# Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

# **Findings of Fact**

#### Background

- 1. On March 14, 2013, Robert C. and Sharon E. Richards, Southern Cross Ltd, and Douglas Kinsley, filed an application to change the points of diversion under Certificates 6271, 6587, and 6602. The Department assigned the application number T-11548.
- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on March 19, 2013, pursuant to OAR 690-380-5050. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 3. On May 31, 2013, the agent requested that the completion date of the transfer be extended until October 1, 2018.
- 4. On June 18, 2013, the Department sent a copy of the Draft Preliminary Determination proposing to deny Transfer Application T-11548 to the applicants. The applicants requested

that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.

- 5. On May 31, 2013, the agent for the applicants requested that the Department seek a recommendation from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife as to whether the Department should consent to injury of the instream water right pursuant to OAR 690-380-5050.
- 6. On August 1, 2013, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to deny Transfer Application T-11548 unless ODFW recommended consent to injury of an instream water right, and sent a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on August 6, 2013, and in the Walla Walla Union Daily Bulletin newspaper on August 16 and 23, 2013, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notices.
- 7. On August 5, 2013, a request was sent to ODFW for recommendations concerning consent to injury of the instream water right under Certificate 59537.
- 8. On May 6, 2014, a recommendation was received from ODFW for consent to injury.
- 9. Notice of ODFW's Consent to Injury recommendations was published on June 10, 2014, pursuant to OAR 690-380-5050. No comments or requests for a public meeting were filed in response to the notice.

19. On June 20, 2013, the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screen is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screen. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost-share funds.

# Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 20. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 21. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-11548.
- 22. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 23. An instream water right, Certificate 59537, exists for the reach of the river in which the authorized points of diversion would be moved upstream, and streamflows within the reach are frequently below the levels allocated under the instream water right. Thus, the instream water right would be injured as a result of the proposed changes in points of diversion.

# **Conclusions of Law**

Based upon the recommendation of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Department consents to injury of the instream water rights evidenced by Certificate 59537. The changes in points of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-11548 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

# Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The changes in points of diversion proposed in application T-11548 are approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 6271, 6587, and 6602 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right certificates 6271, 6587, and 6602 are cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of Certificate 6602 that was not affected by this transfer.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.

- 5. Water use measurement conditions:
  - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install, with prior approval of the Director, a weir, submerged orifice or another suitable measuring device, at the proposed point of diversion (Sam and Miles diversion).
  - b. The water user shall maintain the measuring device in good working order.
  - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the measuring device; provided however, where the measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department. The water user shall maintain the headgate as required by the Department.
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion and shall provide to the OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary.
  - The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.
- 8. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2018**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- 9. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.
