ORDER

On February 23, 1989, Arthur Reiff, City Manager, City of Baker, submitted an affidavit that the City of Baker is the owner of a certain water right and the land to which the water right is appurtenant; that the City of Baker has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and request the same be canceled.

The water right in question is a right established by Decree of the Circuit Court for Baker County, entered March 18, 1918, in the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Water of the Powder River and its tributaries, tabulated in the name of M.S. Bond at page 291, Volume 6, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, and is for the use of not to exceed 2.283 cubic foot per second from the Powder River for domestic, stock and the irrigation of 40.0 acres in the NE1/4 NE1/4, 7.9 acres in the NW1/4 NE1/4, 3.4 acres SW1/4 NE1/4, and 40.0 acres in the SE1/4 NE1/4, Section 28, Township 8 South, Range 40 East, W.M., under apriority date of November, 1899.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Commission that the water right has been abandoned by the owner and that the owner desires cancellation thereof, the commission shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the said water right being the right described by the certificate recorded at page 4005, Volume 5, State Record of Water Rights Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
