ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3935

On April 19, 1978, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Sadie & Clarence C. Williams and J. Ervin & Ruby E. Toney for approval of changes in place of use, point of diversion and use heretofore made of water from Ashland Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 16034, Volume 13, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of R. D. Sanford, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.08 cubic foot per second from Ashland Creek for irrigation of a certain 5.0 acres in SW_4^1 NW_4^1 and 0.5 acre in SE_4^1 NW_4^1 of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1864.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Smith-Myer-Roper Ditch, from a point located 850 feet North and 300 feet West from the Southwest Corner of D.L.C. No. 41, being within the NE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the place of use, point of diversion and use heretofore made therefrom and, without loss of priority, to hereafter use the water for municipal purposes within the City of Ashland, within Sections 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 23, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W.M., from a point of diversion located 100 feet North and 10 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 20, being within the SE^{1}_{4} of Section 20, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in The Daily Tidings, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of April 26; May 3 and 10, 1978.

Mr. David C. Hendrix, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use, point of diversion and use of water may be made without injury to existing rights. No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use, point of diversion and use of water may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use, point of diversion and use of water, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right recorded at page 16034, Volume 13, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the City of Ashland.
