


Conclusions of Law

The additional point of appropriation proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-12346 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.211.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The additional point of appropriation proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-12346 is approved.
2. Permit G-17619, in the name of John and Karen Carter, is issued to replace Permit G-17459, and incorporates the amendments approved by this order. Permit G-17459, in the name of John and Karen Carter, is no longer of any force or effect.
3. The combined quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the old point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.
4. Measurement devices, and recording/reporting of annual water use conditions:
 - A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter at each point of appropriation. The permittee shall maintain the device in good working order.
 - B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the device; provided however, where any device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
 - C. The permittee shall keep a complete record of the volume of water diverted each month, and shall submit a report which includes water-use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.
 - D. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring and reporting procedures for review and approval.
5. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.
6. All other terms and conditions of Permit G-17459 remain the same.
