Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

ORS 540.621 establishes the process for the owner of land to which a water right is appurtenant to certify under oath that the water right, or a portion thereof, has been abandoned and to voluntarily request that it be cancelled.

Findings of Fact

- 1. On July 23, 2020, MURPHY ELECTRIC IRRIGATION, INC. filed an application to change the place of use under Certificate 54510, and to voluntarily cancel a portion of water right Certificate 27462. The Department assigned the application number T-13498.
- 2. Joshua and Gretchen Ingersoll are the receiving landowners, however both the applicant and the receiving landowners will be responsible for completion of the changes.
- 3. Notice of the application for transfer was published on August 4, 2020, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 4. On December 11, 2020, the Department contacted the applicant by written correspondence to notify the applicant of deficiencies in the application. The application map does not identify the entirety of the right. The map identifies only 8.7 acres, and Certificate 54510

A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

authorizes irrigation of 9.05 acres. Pursuant to OAR 690-380-3100(2)(f), the map shall include the location of any part of the right not involved in the proposed transfer. The application is proposing to cancel a portion of Certificate 27462, which was cancelled April 2, 2020, upon issuance of a Final Order approving T-13124, and issuance of remaining right Certificate 94804. Certificate 94804 is what should be identified in the application. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by January 12, 2021. The Department did not receive a response to the deficiency letter.

- 5. On January 14, 2021, the Department contacted the applicant by written correspondence a second time, to notify the applicant of deficiencies in the application identified in Findings of Fact 4. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by February 15, 2021. The Department did not receive a response to the deficiency letter.
- 6. After proof of completion, any water right certificate issued to confirm the changes to Certificates 54510 and 94804 under Transfer T-13498 is to remain in the name of Murphy Electric Irrigation, Inc.
- 7. On February 25, 2021, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny Transfer Application T-13498 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 29, 2021, for the applicant to respond.
- 8. On March 4, 2021, the Certified Water Rights Examiner submitted a statement regarding the condition of the applicant, along with a revised map, resolving the deficiencies. The Department has determined to recognize Certificate 94804 as the water right certificate for partial cancellation.
- 9. On March 11, 2021, the applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 10. On May 5, 2021, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer T-13498 and mailed a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on May 11, 2021, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.
- 11. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 13. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 14. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-13498.
- 15. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 16. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 17. On November 2, 2020, the Department determined the Murphy Electric Irrigation, Inc. (pump station) is not currently being utilized, and is not operational at this time.
- 18. The Department has not received an application map which includes all of the remaining right under Certificate 54510, pursuant to OAR 690-380-3100(2)(f).
- 19. The Department has not received a revised affidavit for the voluntary partial cancellation of a water right, identifying the correct certificate number to be cancelled, being Certificate 94804. The affidavit for the voluntary partial cancellation also did not include a deed listing the landowners and a legal description of the affected lands, and a copy of a water right final proof map with the abandoned portion of the right to be cancelled clearly drawn and identified.

Partial Cancellation of a Water Right

20. On February 13, 2019, the Department received an Affidavit for the Voluntary Cancellation of a Portion of a Water Right Certificate from Gary Bowden, Trustee. The right to be cancelled is as follows:

- 21. On April 2, 2020, the Department issued a Final Order (Special Order Volume 116, Page 389), approving a change in place of use under Certificate 54521. Water right Certificate 27462 was cancelled, and remaining right Certificate 94804 was issued.
- 22. On July 23, 2020, an affidavit certifying that a portion of a water right has been abandoned and requesting cancellation of the right was received from Robert H. and Wanda G. LaCombe. The right to be cancelled is as follows:

Conclusions of Law

The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13498 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-13498 is approved. The portion of the right that has been abandoned is cancelled.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 54510 and 94804, and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificates 54510 and 94804 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing those portions of the rights not affected by this transfer and cancellation.
- 4. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
- 5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at the Murphy Electric Irrigation Inc. pump station, if this diversion is brought back into operation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 6. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2022**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.

After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued in the name of Murphy Electric Irrigation, Inc.
