Lands on which water is to be used is part of that described as follows: Lot 18, 1 house: Reeher's Tracts.

- In more recent years the lands to which this water right is pertinent have been assigned tax lot numbers. The tax lot number for the lands involved in this transfer is 2100.
- Transfer Application T-13231 proposes an additional point of diversion approximately 1500 feet downstream on the Wilson River to:

- The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has determined that a fish screen is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion to prevent fish from entering that diversion and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screen. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost-share funds.

***Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]***

- Water has been used within the five-year period prior to submittal of the transfer application according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- A diversion pump and pipeline sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-13231. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
- The original point of diversion is located on Hatch Creek which is a tributary of the Wilson River. Water flows from Hatch Creek into the Wilson River and will be picked up at the additional point of diversion.
- All other application requirements are met.

**Conclusions of Law**

The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-13231 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000. If protests are not filed pursuant to OAR 690-380-4030, the transfer application will be approved.

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:**

1. The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-13231 are approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 24351 and any related decree.
3. Water right Certificate 24351 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available in Hatchery Creek at the original point of diversion.
5. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion and shall provide to the OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary.  
The water user shall operate and maintain the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.
6. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2022**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
7. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
