## ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND USE

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 8428 submitted by

BRIDGE WATER DISTRICT 98405 CARLA LANE MYRTLE POINT, OREGON 97458.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by Certificate 7561, was perfected under Permit 7905 with a date of priority of APRIL 13, 1927. The right allows the use of A SPRING FLOWING INTO SALMON CREEK, a tributary of MIDDLE FORK COQUILLE RIVER, for DOMESTIC USE. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.1 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2).

Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described

The applicant proposes to change the place of use to:

The applicant also proposes to change the use from domestic to quasi-municipal.

THESE CHANGES TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 2002.
- When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- The former place of domestic use shall not utilize this water right.

Certificate 7561 is canceled. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
