IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF ROSEBURG LUMBER COMPANY FOR THE APPROVAL OF A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER FROM SOUTH FORK UMPQUA RIVER

ORDER

APPROVING APPLICATION

On August 7, 1962, Roseburg Lumber Company of Roseburg, Oregon, filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from South Fork Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to Roseburg Lumber Company and recorded at page 17297, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right under Permit No. 16335 for the use of 1.34 cubic feet per second of the waters of South Umpqua River and reservoir for the maintenance of a log pond in the NW¹/₄, NW¹/₄, Lot 6 (SW¹/₄ NW¹/₄), Lot 7 (SE¹/₄ NW¹/₄), and SW¹/₄ NW¹/₄, SE¹/₄ NW¹/₄, NE¹/₄ SW¹/₄, as projected in M. C. McCloud D. L. C. No. 41, Section 33, and NE¹/₄ NE¹/₄ and SF¹/₄ NE¹/₄, Section 32, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M., with a date of priority of May 16, 1945. The water is conveyed to the log pond by means of a pumping plant, the point of diversion of said pumping plant being located 1500 feet North and 1150 feet West from the S¹/₄ corner of Section 33, and being within the NE¹/₄ SW¹/₄, as projected in M. C. McCloud D. L. C. No. 41, within Section 33, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to convey the water for the maintenance of the log pond by means of a pumping plant, the point of diversion of said pumping plant to be located 900 feet North and 160 feet West from the S_{+}^{1} corner of Section 33, and being within the SE_{+}^{1} SW₂, said Section 33, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M.

Notice by publication as provided by ORS 540.520 was not given in connection with this application for the reason said section provides notice is not required on an application for a change in point of diversion of water of less than one-fourth mile where there are no intervening diversions.

Mr. C. O. Bartels, Watermaster of District No. 15, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion of water from South Fork Umpqua River, to-wit:

From a point located 1500 feet North and 1150 feet West from the S^1_{τ} corner of Section 33, and being within the NE^1_{τ} SW $^1_{\tau}$, said Section 33, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M., as projected within M. C. McCloud D. L. C. No. 41,

To a point to be located 900 feet North and 160 feet West from the St corner of Section 33, and being within the SEt SWt, said Section 33, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M.

for the maintenance of a log pond in the NW¹₄ NW¹₄, Lot 6 (SW¹₄ NW¹₄), Lot 7 (SE¹₄ NW¹₄), and SW¹₄ NW¹₄, SE¹₄ NW¹₄, NE¹₄ SW¹₄, NW¹₄ SW¹₄, as projected in M. C. McCloud D. L. C. No. 41, Section 33, and NE¹₄ NE¹₄ and SE¹₄ NE¹₄, Section 32, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W. M., with a date of priority of May 16, 1945, be and the same is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1963, or within such extension of time as may be granted by the State Engineer for good cause shown.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water that is available at the old point of diversion.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

That the pumping plant and related works shall include a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the plans of the weir or other suitable device be approved by the watermaster of Douglas County, Oregon, before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.
