perry, D. A. Phillips, D. A. Rinard, Laura A. Saunders, G. B. Saunders, Sam Q. Saunders, W. G. Saunders, W. S. Saunders, I. N. Saunders, successor of R. J. Kitchen, School District #44, successor of L. G. Morgan, Charles W. Scott, D. N. Strayer, Pete Sass, C. C. St. John, E. N. Shoemaker, Mary J. Simonis, Ella Stone, J. L. Stone, Elmer Schultz, J. W. Sharp, George Sharpan, Pearl Siber, Emma Sullivan, Eugene Sullivan, W. E. Summers, heirs at law of Sam Gover, deceased, heirs at law of H. P. Swisher, deceased, Frank Thompson, Emma Thompson, Joel O. Tuttle, W. R. Usher, Virginia A. Usher, Mat Welter, Leonard Williams, Henry Williams, W. P. Williams, Fannie H. Wright, J. T. Wright, W. B. Wright, Winter Wright, I. N. Young, Henry L. Zeigler, Sam Summers, successors of heirs at law of Charles and Zarissia K. Zeigler, deceased, E. A. Whittier, Jasper Thompson, and St. Elizabeth's Hospital, a corporation, contestants, vs. George Grant, Trustee, contestee. Was stipulated to the effect that the contestee should take all of the waters awarded it in these proceedings from West Eagle Creek and the natural tributaries thereof flowing into said stream above the head of what is known as the Sparta Ditch, and any and all of the feeders of said Sparta Ditch, heretofore and now feeding said ditch. And it appearing that the contestee is the successor in interest, and owner of the water right used in connection with the Sparta & Hoagum Ditches; that in 1863 water was appropriated and thereafter used through the Hoagum Ditch, and that in November 1870, William H. Packwood and Alex Stewart posted a notice on Eagle Creek appropriating 3,000 inches of water for what is known now as the Sparta Ditch. That thereafter the Sparta Ditch was surveyed, and on the 11th day of May, 1871, construction of said ditch was begun and water was run through said ditch to the town of Sparta, Oregon, on the 14th day of October, 1871. That said appropriation was for domestic, mechanical, mining and irrigation purposes. That upon the completion of said ditch, there was at one time 800 miners inches of water delivered to the water users out of said ditch, and the diversion of water into said ditch, at the time same was used to full capacity, was between 1,000 and 1,500 inches. That in 1871 the Hoagum Ditch was extended to empty its waters into the Sparta Ditch, and was purchased by the owners of said Sparta Ditch at said time. That thereafter, and until the present time, said Hoagum Ditch has been used as a feeding ditch to said Sparta Ditch, and especially for the purpose of running water into said Sparta Ditch which would be picked up by said Hoagum Ditch from the melting snows during the spring thaws, and from the canyons that flowed water during that thaw, and this use was especially made at a time when the head of the Sparta Ditch and of the Hoagum Ditch were not thawed out so as to permit the diversion of water from the creek. That the early flow of the waters picked up in said thaw by said Sparta Ditch and said Hoagum Ditch, furnished a

sufficient amount of water to supply said Sparta Ditch, until the heads of the ditches were thawed out, and that thereupon the water would be diverted from the head of said ditch. That from the building of said ditch, until 1914, the water of said Sparta Ditch was sold each year by the owners thereof, for the purposes of domestic, mining, power and irrigation use. That beginning with the year 1915, the owners of said ditch proposed to apply the water from said ditch partly upon the lands described in the tabulation hereinafter, amounting to 1500 acres; that 750 miners inches of water delivered on the land is sufficient to irrigate the lands proposed to be irrigated. That the change of use of water from sale for domestic, mining, power and irrigation use, to an irrigation use, does not infringe upon the rights of any other water users from Eagle Creek, and in making said change said George Grant, Trustee, and the Water Users from said Sparta Ditch have the right to use a reasonable time for making said change without losing their date of priority. That five years is such a reasonable time, and the lands to be irrigated in making such change shall be tabulated herein under the head of inchoate rights.

31.

Contest #21. Earl F. Cranston and A. N. Ingle, contestants, vs. Geo. Grant, Trustee, contestee, was settled by a decree in the Circuit
Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, in a suit wherein the Sparta Irrigation Company, a corporation, was plaintiff, and E. P. Cranston and
A. N. Ingle were defendants. That a certified copy of said decree was filed in these proceedings. That the Sparta Irrigation Company is the successor in interest
of Geo. Grant, Trustee, am owns the Sparta Ditch in Baker County, Oregon, and that part of the Hoagum Ditch extending from a point on the West Fork of Eagle
Creek, near the Southeast corner of Sec. 8, Tp. 6 S. R. 43 E. W. M., to a point where the water as conducted in said ditch is diverted into Glendenning Creek,
and thence down said Glendenning Creek into Sparta Ditch. That said Cranston and Ingle own said Hoagum Ditch from said Glendenning Creek to a point from which
the quarter section corner on the north line of Sec. 3 Tp. 7 S. R. 43 E. W. M., bears north 56° 30' west, 1401 feet distant. That all of that part of said
Hoagum Ditch below said point belongs to said Sparta Irrigation Company. That said decree found that 750 miners inches of water, under a six inch pressure,
delivered at the place of use, was sufficient water to irrigate the lands of the stockholders of said Sparta Ditch Company. That said Sparta Ditch is 30 miles
in length; that the seepage in said ditch would be great. That a reasonable seepage to be allowed said Sparta Ditch would be about 250 miners inches. That the
water master of the district shall allow for seepage in the distribution of water, such an amount as ach seepage aggregates, not to exceed 250 miners inches.

That the stockholders and water users from said Sparta Ditch Company are: F. W. Tallmadge, L. W. Tallmadge, Maud E. Boyd, Arthur S. Boyd, P. T. Wyatt and W. A. Wyatt, and the land to be irrigated is described in the tabulation hereinafter set forth under Inchoate Rights.

Contest #22. Geo. Chandler, S. Osborn, Clayton Coleman, Orin Osborn, G. H. Perkins, heirs of E. P. Perkins, J. P. Evans, Harvey Harrison, Bent Landreth, Carl Parker, administrator of the Estate of Johnathan Parker, deceased, Thos. Kirkby, William Elliott, Earl Stephenson, Ed York, Eppinger Brothers, Mrs. M. Harrington, Mary Cranston and Fred Cranston, Administrator, substituted for Herbert Cranston, deceased, defendants," was filed with the claims of the claimants to the waters of Balm Creek. That the Balm Creek Orchard Company is the successor in interest to the Meadows Irrigation Service Company, and that Claude E. Bennett is the successor in interest to J. H. B. Harrington and Grace G. Harrington. That at the time the said decree was entered, said decree involved all of the water users of Balm Creek and its tributaries. That a decree of default was taken against Don Daley and Jessie Daley. That there has been filed herein a claim by Lawrence Daley for waters from Balm Creek. That it does not appear that Lawrence Daley is the successor in interest to Don Daley and Jessie Daley, but the date of priority claimed by said Lawrence Daley is 1906, and said date of priority is a later date than the dates of priority of all the other water users, and therefore it is immaterial to consider Lawrence Daley in this finding.

Lulu Phillips further filed a claim for waters from Balm Creek, claiming a date of priority of 1890; the lend described in said claim was involved and decreed a water right in said decree, and so far as the claim of said Lulu Phillips shows, said land was not irrigated until 1911 and Lulu Phillips will therefore be given the latest date of priority in said decree. Said decree defined the water rights of the parties thereto as follows: J. H. E. Harrington and Grace G. Harrington the first right of 50 miners inches; Fred A. Phillips the second right of 50 miners inches; Claude E. Bennett and Agnes Beanett the third right of 25 miners inches; Claude E. Bennett and Agnes Beanett the sixth right of 45 miners inches; Fred A. Phillips, J. H. B. Harrington and Grace G. Harrington the seventh right, jointly, of 50 miners inches; E. P. Cranston and Lena Cranston the eighth right of 50 miners inches; the Estate of Herbert Cranston and Mary Cranston the ninth right of 25 miners inches; Margaret Hulick the tenth right of 25 miners inches, and the Meadows Irrigation Service Company the eleventh right of 40 miners inches. The balance of the water was to be given to Fred A. Phillips, J. H. B. Harrington and Grace G. Harrington, jointly, for the first 50 miners inches as the twelfth right; then would follow in order, E. P. Cranston and Lena Cranston for 50 miners inches; the Estate of Herbert Cranston and Mary Cranston 25 miners inches; Margaret Hulick 25 miners inches, and the Meadows Irrigation Service Company 40 miners inches.

Such decree settles the order of priority of said water users, and as there are no other water users upon the creek, or lower down upon Powder River, into which said creek flows which can interfere with the rights of the parties to the use of water, the tabulation hereinafter shall set forth the dates in such order of priority beginning with the Harrington's first right of 50 miners inches, in the year 1878; by so doing, it is found that the ninth right in said decree, wherein the Estate of Herbert Cranston and Mary Cranston is given 25 miners inches is not necessary for the irrigation of the land of said Estate of Herbert Cranston and Mary Cranston and Mary Cranston.

It further appears that the general finding herein as to the duty of water will give said land a sufficient water supply to irrigate the same sufficiently. It further appears that the division of the balance of the water as shown by said decree is not necessary for any of the land except that of Fred A. Phillips and Lulu Phillips and the Harrington right, now owned by C. E. Bennett, and in accordance with said decree said rights shall be enumerated as follows:

Claude E. Bennett, for himself and as successor to J. H. B. Harrington and Grace G. Harrington, shall have a priority date of 1878, for sufficient water to

That the Estate of Herbert Cranston and Mary Cranston shall have a priority date of 1891 for sufficient water to irrigate 90.5 acres.

That Lena Cranston shall have a priority date of 1896 for sufficient water to irrigate 91 acres.

That Margaret Hulick shall have a priority date of 1897 for sufficient water to irrigate 58 acres.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Oregon, in the case wherein David McClure, Jr., was complainant, and Moses Carpenter was defendant, was filed with the claims of the Perry Baisley Estate and those of the Baisley owners who use the Upper Never Sweat and Lower Never Sweat Ditches, wherein the owners of the Auburn Canal were decreed a prior right for 350 miners inches of water, or 8.75 second feet. That the City of Baker has succeeded to the rights of plaintiff, David McClure, Jr., and the said Perry Baisley Estate, J. H. Baisley, Hattie Baisley and S. B. Baisley have succeeded to the interests of Moses Carpenter, defendant, and it appearing by said decree that the said Auburn Canal was constructed in the year 1863, the rights to the use of water through the Auburn Canal by said City of Baker shall be of the date of priority of 1863. And it appearing by said decree that the date of priority of said Baisleys is later than said date, said Baisleys shall have a date of priority of not earlier than 1864, but in all cases shall be governed as to the date by the diligence of putting the water to a beneficial use.

84.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, in the suit of George Mitchell, plaintiff, v. S. E. Baisley, defendant, was filed herein with the claim of S. B. Baisley, am it appears by said decree that the waters of Hibbard Creek were involved therein, am that the defendant, S. B. Baisley was given the prior right to the use of said waters. It appears that the successor in interest to the use of said waters of the plaintiff, George Mitchell, are the Heirs of J. H. Lew, E. J. Lew, John H. Lew, and A. Caviness. The successors in interest to the rights of the defendant are S. B. Baisley and J. H. Baisley. That the Baisleys claim the right as of the priority date of 1869 from Hibbard Creek; that the Heirs of John H. Lew, E. J. Lew, and John H. Lew claim the rights from said Hibbard Creek, dating from 1864, 1870 and 1903. That A. Caviness claims the right from said creek under date of 1906, and in accordance with said decree and in order to give the successors of defendant in said suit the prior right, we have placed the priority dates of the Heirs of John H. Lew as 1870 out of

said creek, and the rights of E. J. Lew with a priority date of 1870; the rights of John H. Lew with a priority date of 1870 and 1903, and A. Caviness with a priority date of 1896.

It further appears that said J. H. Baisley and S. B. Baisley, besides irrigating land from said stream, use some of the waters for storage and thereafter irrigate with the same, and such storage rights shall have the same date as the irrigation rights.

35.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker on the mandate of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, in the suit of J. C. Bowen and E. C. Bowen, respondents and cross appellants, vs. Bird Spaulding and W. B. Vaughn, respondents and cross appellants, Mary E. Smith and W. L. Smith, appellants, Baker City, a municipal corporation, F. Franklin and E. O. Haskell, respondents, was filed herein with the Statement and Proof of claim of the City of Baker. It appears from said decree that said City of Baker has established a prior right to all the parties to said suit for the use of the waters of Elk Creek, and it further appearing that the claims of all of said other parties in said suit, set dates of priority subsequent to the dates of priority claimed by said City of Baker, such dates of priority established in the tabulation hereinafter set forth, so establishes the priority dates in accordance with said decree.

86.

That a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, in the suit wherein R. R. Palmer and H. E. Denham were plaintiffs, v. Geo. A. Richardson, Homer Gilliam, W. S. Metsker, Lucy Burden, Victor Nault, G. A. Conrad, Dan Stephenson, D. W. Holman, Chas. Ebell, Cleveland Ebell, Hugo Ebell, Della Ebell, Clara Ebell, Cecil Ebell, Armond Ebell, heirs at law of August Ebell, deceased; S. B. Willet and Minnie L. Willet, John Ingram, Ora M. Bennett, Elmer E. Pennett, and E. E. Bennett, administrator of the Estate of Nathan Pennett, deceased, defendants, was filed in connection with the claims of those parties whom said decree affects. It appears to the State Water Board that Sutton Creek is a tributary of Powder River, and that the plaintiffs, R. R. Palmer and H. E. Denham own lands upon Sutton Creek, and said lands are so located that said Palmer and Denham have access not only to Sutton Creek, but also to a tributary of Sutton Creek known as Ebell Creek, or East Sutton Creek. That said decree determines that said Palmer and Denham shall have a right prior to the right of all the defendants for the use of water upon what is known as the McCullough place, but that for the use of water out of East Sutton Creek or Ebell Creek, said Palmer and Denham shall have no priority rights prior to any of the defendants who use water out of gaid Ebell Creek.

That all of the parties to said suit or their successors in interest appeared in these proceedings, except W. S. Metsker who owned the E¹/₂ of Section 24 and the E¹/₂ of Section 25, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M.; that said decree denied any use of water to said Metsker, and that not proving appeared in these proceedings, default is hereby entered against him. That said Palmer and Denham shall have a priority date of 1873 for the irrigation of the lands in the E¹/₂ of SE¹/₄, NW¹/₄ SE¹/₄ and the SW¹/₄ NE¹/₄; Sec. 12, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M., and shall have a priority date of 1886 for 21 acres of the lands irrigated in the N¹/₂ of NE¹/₄, and the SE¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Sec. 13, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M., and for the balance of said land shall have a priority date of 1907. Said water shall be for such priority dates from Sutton Creek.

It further appears that the parties who irrigate out of East Sutton or Ebell Creek have priorities from 1872 to 1905, and by said decree said Palmer and Denham can only use water from said East Sutton or Ebell Creek, after each of said parties have finished their irrigation, and the Board hereby

establishes 1906 as the date of priority for said Palmer and Denham to use water out of said East Sutton or Ebell Creek. That such use of water out of said Ebell or East Sutton Creek for said Palmer and Denham is a supplemental supply for the lands irrigated in Sections 12 and 13.

That Lucy Burden shall have a priority date of 1879 for the lands irrigated by her in Section 36, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M.

That Homer Gilliam shall have a priority date of 1883 for the lands irrigated by him in Sec. 13, Tp. 10 S. R. 40 E. W. M., and Victor Nault shall have a priority date of 1883 for the lands irrigated in Sec. 1, Tp. 11 S. R. 40 E. W. M., and Sec. 6, Tp. 11 S. R. 41 E. W. M., and when the water which is available for said date of 1883 is not sufficient to give said Homer Gilliam and said Victor Nault such a supply of water as they desire under the general findings as to the duty of water in these proceedings, then the water available for said priority date of 1883 shall be divided between said Homer Gilliam and said Victor Nault in the proportion of 65% to Homer Gilliam, and 35% to said Victor Nault.

That G. A. Conrad shall have a priority date of 1908 for the lands irrigated in Section 6, Tp. 11 S. R. 41 E. W. M.

That as to the water from East Sutton or Ebell Creek, the Ebell Heirs shall have a priority date of 1872.

That Dan Stephenson shall have a priority date of 1879, and Minnie L. Willet and her husband Sam B. Willet, shall have a priority date of 1886.

That Charles Howry shall have a priority date of 1888. Ora M. Bennett and Elmer E. Bennett, and the Estate of Nathan Bennett, deceased, shall have a priority date of 1904, and have built a reservoir in Sec. 8, Tp. 11 S. R. 41 E. W. M. for the purpose of storing water for the irrigation of their lands, and that under said diversion all of the parties hereto have waived any priority for the storing of said water in said reservoir after the irrigating season has closed in each year, up to and including the 15th day of April of the next year, and after the 15th day of April of each year; and during the irrigating season thereafter of each year said Bennetts shall permit such a quantity of water to flow from said reservoir in the channel of the stream from where said reservoir is situated, as flows into said reservoir from any and all sources, less 10% thereof, as an allowance for natural loss, when needed for use by appropriators with priorities prior to 1908, and said Bennetts shall therefore have a priority date of 1908 for the storage of water. That said decree mentions John Ingran Ranch, but that the description thereof is not sufficient to determine whether the same is included in these proceedings or not, and therefore the State Water Board finds that the same is not included.

That the lands irrigated by each of the parties to said decree herein mentioned are set forth in the tabulation hereinafter set out.

87.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, in the case wherein A. H. Brown and Winslow H. Bowen were plaintiffs, and Augustus George was defendant, was filed with the claim of Asa L. Brown. That by said decree the priorities of the parties thereto was established for the waters of Villow Creek as follows, to-wit: A. H. Brown the first right to 60 miners inches; August George the second right to 25 miners inches; A. H. Brown the third right to 60 miners inches; Winslow H. Bowen the fourth right to 186 miners inches; A. H. Brown the fifth right to 75 miners inches; Winslow H. Bowen and Augustus George the sixth right to 264 miners inches in equal proportion.

It appears that Asa L. Brown is the successor in interest to A. H. Brown for the N\frac{1}{2} of the SV\frac{1}{2} and the SV\frac{1

That Clark benson is the successor in interest to A. H. brown in the NW NE of said Section 2, but that said Clark benson does not claim any of the waters out of Willow Creek, and has therefore waived any rights to the waters of Willow Creek for said land.

That J. H. Ensminger is the successor in interest to Augustus George for the NEL NWL of Section 3, said township and range, but said

fore
Ensminger only claims water from Rock Creek, and there, has waived any rights to waters from Willow Creek.

That blanche McCullough is the successor in interest to Augustus weorge in the N\frac{1}{2} of NE\frac{1}{4} and SW\frac{1}{4} NE\frac{1}{4} said Section 3, and irrigates therein 118 acres of land.

That John Richmond is the successor in interest to Winslow H. Bowen for the SE NET said Section 3, and the NT NWT and all that part of the ST of NWT lying north of Willow Creek in said Section 2, and irrigates therein 108.5 acres of land.

That W. A. Green is the successor in interest to Winslow H. Bowen in the SW2 and all that part of the S2 of the NW2 lying south of Willow Creek, in said Section 2, and irrigates therein 77 acres of land.

That said decree establishes the priorities of the parties thereto as to their needs at that time, but that the amount of water necessary to irrigate the land is now found to be as set forth in these findings, by a general finding upon the duty of water, and the water shall be distributed upon the lands described herein accordingly, as to the duty of water.

The claim of Asa L. Brown claims 143 acres irrigated from Willow Creek since October 12, 1864; the claim of Blanche Coullough shows that 60 acres were irrigated from Willow Creek since 1884, 58 acres since 1904; the claim of John Richmond shows that 15 acres were irrigated from 1864, 27 acres from 1882, and 37 acres from 1884, and 37 acres from 1905; the claim of W. A. Green shows that 52 acres were irrigated from 1862, 25 acres from 1899. The claim of Blanche Coullough therefore shows that any rights secured in Right 40. 2, defined in said decree for Augustus George, has been abandoned by reason of failure to use the water, as the time from 1866 to 1884 is an unreasonable length of time for the non-usage of water. We therefore find that from the usage of water since that decree, the dates of priority shall be as follows for the use of water from Willow Creek by said parties: Asa L. Brown, 1864, 60 acres; 1869, 60 acres; 1883, 23 acres. Blanche McCullough, 1884, 60 acres; 1904, 58 acres. John Richmond, 1882, 71 acres; 1905, 37½ acres. W. A. Green, 1882, 52 acres; 1899, 25 acres, and the water shall be distributed therein accordingly.

88.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Cregon for the County of Baker, in the suit wherein Asa L. Brown, A. H. Prown and R. H. Prown were plaintiffs, and L. B. Faker and Minnie Baker were defendants, was also filed in these proceedings with the claim of Asa L. Brown. That by said decree it appears that the plaintiffs were granted a superior right to the use of the waters of Willow Creek over the defendants. It further appears that the successor in interest to said defendants is J. S. Culbertson, who was duly notified of these proceedings and not having appeared is therefore in default. That the rights of the plaintiffs and their successors in interest have been duly defined in the tabulation herein contained, and shall have as therein set forth.

Brown was defendant, involving the waters of Love Creek, was filed in these proceedings with the claims of the parties thereto. By said decree it appears that the plaintiffs were given a priority right for 45 inches of water measured at the south end of the first flume in plaintiff's ditch, and that the defendant shall have the next right for 15 miners inches of water and that the plaintiff shall have the right to all the balance of the water flowing in Love Creek.

It further appears from the Findings of Fact in said suit that there is a spring arising upon the premises of the defendant, but which said defendant uses and is entitled to the whole flow of said spring. It appears from the claim of the defendant filed herein that he claims a priority date of April 1900, and that he uses water from the East Fork of Love Creek and from Glasgow Creek, and that he irrigates 42 acres. The said Mike Prown under said decree shall therefore be limited to 15 miners inches of water with a diversion as of the priority date of 1900 from the East Fork of Love Creek, and the balance of the water necessary for the irrigation of said 42 acres of land shall be taken as of the date of 1900 from Glasgow Creek, and from the springs arising upon the place of Mike Prown, to which said Mike Brown is entitled to the exclusive use.

It further appears from the claim that P. L. Kelley irrigates 68.5 acres of land and claims a date of Nov. 15, 1889. That said P. L. Kelley shall have the right to divert water from the East and West Forks of Love Creek as of the date November 15, 1889, for sufficient water for the irrigation of said 68.5 acres of land, provided, that a diversion of not more than 45 miners inches of water be made for the supplying of the appropriations of said N. C. Love and said P. L. Kelley, prior to the appropriation of said Mike prown. That it does not appear in these proceedings as to how said 45 miners inches of water shall be divided between said N. C. Love and said P. L. Kelley, and that such 45 inches of water shall hereafter be divided accordingly as said parties may agree.

It further appears that Floyd E. Love and Helen Love are the successors in interest to a part of the land owned by N. C. Love and P. L. Kelley at the time of the said suit, but it does not appear as to what the division of said water shall be. From the claims of said N. C. Love, it does not appear that said N. C. Love claims any of the water of Love Creek under said decree. It further appears that said Floyd E. Love and Helen Love who have succeeded to a part of the lands of N. C. Love and P. L. Kelley, claim to irrigate from the West Fork of Love Creek through the Love Reservoir, and that said suit involved the East Fork of Love Creek.

Said Floyd E. Love and Helen Love shall therefore have no right to divert any of the water from the East Fork of Love Creek prior to said Mike Brown, and the amount of water diverted by either of the parties hereto shall be governed by the general finding as to the duty of water herein, and rules and regulations of the water master as to rotation.

90.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for Baker County in a suit wherein C. A. Carrothers was plaintiff, and E. R. Johnson was defendant, was filed herein, involving the waters of Powder River, and by said decree the use of the water in the ditch by said plaintiff and said defendant was agreed to be divided, one-fourth to the defendant, and three-fourths to the plaintiff. It appearing to the Board by the claims of the plaintiff and defendant, that the plaintiff irrigates 87 acres of land with a priority date of 1906; that the defendant irrigates 30 acres of land with a priority date of 1908. That said decree was entered upon stipulation and its priorities existing were therefore waived, and water shall be distributed to said plaintiff and said defendant through said ditch in accordance with said decree, giving to the defendant one-fourth of the water, and to the plaintiff three-fourths of the water, provided, that in no event shall more water than either of the parties need be distributed to them through said ditch, and the needs of said parties for the use of said water shall be

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Baker County, wherein Arthur Oliver was plaintiff, and John Erwin was defendant, involving the waters of Tucker Creek was filed in these proceedings, and it appears from said decree that the water in said Tucker Creek is to be divided equally at the head of said defendant's ditch, on the John Hulick lands, share and share alike between said plaintiff and defendant, for irrigation, stock and domestic purposes, provided, that when the whole flow of said Tucker Creek is only sufficient for stock purposes, then the whole natural flow of said creek shall be permitted to flow down its natural channel and plaintiff and defendant shall have the right to use the same for stock purposes as it flows through or upon their respective lands. It further appears from the claims filed herein, that John Irwin irrigates 38 acres of land from Tucker Creek, and Arthur Oliver irrigates 135 acres of land from Tucker Creek; that of the land irrigated by John Erwin from Tucker Creek, that 16 acres thereof in NW2 NW2 of Section 16, Tp. 8 S. R. 42 E. W. M., is also irrigated from Powder River, and that of the lands irrigated by Arthur Oliver, all of the same are also irrigated from Powder River.

That the dates of priority of both parties for irrigating said land from Powder River is 1888. That the claims show the date of priority for the irrigation of said lands from Tucker Creek as 1875, for John Erwin, and 1876 for Arthur Oliver, and that said decree makes said dates of priority equal, and therefore the State Water Board fixes 1876 as the date of priority of both parties.

That in accordance with said decree, said water shall be divided share and share alike between said plaintiff and defendant at the head of defendant's ditch on the John Hulick lands, provided, however, that no more water shall be turned to said defendant through his said ditch, than is necessary for the irrigation of his lands as to the duty of water, and provided further, that when there is only sufficient water for stock purposes in said creek, the whole natural flow shall be permitted to flow down its natural channel, and the parties hereto shall have the right to use the same during such time for stock purposes as the same flows in its natural channel.

92.

has a water right with a priority date of 1909.

That the lands claimed to be irrigated by Eva J. Cartmill as set forth in the tabulation hereinafter contained, have a water right with a priority date of 1864; that the lands claimed to be irrigated by Geo. M. Caviness and Emma Caviness as set forth in the tabulation hereinafter contained, have a water right with a priority date of 1866, for 25 inches of water from Pine Creek, and it appears from their claim that they have also used water from Spring Creek, and the balance of the water necessary for the irrigation of their land shall be diverted from Spring Creek as of the same date.

That James W. Phillips has a water right for the $S_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of Nw2 of Sec. 32, Tp. 8 S. R. 39 E. W. M., with a priority date of 1866, for 25 miners inches of water from Pine Creek, and the balance of water necessary to irrigate said tract of land shall be diverted from Spring Creek with the same date of priority.

That 40 acres in the NE2 SW2 and 40 acres in NW2 SW1, Sec. 24, Tp. 8 S. R. 38 E. W. M. shell have a priority date of 1868, and 19.6 acres in SW2 SE2, and 31.8 acres in SE2 SE2, Sec. 23, Tp. 8 S. R. 38 E., shall have a priority date of 1871, and the balance of the land irrigated by said James W. Phillips as shown in the tabulation hereinafter contained shall have a priority date of 1907.

That the lands rrigated by C. O. Jeffrey as shown by the tabulation hereinafter contained shall have priority dates as follows: $N_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ SEC. 29, Tp. 8 S. R. 39 E. W. M., shall have a priority date of 1869, and the $S_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ MF, of same section shall have a priority date of 1889.

That the priorities of each and all of the other parties to said suit who have appeared in these proceedings, shall be as set forth in the tabulation hereinafter contained, and the amount of water necessary for the irrigation of their lands shall be governed by the general findings as to the duty of water, and the water master shall distribute said water in accordance with these dates and said duty of water.

93.

That a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County in a suit wherein Charles B. Mays was plaintiff and C. L. Scott was defendant, involving the waters of a spring situated in the SE SW of Sec. 8, Tp. 5 S. R. 39 E. W. M., was filed in these proceedings. That by said decree each of the parties hereto have the right to the use of one-half of the water flowing from said spring. That the water master in the distribution of water shall so distribute the waters from said spring, and the parties hereto shall put in the necessary headgates and other measuring devices for the measuring of water, as the water master in the distribution and division thereof may recommend, and the lands upon which said water is to be used is set forth in the tabulation hereinafter contained, under the names of the respective parties.

94.

That a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, in a suit wherein the Sumpter Light & Water Company, a corporation, was plaintiff, and W. R. Hawley, Moses Weaver, Jos. Weaver, Anthony Mohr, and the St. Joe Gold Mining Company were defendants, involving the waters of O'Farrell's Gulch, were filed in these proceedings, and it appears by said decree that the plaintiff had a prior right to all the defendants for 200 miners inches of water from said O'Ferrel's Gulch for municipal, domestic, power and irrigation purposes. And it appears from the claim of the Northwest Light & Water Company, that said Northwest Light & Water Company has succeeded to the interests of said plaintiff in said suit.

The water master shall distribute said water in accordance with said decree.

That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, wherein Hattie H. Clsen, C. J. Osborne, and Wm. Bunyan were plaintiffs, and Frank L. Steward was defendant, involving the waters of Rock Creek was filed in these proceedings. That by said decree the defendant was enjoined from using water out of the Olson & Nicholson Ditch. That said decree does not establish the priorities, amount or use of water of said parties, but does prevent water from being distributed through said ditch to all of the parties. That said ditch was built to serve the $S_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $NE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$, $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$ $NV_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$, $NI_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$, $NI_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$, $NI_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$, $NI_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$, and $NE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$ $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of $SE_4^{\frac{1}{2}}$. That the decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Baker, wherein Eliza Ellen Kelley was plaintiff and E. E. Chambers was defendant, involving the waters of Spring Creek and springs arising on the lands and above the land of the defendant, sometimes called "Cavin and Crabill Springs," was filed in these proceedings, and it appears from the proceedings that James A. Kelley and Charles W. Kelley have succeeded to the interests of the plaintiff, and P. Crabill has succeeded to the interests of the defendant. That the defendant by said decree should have the exclusive use of the springs arising upon hisland, but that for the springs arising off the defendant's land, and the water flowing onto his land, the defendant should have the use of the water from sundown of each day until eight o'clock a. m. on the following day, and that from eight o'clock a. m., on each day to sundown on the same day, the plaintiff's and their successors in interest should have the use of the water, but that in case the plaintiffs did not use said water during the day time, then said defendants should have the use of the water both day and night.

The water master of the district shall distribute the water in accordance with said decree.

That the lands owned by the plaintiff were the S_2^1 of NE_2^1 ; SE_2^1 NW_2^2 ; NE_2^1 SW_2^2 ; and the N_2^1 of SE_2^1 , Sec. 5. That the lands owned by the defendant were the SW_2^1 NW_2^1 and NW_2^2 SW_2^1 of Sec. 5, and the SE_2^1 NE_2^1 and NE_2^1 SE_2^2 , Sec. 6, all in Tp. 9 S. R. 39 E. W. M., and the water shall be distributed according to said decree for said lands, but the water master may distribute said water in any other manner that the parties owning said lands may, by writing agree upon, when such writing is filled with said water master.

97.

That the rights for the appropriation of water for the City of Baker are partially set forth in Finding #15 herein. That said City of Baker is not at the present time using all of said water as was appropriated to make said rights; that said City of Baker in the year 1901 located a reservoir site upon Goodrich Creek and to store the waters under said rights in said reservoir. That such reservoir is owned by the City of Baker for such storage and the utilization of said water rights.

That a decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Uregon for paker County, wherein Florence L. Sherred was plaintiff, and the City of Baker was defendent, wherein and whereby said water rights were confirmed in the City of Baker and the title to said water rights was duly quieted in said city. That by said decree, said City of Baker was declared to have no power to lease the water under said water rights, but must let the same go to the rightful water user

thereof. That said City of Baker shall therefore be restrained from leasing the use of said water outside of the city limits of the City of Baker, but shall use the same for municipal purposes and the use of its inhabitants with said city limits. That all of said water so appropriated and as described in said Finding #15, is hereby reserved for the City of Baker forever.

98.

That the Baker City Mutual Irrigation Company filed its claim in these proceedings, wherein it appears that said company furnishes water to its stockholders to the extent of sixty acres within the City of Baker. That from the time it began to furnish water for the irrigation of city lots within the City of Baker, its stockholders have changed and continue to change, and the land irrigated has changed and will continue to change with the change of stockholders. That said company owns said water right for the purpose of sale of water from its ditch to its stockholders, and it is impossible to get the acreage in each forty acre tract that is irrigated by the water from said ditch. That the place of use, as heretofore, has always been within the City of Baker, and the tabulation hereinafter contained will so limit the place of use of such water to within said city. That in the event a water master is called upon at any time to take charge of said ditch and distribute the water therein, said water master shall only distribute water to such water users as have written contracts with said company, and then shall distribute such water in accordance with such written contracts.

99.

That in all cases wherein appropriations of water are claimed from springs, the owners of the land upon which said springs arise shall have the first and prior right to the use of the waters from said springs, and any and all appropriations by any person of water from a spring arising on other land than that owned by said person shall be subject to the first and prior use of the waters from said spring by the owner of said land upon which said spring arises, except as herein otherwise expressly provided.

100.

That in all cases herein where a water right for storage is found to exist, the waters stored under such right shall be used upon the land for which the same was stored, and in these findings referred to as being the land for which the same was stored, provided, that in all cases where water is stored for the purpose of sale, that none of such stored water shall be sold to any person not having a water right under these findings, or secured a water right under the provisions of law.

101.

That the Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company has the following stockholders and users from its ditch: James Akers, J. M. Bowles, Dorcas A. Brown, Julia A. Brown, John Cavin, James Cavin, P. Crabill, Hugh Doherty, Harlow J. Evans, Heman E. Jordan, Mary E. Jordan, Charles W. Kelly, James A. Kelly; W. B. Landreth, Freta Morin, Ella M. Osborn and M. E. Roberts.

That the lands irrigated by each of said stockholders are described in the tabulation. That James Akers, J. M. Bowles, Dorcas A. Brown, W. B. Landreth and Ella M. Osborn, have rights only through the Pocahontas Mining & Irrigation Company's Ditch from Marble and Hill Creeks; that Julia A. Brown besides having rights from Marble and Hill Creeks, has rights from Spring Creek, McCord Gulch and a spring; that John Cavin has rights from Cavin Springs and Roberts Springs;

that James Cavin has rights from Cavin Spring; that P. Crabill has rights from Spring Creek, Crabill Swamp and springs, and Kelly and Cavin Springs; that Hugh Doherty has a right from Goodrich Creek through Doherty Ditch. Harlow J. Evans, Heman E. Jordan and Mary E. Jordan have rights from Salmon Creek; that Charles W. Kelly has rights from McCord Gulch, a spring, and Salmon Creek; that James A. Kelly has rights from Kelly Spring, Spring Creek, Cavin and Crabill Springs; that Freta Morin has rights from Morin Springs, and W. E. Roberts has rights from Roberts Springs, as shown in the tabulation.

That the water appropriated by said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company for all of the lands irrigated under said ditch is limited to 500 miners inches, equal to 12.5 second feet. That the water in the ditch shall be distributed according to the dates as shown in the tabulation, except, that the right of Julia A. Brown shall be to a continual flow of ten miners inches, or one-fourth of a second foot, prior to all other water users, and the waters shall be distributed in accordance with the agreement and stipulations as shown in the claim filed by the Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company, provided, that the water master shall have the power and right to change such method of distribution in case a better system be established.

The Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company has at all times recognized the rights of the City of Baker as tabulated in Finding #15 herein, and entered into an agreement with said City of Baker as set forth in said Finding #15. That in the division of water of said creeks, from the making of said agreement up until the time of the decree of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon in the case of Sherred v. City of Baker, 63 Ore. 28, the right of said City of Baker to lease and sell the water claimed by the rights so owned by said City of Baker, was recognized by said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company, and the water was divided between the purchasers of said water from said City of Baker and said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company in accordance with said agreement. That all other water users from Marble and Mill Creeks, developed and improved their farms and places under the condition so created by said agreement; that the extent of the appropriation of said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company is therefore limited by such agreement, and when the water flowing in Marble Creek is below 500 miners inches, one-half thereof shall be delivered to the Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company; the other half of said waters of said creeks shall be delivered to all the other water users in accordance with the dates of priority.

That in case there be not sufficient users to utilize the half of said waters so diverted either to or from said Pocahontas Mining and Irrigation Company, the water master shall make such a division as will utilize the whole flow of said streams.

102.

That the Dry Gulch Ditch Company filed a claim in these proceedings wherein they show that on July 10th, 1894, an appropriation of water was made, and that on the 31st day of August, 1909, there was irrigated under such appropriation, 572.52 acres, and those acreages so irrigated are set out in the tabulation hereinafter set forth. That Mary A. Dryborough, David S. Gover, O. E. Moran, administrator of the Mansor Estate, Margaret B. Martin and John Waterman filed claims herein and claim water through said ditch. That parts of the land claimed to be irrigated by said last named claimants are included in the lands that were irrigated by the Dry Gulch Ditch Company, under the appropriation of July 10th, 1894.

That the Dry Gulch Ditch Company secured a State Engineer's permit under a priority date of August 31, 1909, which permit was approved September 24, 1909, and is known as Application No. 193, Enlargement Permit No. 16. That said permit covers all of the other land claimed by said Mary A. Dryborough,

David S. Gover, The Mansor Estate, Margaret B. Martin and John Waterman. That said last named claimants are therefore left out of the tabulation as hereinafter

set forth, and for the balance of the lands claimed by the Dry Gulch Ditch Company and said last named claimants, they shall have such rights with such priority dates as they are entitled to have when final proof is submitted upon said Enlargement Permit No. 16, and final certificate issued therefor.

103.

That inchoste rights were claimed by S. B. Baisley, S. B. Baisley and the Perry Baisley Astate, Charles A. Carlson, C. A. Hill, F. L. Horan, J. O. Ison, Oscar Jacobson, G. F. Johnson, C. D. Moll and G. M. Moody, asking that a date be set within which said work should be completed and that upon the application of the water to a beneficial use, that the rights date back to the dates of their original appropriation. That there has not been sufficient diligence in applying the water to a beneficial use upon the lands not yet irrigated, and said inchoate rights therefore are denied, and the rights of each of said claimants are tabulated in the tabulation hereinafter set forth for the lands irrigated at the time of filing their several statements and proofs of claim, and said claimants for the irrigation of any further land are hereby required to secure State Engineer's permit under the laws of the State of Oregon.

104.

That State Engineer's permits have been secured by claimants in these proceedings, as follows: U. S. Carpenter, Application No. 138, Permit No. 46; W. A. Cartmill, Permit No. 101 and Reservoir Permit No. 159; Lulu P. Curry, Application No. 716, Permit No. 52; Harlow J. Evans, Application No. 2420, Permit No. 1316; J. W. Farley, Application No. 1857, Permit No. 993; S. A. Lillard and J. F. Lillard, Application No. 1714, Permit No. 851; Ella Licklider, Application No. 3077, Permit No. 1613; D. C. Perkins, Application No. 2652, Enlargement Permit No. 157; Flavius Perkins, Application No. 2655, Enlargement Permit No. 158; Powder Land & Irrigation Company, Reservoir Application No. 543, Reservoir Permit No. 66, Application No. 221, Permit No. 1095, Reservoir Application No. 1133, Reservoir Permit No. 129, Application No. 222, Permit No. 468, Reservoir Application No. 14, Reservoir Permit No. 187, Reservoir Application No. 15, Reservoir Permit No. 92, Reservoir Application No. 544, Reservoir Permit No. 188, Reservoir Application No. 265, Reservoir Permit No. 65; D. H. Shaw, Application No. 619, Permit No. 268, Application No. 620, Reservoir Permit No. 33; B. E. Utz, Application No. 123, Permit No. 40; Elijah Shoemaker, Application No. 2141, Permit No. 135. That each and all of said claimants shall have such rights as they are entitled to, upon final proof of the application of water to a beneficial use under said permits, and in accordance with the law applicable to said permits.

105.

That Powder River and its tributaries form a perennial stream with well defined bed and banks, wholly within the counties of Baker and Union, but principally within the County of Baker, State of Oregon, having its source near the southern and western boundary of Baker County, in the Blue Mountains, and flowing in an easterly and northeasterly direction in the form of a letter "S" and empties its waters into the Snake River. That the flow of the stream and its tributaries is torrential in its nature, flowing large quantities of water in the spring time when the winters anows are melting, and the main stream and its tributaries almost going dry in the dry part of the summer, and most of the small tributaries going completely dry; that upon the tributaries it is necessary therefore to use the water for irrigation during the flood time or the irrigators will not be able to divert any water whatever. That along the main stream and the larger tributaries the supply of water, in the dry part of the summer is greater than upon the small tributaries; that the spring freshets begin at about the same time of the year in the Lower Powder River Basin. That all of the irrigation in the Powder River Basin is done during this spring and summer time, though in some few instances irrigation will be carried on in September and October of the fall months.

That there are four different types of soils in the irrigated land of the Powder drainage basin, the first type consisting of two or three feet of brown or black muck loam with a grayish sub-soil, and below this sub-soil quite coarse sand. The second type consists of about a foot of heavy brown to black sandy loam underlain with about three feet of a brown or gray fine loam, which has an increasing clay content as it goes downward, then with another strata of about three feet of gray or yellow loam very gritty with sand, and below this is a water-worn gravel. The third type consists of a fine sandy loam about two feet deep, underlain with gravel boulders or conglomerate mixtures, and the surface soil containing gravel of varying sizes from fine particles to an inch or more in diameter. The fourth type consists of from two to four feet of gray or yellow fine sandy loam, the texture becoming heavier in the sub-soil. That the natural rainfall in said watershed varies from ten to twenty inches; that irrigation is necessary in order to produce crops.

106.

In no case where water is stored, shall there be diverted from the stream more than the number of acre feet of water as represented by the number of acres to be irrigated with such stored water, multiplied by the number of acre feet that is sufficient for the irrigation of one acre, as found in these findings, and the diversion for storage shall be the number of second feet appropriated for that purpose, diverted at any time there is water, according to the date of priority.

107.

That all claimants herein for water for irrigation shall be entitled to use such water for stock and domestic purposes; that the rights of use for stock and domestic purposes is hereby confirmed and entitles the owner of such right to divert and use such a quantity of water as is reasonable necessary for his household and stock use, and for stock use, the amount so diverted and used shall not exceed the rate of one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second for each one thousand (1000) head of stock, and the quantity diverted for irrigation purposes during the irrigation season shall include when it is so diverted, such an amount as may be reasonably necessary for said stock and domestic purposes, and the right to divert and use the waters of said stream and its tributaries for stock and domestic purposes continues throughout the year.

108.

That in all cases where any person, firm or corporation has a right under this decree to supply and deliver water to others and charge for the same, or may hereafter acquire such right, it is the duty of such person, firm or corporation to supply water to any and all persons applying for water who can use water along the line of the works belonging to such person, firm or corporation, or who can be reasonably supplied with water from said works under reasonable and uniform contracts and for reasonable and uniform charges up to the limit of the capacity of said works, so long as said person so taking water complies or is ready and able to comply with the terms of such contract. Such contract may provide for any reasonable and uniform method of pro rate distribution of water, and such person, firm or corporation may make such reasonable and uniform rules and regulations as may be necessary to facilitate such distribution. In case such contract does not provide for such distribution of water, then such water shall be supplied to the water users in the order of, and according to the date of priority of use upon the land, or at the place upon which such water is to be used, and subject to rotation as in this decree generally provided; Provided, that no contract shall be made to deliver water to lands or places not theretofore supplied, to such an extent as to deprive any land or place of water

which has been previously supplied, and <u>orovided further</u> that no contract shall be made to deliver water for irrigation or power unless the land or place where said water is to be used be entitled to such use under a right granted by this decree, by a permit of the State Engineer, or by a water right certificate. All contracts for the use of water giving any preference other than as herein stated, are against the public policy and laws of the State of Oregon, and void.

109.

In all cases in this decree wherein the right to use water out of more than one stream for the same land is confirmed, the amount of water herein determined for said right may be used out of either or both of said streams, so long as the amount of water taken does not exceed the volume named in this decree, and each stream may be used to supplement the other in furnishing said amount of water.

110.

That a right to store water is a separate and distinct right from the right to use such water for irrigation, and a water right for irrigation does not give the water user entitled thereto, the right to store such water. In all cases in these findings wherein a water user has both the right to store water and also the right to use such water for irrigation, he shall have the right to divert such water from the stream, according to the respective priority dates of such rights, and said right to store water may be used to supplement the diversion for irrigation, that is, when the water in said stream becomes so scarce that his right to the diversion of water for such irrigation right is cut off, then he shall have the right to use the water so stored by him for the purpose of supplementing the right for irrigation, and of increasing the length of the irrigation season upon the lands for which he has such irrigation right.

111.

That in all cases where water is stored by any object, said water shall be taken at any season of the year for said storage according to the dates of relative priority, and in case the owner of any reservoir desires to use the bed of any of the streams for the purpose of carrying such stored water from the reservoir to the consumer thereof, said owner of such reservoir shall install and headgates and measuring devices as the Superintendent of the Division, or the water master of the district in which the water is situated and used shall order. Said stored water may be used at any time during the year that the owner thereof may desire. Thenever said owner of such reservoir desires to use such stored water, he shall notify the water master of the district in which the stored water is to be used, giving the date when it is proposed to discharge water from such reservoir, its volume, and the names of all persons and ditches entitled to its use. Said water master shall then determine the percentage of loss by seepage, evaporation or other causes, between the place of discharge from the reservoir into the stream, and the place of diversion from the stream, and shall close or so adjust the headgates of all ditches from the stream as will enable those having such right to secure the volume discharged from the reservoir, less the determined loss. That in all cases where reservoirs are built so as to include within their boundaries, the bed of any stream, the waters of which are herein adjudicated and determined, the owner, manager, or lessee of such reservoir shall install in the stream above and below said reservoir, such measuring devices as the Superintendent of the Division or the water master of the District in which said reservoir is situated may order; the plans for the construction of said measuring devices shall be approved by the State Engineer. The said water master shall measure all water of such stream manning into said reservoir to any play and prior rights as may be entitled to use said water; such discha

the same. The water master shall keep a true and just account of the time spent by him in the discharge of his duties as defined in this finding, and shall file the same with the County Court of Baker or Union County, as the case may be, sitting for the transaction of county business. Said County Court shall present a bill of one-half the expensesso incurred to the reservoir owner, manager, or lessee, and if such owner, manager or lessee shall meglect for thirty days after the presentation of such bill of costs to pay the same, the said costs shall be made a charge upon said reservoir, and shall be collected as delinquent taxes until the complete payment of such bill of costs has been made, and the rights of appropriation herein confirmed confer no rights to the diversion and use of waters which have been lawfully impounded in reservoirs and other storage works which have been, or may be hereafter constructed in accordance with law, when the same are discharged into the natural channel of said stream, or any tributary there f, in a lawful manner by those having a lawful right to do so, but the said rights of appropriation herein confirmed are limited and confined to the waters flaving naturally in the natural channel of said stream and its tributeries.

112.

That the rights of appropriation hereby confirmed are appurtenent to the lands herein described for irrigation purposes, and the rights of use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries by virtue of such rights of appropriation, are limited and confined to the irrigation of the lands herein described to the extent of said lands as herein set forth, and the priorities herein confirmed confer no right of use of the waters of said stream and its tributaries, on the lands other than those specified tracts to which such rights of appropriation are herein set forth as appurtenant, and each and every person shall be and hereby is prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using water from said stream on such other lands without lawful permit from the State Engineer.

113

That the order of the rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of said stream and its tributaries, and in which order they are entitled to divert and use the said water shall be and is according to the date of the relative priority of the right as herein set forth and determined, and the first in order of time according to the date of relative priority shall be and is the first in order of right, and so on, down to the date of the k test priority, and those having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said stream and its tributaries, when necessary for beneficial use in connection with the irrigation of their respective lands, or other useful and beneficial purposes for which they are decreed a right of use, at all times and against those having subsequent rights, without let or hinderance, and whenever the water is not required by the appropriator having a prior right to its use for the purpose for which said water was appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down in the natural channel of the stream as it was wont to flow in its metural course, without hinderance or diversion thereof, and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of such water and to divert the same to the extent of their rights or appropriations, according to the order of their priority rights; and at all times the waters diverted shall be beneficially, economically and reasonable used without waste by those having a right to do so by reason of their priority of right, and no rights of appropriation are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity of water into the head of the ditch or ditches of the appropriator having a valid right to divert the water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purposes to which the water is to be put, and in no event shall the quantity of water diverted exceed the quantity herein as the quantity to which such appropriator is entitled, as the same is necessary for the proper and beneficial irrigation of his lands and has been actually put to a

That to get a sufficient head of water, the water master of the district in which such water is situated shall arrange such a system or systems of rotation as may be best applicable to either, first, by giving a greater amount of water to an appropriator for a proportionately less time, provided that the giving of such greater amount of water does not infringe upon any of the rights confirmed by this decree, and provided further, that the amount of water taken by an appropriator does not exceed the number of acre feet as found in these findings to be necessary for the irrigation of the land during the irrigation season; second, or in the absence of an agreement between such appropriators arranging for such rotation, and the manner in which such water shall be used in such rotation, the water master of the district in which such stream and its tributaries is situated shall arrange such appropriators in groups or systems of rotation, first giving to one appropriator in such group a quantity of water equal to the combined appropriations of all the appropriators in said group or system, for a length of time bearing the same ratio to the whole time required to make the complete rotation through the whole group of appropriators as the appropriation of such appropriator bears to the combined appropriation of said group, and shall next serve another appropriator with a like quantity of water for his proportionate time, and so on, until all the appropriators in said group or system are served, then the distribution of water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigation season.

The determination as to who shall be first served in said group or system of appropriators shall be left to the judgment of the water master.

Or third, where two or more appropriators agree as between themselves as to the manner of said rotation in the use of water, said water master shall distribute the water in accordance with such agreement, provided always, that such arrangements into groups or systems of rotation shall not interfere with the prior rights of any appropriator, not a member of such group or system, and provided further that such agreement shall be in writing, and filed by said appropriators with the water master.

115.

That the measurements of the discharge of Powder River at Salisbury Station ten miles above Baker, during the months of April, May and June, for ten years beginning with the year 1905, show as follows, to-wit:

That the average discharge in said ten years is 65,411 acre feet per year. That the year 1914 shows 66,500 acre feet, and is nearest the average discharge of said stream for said years. That the year 1914 is therefore taken by the State Water Board as the year of average run off and the use of water during the year 1914 would therefore be about the normal use. That the normal run-off at Baker, Oregon, according to the U. S. Weather Reports being an average calculated from all the records available, is 13.2 inches per year. That the rainfall at Baker, Oregon, during the year 1914, was 10.89 inches; that the rainfall in the year 1914 in the months of April, May and June, during which time the run-off of Powder River was measured, was 4.55 inches, the normal rainfall in April, May and June calculated from all the records available is 3.88 inches. In March, 1914, the rainfall was 0.33 inches, while the normal rainfall is 1.44 inches.

That taking into consideration the rainfall and the discharge of the river, makes the year 1914 very nearly a normal year. That the total discharge

of Powder River at Salisbury for the year 1914, if used equally upon all the lands irrigated from the main stream around the City of Baker, would furnish 2.87 acre feet per acre; that the use of all the water discharged by Wolf Creek during the irrigating season upon the lands irrigated from Wolf Creek would furnish 2.44 acre feet per acre; by Pine Creek, 2.65 acre feet per acre; by Mill, Marble and Salmon Creeks, 2.2 acre feet per acre. That the use of all the water during the year 1914 which was diverted into Old Settlers Slough, if used equally upon all the lands irrigated from said slough would furnish 2.3 acre feet per acre; in the Baldock Slough 1.2 acre feet per acre. That the use of all the water diverted from Rock Creek through the Angel, Olson & Loennig Ditch in 1914, if used equally upon all the land irrigated from said ditch, would furnish 2.23 acre feet per acre; through the Chambers Ditch 3.14 acre feet per acre; through the Burke-Owens and Cartmill Ditch, 1.21 acre feet per acre. That the use of all the water diverted from Pine Creek through the Williams Ditch in 1914, if used equally upon all the land irrigated thereunder, would furnish 1.09 acre feet per acre. That the use of all the water diverted onto the land of John Lew through the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch in 1914, was 1.45 acre feet per acre. That all of the water diverted through the Emele Ditch for the land irrigated thereunder in the year 1914, was 2.94 acre feet per acre. That all of the water diverted through Ditch for the year 1914, was 0.94 acre foot per acre.

From the foregoing measurements, it appears that in only one instance has the amount of water diverted for use been more than three acre feet per acre. That the ditches measured and the soil irrigated thereunder are average ditches for the districts in which said ditches are located. That three acre feet of water is therefore sufficient water to irrigate one acre of land in any part of said drainage basin. That in order to successfully irrigate a piece of ground, it is necessary to have a sufficient head of water. That the intermittent use of water upon the ground gives the most satisfactory results, and makes it possible for the arrangement of satisfactory systems of rotation, so that the head of water used upon the ground can be increased by such rotation.

That the flow of Powder River at Salisbury Station if used upon all the land irrigated around the City of Baker, from Powder River, at the same time, would furnish a flow of about one inch per acre during the month of April; about three-fourths of an inch per acre during the month of June. That the diversion of water from main Powder River into Old Settlers Slough was about three-fourths of an inch per acre during the months of April and May, and from one-half to one-tenth of an inch per acre during the month of June. That the diversion of water into Baldock Slough was about six-tenths of an inch per acre during the month of May, and three-tenths of an inch per acre during the month of June. That the diversion of water through the Emele Ditch from Powder River, during the months of April, May, June and July of 1914, was one-half inch per acre for each acre irrigated thereunder. That the diversion of water through the McEwen Valley Irrigation Company's Ditch, during the month of May, was one-half inch per acre, and during the months of June and July, four-tenths of an inch per acre.

That Wolf Creek flows sufficient water to irrigate the land thereunder with one inch per acre during the month of April, and a few days in May; that thereafter the supply is one-half inch per acre and less. That Rock Creek flows sufficient water to supply the lands irrigated thereunder with one inch per acre for about fifteen days in the latter part of May and the first of June; that the flow at all other times is one-half inch per acre, and less.

That the Angel-Olsen & Locating Ditch from Rock Creek, diverted one inch per acre for the lands irrigated by said ditch in 1914 for seventeen days during the month of May, and the balance of said time it diverted about one-half inch per acre. That the Chambers Ditch diverted from Rock Creek, from the

first to the fourteenth day of May, about two inches per acre, then again from the 29th day of May to the 2nd day of June, and then again from the 18th to the 30th day of June. That the Burke-Owens & Cartmill Ditch from Rock Creek diverted one miners inch per acre from May 1st to 24th inclusive.

That Pine Creek flowed sufficient water for four days in 1914 to supply the land irrigated therefrom, with one miners inch per acre; that at all other times the flow varied from that amount to one-tenth of a miners inch per acre. That the Williams Ditch from Pine Creek, during the year 1914, diverted one-half miners inch per acre for about seven days and that the diversion varied from that amount to one-tenth of a miners inch per acre during the balance of the season. That during the months of May, June and July, Mill, Marble and Salmon Creeks flowed sufficient water to supply the land irrigated thereunder with one-half miners inch per acre for a few days, and varied from that amount down to one-tenth of a miners inch per acre. That this flow is augmented to some extent by springs and soepage water rising upon or near the lands of the water users and that land is not considered in the measurements.

That the Pocahontas Farmers Ditch diverted onto the lands of John Lew for a periof of eight days, about four miners inches per acre. That Big Creek flows sufficient water to furnish more than one miners inch per acre during the month of April, and about half of the month of May, and thereafter furnishes scarcely any water for irrigation, though there is generally a small rise of water in June. That Goose Creek is about the same as Big Creek. That Daly Creek flows about the same as Goose Creek and Big Creek. That Goodrich Creek flows about the same as Hill, Marble and Salmon Creeks in relation to the lands irrigated from that stream.

That the lands along Eagle Creek can be sufficiently irrigated with a flow of one-half inch per acre.

Comparing the flow of the streams with the amount of water diverted upon the lands in the ditches, it appears that all the lands irrigated from Eagle Creek, Main Powder River, Mill, Markle and Salmon Creeks, Goodrich Creek, and Pine Creek, must be limited to a flow of one-half inch or 1/80th of a second foot per acre with the privilege of increasing the head of water by intermittent irrigation and proper rotation, under the supervision of the water master, so that the water can be practically used and the land substantially irrigated. That upon all the other streams, gulches and tributaries of Powder River and Eagle Creek, it is necessary to use the water while the same is running or the land cannot be irrigated, and upon all of said other streams the head of water shall be limited to one inch, or one-fortieth of a second foot per acre, during such high water, and not later than the first day of July of each year, and after said time of each year to one-half inch, or 1/80th of a second foot per acre with the provision that said head of water can be increased by intermittent irrigation and proper rotation under the supervision of the water master.

That the specification of a definite amount of water per acre, in these findings, shall not be taken as granting that specific amount of water, but shall only be taken as a rule and guide for the water master in distributing a maximum amount of water to any water user, and it shall be in the discretion of such water master to cut down the amount of water given for any particular acreage of land and turn the amount of water to other land, at any time that such land becomes fully irrigated upon a less amount of water, or such water be not economically or beneficially used, and the water master shall have the right in his discretion, to cut off the supply of water to any land at any time in the distribution of water, when the date of priority of such land is such that as the water becomes short and scarce, there would not be sufficient water to deliver any to such land.

That in all cases where a larger amount of water is granted to a claimant in these Findings, than such claimants has the right to flow through his ditch by reason of a lack of sufficient ownership in said ditch to flow such water, such claimant shall be limited to an amount which such claimant has the right to flow through such ditch, and these Findings shall not be taken as granting to such claimant any additional title or ownership in said ditch.

119.

The following appropriators have, in their statements and proofs of claim, applied to the State Water Board to prescribe the time within which the full amount of water appropriated shall be applied to a beneficial use, and it appears to the said State Water Board that the appropriations of said appropriators, and each of them, were initiated prior to February 24th, 1909, and that actual construction work had been commenced in good faith prior to said date.

Each of the appropriators tabulated therein shall complete their appropriation, including the construction work and application of the water to a beneficial use, on or before the date set in such tabulation as being the limiting date for the complete application of such water to a beneficial use, or, within any extension of such time as the State Water Board for a good cause shown, may make as provided by law. Upon the expiration of said time for the complete application of the water to a beneficial use as in said Findings provided, or any extension thereof, the State Water Board shall cause due proof to be taken of such application of the water to a beneficial use, and grant such water right certificate as said State Water Board may ascertain that such appropriator is entitled to receive by virtue of such proof.

The State Engineer is hereby directed to issue a certificate to each of said appropriators showing the time fixed by this Finding within which the water appropriated by such appropriator shall be applied to a beneficial use. The extent of such appropriation shall be limited to such an amount or volume of water as shall have been put to a beneficial use by the expiration of the time fixed in this Finding.
