Now at this time the above entitled matter coming on for consideration by the State Engineer on the application of George W. Brock, by his agent, W. S. Brock, for the approval of a change in place of use of water from Hurricane Creek and it appearing that by decree of the Court for Wallowa County dated January 20, 1919, a water right was recognized in the name of the Alder Slope Ditch Company, among other lands, 34.5 acres in NW2NE2 and 1.0 acre in the NE2NW2, Section 16, Township 2 South, Range 44 East, W. M., with a priority date of November 30, 1901.

The applicant proposes to transfer 4.5 acres from the NW4NE4 and 1.0 acre from the NE4NW4, same section, township and range, to a 5.5-acre tract in SW4NE4, Section 16, Township 2 South, Range 44 East, W. M.

The Alder Slope Ditch Company, a party of interest, and K. K. Baxter, mortgagor of the land from which the water is being transferred, have submitted their approval in writing to the transfer.

It further appears that the proposed transfer will inure to the benefit of the applicant in the production of crops and that such transfer will not be an injury to existing rights;
