Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

1. On June 19, 2017, SCHLICHTING CENTURY FARM LLC and BAGGENSTOS FARMS, INC. filed an application to change the point of diversion and to change the place of use under Certificate 23580. The Department assigned the application number T-12699.
2. SCHLICHTING CENTURY FARM LLC is the receiving landowner who will be responsible for completion of the changes.
3. Notice of the application for transfer was published on June 27, 2017, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
4. On August 28, 2018, the applicant's agent contacted the Department by telephone to discuss the status of T-12699. The Department requested the applicant's agent revise the application to include Permit S-49958, which is supplemental to Certificate 23580.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

5. On September 10, 2018, the applicant submitted a revised application and map to include Permit S-49958.
6. On September 12, 2018, the Department contacted the applicant's agent by written correspondence to notify the agent of the deficiencies in the application. The Department requested that the deficiencies be resolved by September 26, 2018.
7. On September 17, 2018, the applicant submitted a revised Table 1 and 2 for both rights, and a revised map, which corrected the deficiency.
8. On October 26, 2018, the Department approved an extension of time, for Permit S-49958, for complete application of water to October 1, 2023.
9. On November 9, 2018, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-12699 to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of December 10, 2018, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
10. On January 31, 2019, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer T-12699 and mailed a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on February 5, 2019, and in the Oregonian newspaper on March 29, and April 5, 2019, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.

11. The portion of the first right to be transferred is as follows:

Use: IRRIGATION of 37.2 ACRES
Priority Date: JANUARY 30, 1952
Rate: 0.47 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND
Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

Priority Date: JANUARY 4, 1984

Rate: 0.43 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

18. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

19. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of Certificate 23580. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
20. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under Certificate 23580 was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12699.
21. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of Certificate 23580 or Permit S-49958.
22. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
23. The changes do not alter any other terms of Permit S-49958.
24. All other application requirements are met.

Conclusions of Law


The change in point of diversion and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12699 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The change in point of diversion and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12699 is approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 23580 and Permit S-49958 and any related decree.
3. Water right Certificate 23580 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
4. Permit S-55171, in the name of Tualatin Valley Irrigation District, is issued to replace Permit S-49958, and incorporates the amendments approved by this order, and the extension of time. Permit S-49958, in the name of Tualatin Valley Irrigation District, is no longer of any force or effect.
5. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.
6. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion (new and existing).
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.

8. The former place of use of the transferred right under Certificate 23580 and Permit S-49958 shall no longer receive water under the right, and permit.
9. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2020**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
10. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right under Certificate 23580 transferred will be issued.
