## ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6615 submitted by

JAMES AND JUDITH KNAPP P.O. BOX 1270 SISTERS, OREGON 97759.

The first right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for CROOK County as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 14762. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is 1871 for TRACT 1 and 1903 for TRACT 2.

The right allows the use of BIG SLOUGH, a tributary of SQUAW CREEK, for IRRIGATION OF 66.9. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 1.34 cubic foot per second, being 0.91 cfs for TRACT 1 and 0.43 for TRACT 2, if available at the original points of diversion: C.J. HINDMAN DITCHES OUT OF BIG SLOUGH for TRACT 1 and DITCHES OUT OF BIG SLOUGH for TRACT 2, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The authorized point of diversion is:

SE% NW%, SECTION 13, T 14 S, R 9 E, WM; 2350 FEET SOUTH AND 2150 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 13.

The second right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for CROOK County as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 274. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is 1882.

The right allows the use of SQUAW CREEK, a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.40 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion: CONRAD DITCH OUT OF BIG SLOUGH, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The authorized point of diversion is:

SE% NW%, SECTION 13, T 14 S, R 9 E, WM; 2350 FEET SOUTH AND 2150 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 13.

The third right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for CROOK County as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 292. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 1, at Page 120. The date of priority is 1905.

The right allows the use of SQUAW CREEK, a tributary of the DESCHUTES RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 33.7 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.67 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: OLIVER DITCH OUT OF BIG SLOUGH; SW%, SECTION 16, T 14 S, R 10 E, WM; 25 FEET NORTH AND 790 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 16, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The source of water for these rights is BIG SLOUGH, tributary of SQUAW CREEK, also know as Indian Ford Creek.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

The applicants propose to change the point of diversion for the right under Certificate 292, with priority date of 1905, to:

SE% NW%, SECTION 13, T 14 S, R 9 E, WM; 2350 FEET SOUTH AND 2150 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 13.

THESE CHANGES TO EXISTING WATER RIGHTS MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 1998.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old diversions, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 3. The water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

- 4. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.
- 5. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as a part of this water right.

Certificates 14762, 274, and 292 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued to confirm those portions of the rights NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming these water rights will be issued.
