IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE 1 RELATIVE RIGHTS TO THE WATERS OF MILL CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF CATHERINE CREEK AND 1 THE GRANDE RONDE RIVER, IN UNION COUNTY, ORECON.

FINDINGS AND ORDER OF DETERMINATION .

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Now on this 13th day of April, 1910, the above entitled matter coming on for the consideration of the Board of Control of the State of Oregon, upon the evidence and proofs herein, for findings and an order of determination of the relative rights to the waters of said above named stream, and the said Board having now considered said evidence and proofs, and the testimony and documents and instruments filed herein, and being now fully advised in the premises, finds as follows, to-wit:

(1

That a proper petition praying for an adjudication of the relative rights to the waters of said Mill Creek, a tributary of the Grande Ronde River and of Catherine Creek, in Union County, Cregon, signed by Olliver B. Shappat and M. J. Duffy, water users on said stream, was heretofore and on the 12th day of April, 1909, filed with the Board of Control of the State of Oregon.

That upon an investigation the said Board of Control found the facts and conditions such as to justify the making of a determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream, and thereupon, by an order duly made and entered on the 15th day of April, 1909, fixed the 14th day of June, 1909, as the time when the State Engineer of the State of Oregon, would begin the investigation of the flow of said stream and of the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the 29th day of June, 1909, as the time when, and the town of Cove, Union County, Oregon, as the place where the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, would begin the taking of testimony and proofs as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the waters of said stream.

That pursuant to such order, a notice, setting forth the date when the State Engineer of the State of Oregon would begin the investigation of the flow of said stream, and of the ditches diverting water therefrom, to-wit: the 14th day of June, 1909, and the place and time certain when the Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, in which division said stream is situated, would begin the taking of testimony as to the rights of the parties claiming water therefrom, to-wit: the 29th day of June, 1909, at Cove, Union County, Oregon, at the hour of 10 o'clock a.m., of said day, at the Junham Wright Hotel in said town of Cove, was duly and regularly published in two issues of the La Grande Morning Star, a newspaper printed and published at La Grande, in Union County, Oregon, and having a general circulation within said County of Union, Oregon; due proof of such publication in said newspaper being now on file in the office of the Board of Control and a part of the record herein; that said Superintendent of Water Division Ne. 2, did, on the 13th day of May, 1909, send, by registered mail, a similar notice to each person, firm and corporation claiming the right to the use of any of the waters of said stream, or its tributaries, and to each person, firm and corporation owning or being in possession of lands bordering on or having access to said stream or its tributaries, in so far as such claimants could be reasonably ascertained, and

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said Superintendent did enclose with said notice a blank form on which said claimant, owner or person in possession should present in writing all of the particulars necessary for the determination of his rights to the waters of said stream to which he lays claim, due proof whereof being now on file in the office of the Board of Control and a part of the record herein.

That pursuant to such notice a duly qualified assistant of the State Engineer did proceed to make an examination of said stream and of the works diverting water therefrom, and an examination and approximate measurement of the lands irrigated and susceptible of irrigation from said ditches and canals, which said measurements and observations have been reduced to writing and made a matter of record in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Oregon; and that said Superintendent of Water Division No. 2, did, at the time and place in said notice specified, take the testimony and proofs of claimants to the water of said stream, said claimants being hereinafter named in the findings as to their respective rights, due proof of such hearing being now on file herein, and a part of the record in this cause.

each of the claimants to the waters of said stream (hereinafter named in the findings as to their respective rights) by registered mail, that all of the evidence, testimony and proofs of the various claimants would be open to inspection for a period of ten days (Sundays excepted), beginning on August 27th, 1909, and ending on September 7th, 1909, from 9 to 12:00 o'clock a.m., and from 1:30 to 5:00 o'clock p.m., at the Wright Hotel, in Cove, Union County, Oregon; and that the determination of the Board of Control would be heard by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County; due proof whereof and of the mailing of said notices by registered mail being now on file in this cause.

That pursuant to said notice the said division superintendent did, at the time and place in said notice specified, hold such inspection, due proof whereof being now on file herein.

That all evidence, testimony and proofs filed with the said Superintendent in the above entitled matter have been transmitted by him in person to the office of the said Board of Control and are now on file in said office.

That the following named persons and corporations were duly notified as declared in Finding No. 3 herein, but that each and all of them have failed, neglected and refused to file any claim to the waters of said stream, and are in default herein, and have no interest in, or claim to the waters of said stream; said persons, firms and corporations so being in default herein, with their respective postoffice addresses, being as follows, to-wit:

That said Mill Creek is a natural water course rising in said Union County, Oregon, and flowing thence to Catherine Creek, of which it is a tributary, and that said Catherine Creek is a tributary of the Grande Ronde River, in Union County, Oregon; that said Mill Creek is entirely situate in said Union County.

That the soil of the irrigable lands lying along said stream is chiefly gravelly formation and sandy loam, and is chiefly cultivated to gardens and crops of hay and grain.

That each of the appropriations of water for the purpose of iri gation hereinafter set forth, is limited to an amount of water sufficient for the irrigation and reclamation of the lands described herein as being the lands to which such water is appurtenant, and the total volume of water so appropriated and hereby confirmed in each case shall not exceed the rate of one cubic foot of water per second of time for each eighty (80) acres of land irrigated, except as hereinafter set forth and specified.

That a system in the use of the water, among the several appropriators of small amounts of water, in the same neighborhood, has been in use, more or less, upon the said stream, and alds greatly to the duty which said water may be made to perform; and that in the absence of an agreement between the said appropriators arranging for such rotation, and the manner in which such water shall be used in such rotation, the water master of the district in which such water is situated shall arrange such appropriators in groups or systems of rotation, first giving to the appropriator who is first in priority an amount of water equal to the combined appropriations of all the appropriators in said group or system for a length of time bearing the same ratio to the whole time required to make the complete rotation through the whole group or system of appropriators as the appropriation of said first appropriator bears to the combined appropriations of said appropriators, and shall serve the next appropriator in priority next, with a like amount of water for his proportionate time, and so on, until all the appropriators in said group are served; then the distribution of water shall be repeated in the same manner throughout the irrigating season; that in case any two or more of appropriators in said group shall have the same priorities, then the said water master shall distribute the water as between those appropriators having the same priorities to the one whose ditch taps the stream nearest its source first, and the next lower down next, and so on, and where two or more appropriators agree as between themselves as to a manner and system of rotation in the use of their water, the said water master shall distribute their water in accordance with such agreement; Provided, and this whole Finding No. 12, is upon the condition that such arrangement

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into groups and systems shall not interfere with the prior rights of any appropriator not a member of such group or system.

That claimants John A. McNeill and Phoebe J. Anderson, filed a contest herein against the claims of Jennie B. Corpe, Alice: C. Corpe and B. L. Batchelor, but before any testimony was taken in support thereof, a stipulation, signed by all of said parties, was filed herein, from which it is determined that the rights of each and all of said parties to the water of Mill Creek, through what is known as the McNeill or Cochran Ditch, are and shall be as follows, subject to the right of Mrs. Irvin Batchelor, as determined in Finding No. 20, herein; that the said John A. McNeill and Phoebe J. Anderson shall each have two-fifths of the flow of said ditch, and of the remaining one-fifth of the flow of said ditch, Alice C. Corpe and Jennie B. Corpe shall each have two-fifths thereof, and the said B. L. Batchelor one-fifth thereof.

That claimants F. T. Sanford and Otto Johnson, filed a contest herein against the claim of Alice C. Corpe, but before any testimony was taken in support thereof, a stipulation signed by all of said parties was filed herein, from which it is determined that the rights of each of said parties to the waters of Millard Branch, a tributary of Mill Creek, as determined in Finding No. 20, herein, shall be modified as follows: that the said Alice C. Corpe shall have the right to all the waters of said Millard Branch, so far as the rights of other parties to said stipulation are concerned, for thirty-six hours during each week, beginning on Monday, at six o'clock p.m., and ending on Wednesday, at six o'clock a.m.; and that the said F. T. Sanford and Otto Johnson shall have the right to all of the waters of the said Millard Branch, so far as the said Alice C. Corpe is concerned, during all the rest and remainder of the time.

That claimant, Julia A. Dangherty, filed a contest against the claim of Emma E. Wilbur, but before any testimony was taken in support thereof, a stipulation, signed by all of the parties, was filed herein, from which it is determined that in so far as the said Emma E. Wilbur is concerned, the said Julia F. Daugherty shall have at all time sufficient water from Mill Creek, through the Babington Branch to properly irrigate all of Lots 8, 9, and 10, of Hibler's Addition to the town of Cove, Union County, Oregon, not exceeding five miner's inches (.125 second feet).

That J. H. Allen, Stella Gibson Arthur, A. A. Beldon, B. F. and S. E. Bell, A. G. Conklin, E. B. Coons, Mary M. Harris, W. A. Jordan, Annie Lund, A. McDaniel, Louis W. Peck, Annie Ragsdale, Sarah A. Shappat, and Karl J. and Bessie Stackland, have filed claims to the waters of Kill Creek, by virtue of their ownership of shares of stock in the Caldwell Ditch Company, a corporation claimant; that such claims are in no sense adverse to the claim of the said Caldwell Ditch Company, but should be considered as a part thereof; that the right of the different stock holders in said corporation should not be considered separately, but in the aggregate, as constituting the right of the corporation, and the water right certificate issued to the corporation as appurtenant to the aggregate land holdings of the stock holders; and the individual rights of each stock holder must depend upon his or her contractual relations with the corporation, which relation is in no way involved in this proceeding and therefore not determined.

That the claimant Caldwell Ditch Company, filed a contest herein against the claimant, Claude N. Ogilvie, and after issues joined therein, the testimony was taken, from which it is determined that the said claimant, Claude N. Ogilvie, and his prodecessor in interest, have used water from said Mill Creek, upon the promises of the said claimant, Ogilvie, through the said Caldwell Ditch, to the extent of .6 second foot, from May the first to July the first, of each year, since the Spring of 1898, and to the extent of .1 second foot from July the first to September the first, of each year, since the Spring of 1898; that said use has continued for more than ten consecutive years, under a claim of right; that the said use of said .6 second foot of water from the first of May to the first of July of each season did not interfere with the use of the Caldwell Ditch

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company, and therefore as to the use of the said water was not adverse, but as to the use of the said ditch, it was adverse; that the use of the said .l second foot, from the first day of July to the first day of July to the first day of July to the first day of the said ditch; the claim therefore, of the said Caldwell Ditch Company, is reduced .l second foot from the first day of July to the first day of September of each year; and should be 3.35 second feet from the first day of May to the first day of July of each year, and 3.25 second feet from the first day of July to the first day of September of each year; that said Claude N. Ogilvie, having shown the use of .6 second feet of water since the Spring of 1898 from Mill Creek through the said Caldwell Ditch, but having failed to show that such use was adverse prior to July the first, of each season, establishes a right to an appropriation out of Mill Creek, through the said Caldwell Ditch, to the extent of said .6 second feet, aating from June 30th, 1898, but limited to the months of May and June of each season; that by reason of his adverse use of the said Caldwell Ditch for more than ten years as aforesaid the said Claude N. Ogilvie has acquired a perpetual right to run his .6 second feet of water in the said ditch from the first of July of each year, subject henceforth to his proportional share of the maintenance of such ditch; and that said Claude N. Ogilvie has acquired the further right, by adverse use to .1 second foot of water, from the first day of July to the first day of September of each season, through the said Caldwell Ditch and out of the original Caldwell Ditch appropriation; that is, with a priority of 1866.

That claimant Caldwell Ditch Company filed a contest herein against the claimant T. G. Wilson, and after issues joined therein, testimony was taken from which it is determined that the claimant T. G. Wilson, purchased the land for which he claims a water right in 1902, but elected to purchase the same without a water right; that by reason of his said contract for the purchase of said land, the water right appurtenant thereto, if any, did not pass to the purchaser, T. G. Wilson; he appears to have used a small amount water at different times, during the rost five or six years upon his said premises, but it is not clearas to where the said water came from, or under what claim it was used; that the testimony does not disclose such a user by the said T. G. Wilson as would establish a right.

That none of the parties to the contests herein, recover costs; and that contestant, Caldwell Ditch Company, be considered to have prevailed as against T. G. Wilson, so as to be entitled to a return of fees advanced in the taking of testimony in the sum of seven and 50/100 (\$7.50) dollars; and that Claude N. Ogilvie be considered to have prevailed against the Caldwell Ditch Company, so as to be entitled to a return of fees advanced in the taking of testimony, in the sum of fifteen and no/100 (\$15.00) dollars.
