confirms the right of record to use the waters of DESCHUTES RIVER, tributary to the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 16.85 ACRES.

This right was confirmed under by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for DESCHUTES County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, at Page 282 and in Volume 16, at pages 1 and 390. The date of priority is OCTOBER 31, 1900 and DECEMBER 2, 1907.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of not to exceed the quantity determined by decree of the Circuit Court for Deschutes County, dated March 24, 1933, being;

Season 1 (limited to 1/80 cfs per acre): 0.211 cfs
 Season 2 (limited to 1/60 cfs per acre): 0.281 cfs
 Season 3 (limited to 1/32.4 cfs per acre): 0.520 cfs, being 0.371 cfs under the 1900 priority date and 0.149 cfs under the 1907 priority date

Season of use is April 1 through November 1, further limited as follows:
 April 1 to May 1 and October 1 to November 1 described as Season 1
 May 1 to May 15 and September 15 to October 1 described as Season 2
 May 15 to September 15 described as Season 3

The point of diversion is located as follows:

The quantities listed reflect allowance of a 45% transmission loss as determined by decree of the Circuit Court of Deschutes County, dated March 24, 1933

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

To prevent injury to instream water right Certificate 59778, water shall not be diverted for the allowed use whenever, during the irrigation season, flows in the Deschutes River at the point of diversion drop below 660 cfs.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

This order is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION and PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered August 3, 2005, at Special Order Volume 66, Page 19, approving Transfer Application 9849, affecting a portion of Certificate 76358, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that it is necessary for record keeping.
