## ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 7684 submitted by

ROBIN L. WALLING REVOCABLE LIVING TRUST ROBIN L. WALLING, TRUSTEE 80490 UMATILLA RIVER ROAD HERMISTON, OREGON 97838.

The right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UMATILLA County as modified by re: Waters of Umatilla River, 88 OR 376, and tabulated in the name of the United States of America. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 3, at Page 127. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 25, 1904 for DIRECT FLOW and SEPTEMBER 6, 1905 for STORED WATER FROM COLD SPRINGS RESERVOIR.

This is a final order in other than contested case. Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 and OAR 690-01-005 you may either petition the Director for reconsideration of this order or petition for judicial review of this order. As provided in ORS 536.075, this order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review of the order must be filed within the time specified by ORS 183.484(2).

The right allows the use of the UMATILLA RIVER and COLD SPRINGS RESERVOIR, tributaries of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION and SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION of 2.2 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second from direct flow, and 6.60 Acre Feet from stored water, subject to the provisions of Paragraph 33 of the Decree, if available at the authorized points of diversion: MAXWELL CANAL - NW¼ SW¼, SECTION 28, T 4 N, R 28 E, WM; and COLD SPRINGS DAM - SE¼ NW¼, SECTION 3, T 4 N, R 29 E, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The waters may be used jointly and interchangeably upon the lands described hereunder.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

NE% NE% 2.2 ACRES

SECTION 9

TOWNSHIP 4 NORTH, RANGE 28 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

The applicant proposes to change the place of use to:

NW% SE% 2.2 ACRES

SECTION 33

TOWNSHIP 5 NORTH, RANGE 28 EAST, W.M.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion for direct flow from the Maxwell Canal to:

NE% SW%, SECTION 33, T 5 N, R 28 E, WM; 1955 FEET NORTH AND 2400 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 33.

THESE CHANGES TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 2001.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.
- 3. The water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an inline flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. Prior to delivery of stored water, the irrigation district shall install and maintain a headgate and measuring device, as needed, at the point the stored water is discharged into the Umatilla River for delivery to the water user, in accordance with an agreement between the irrigation district and Watermaster. The irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.
- 5. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water sources as the original points of diversion.
- 6. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as a part of this water right.

7. The water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The water user may participate in the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's cost sharing program for installation of screening and by-pass devices in accordance withORS 540.525.

When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
