confirms the right of record to use the waters of POWDER RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF SNAKE RIVER for IRRIGATION OF 18.4 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES.

This right was perfected under Permit 32932. The date of priority is June 19, 1958. This right is limited to 0.96 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation, and measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The points of diversion are located as follows:

9 S	40 E	WM	8	NE NE	POINT 18 (ESTES WEST) (ADDITIONAL) - 110 FEET SOUTH AND 600 FEET WEST FROM NE CORNER, SECTION 8

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent from direct flow, and 3.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from both direct flow and stored water, provided further that the right allowed herein shall limit the use of stored water only on the lands described as Supplemental Irrigation from storage.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**


This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described.

This order is issued to confirm AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered September 27, 2006, at Special Order Volume 70, Page 272, approving Transfer Application 8697, affecting a portion of Certificate 73610, State record of Water Right Certificates.

The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that it is necessary for record keeping.
