
RESCISSION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR THE STATE OF OREGON DUE TO SEVERE, CONTINUING DROUGHT CONDITIONS

A state of emergency for the State of Oregon due to severe, continuing drought conditions was declared by the Governor in Executive Order No. EO-92-21 dated September 3, 1992. Significant rain and snow have since alleviated drought conditions. While drought conditions may continue on a more localized basis, the statewide drought declaration is no longer necessary.

IT IS ORDERED AND DIRECTED:

1. Executive Order No. EO-92-21 is rescinded.

RESOLUTION OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE STATE OF OREGON
TO SEVERE, DETERIORATING CONDITIONS

A state of emergency for the State of Oregon has been
declared by the Governor of Oregon, as defined by the Governor
in Executive Order No. 10-81-51 dated September 1, 1952.
The conditions which have now been declared are of a
nature which require the immediate attention of the
State of Oregon. While the conditions may continue on a
temporary basis, the state of emergency is no longer
necessary.


IT IS ORDERED AND DIRECTED:


Executive Order No. 10-81-51 is rescinded.
