AUTHORITY

ORS 537.455 to 537.500 and chapter 726, Oregon Laws 1997 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request for an allocation of conserved water. OAR Chapter 690, Division 18 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating allocation of conserved water applications.


On July 18, 2002, Steve Casebeer filed an application for Allocation and Use of Conserved Water for certificates 2271 and 4782. The Department assigned the application number C-20.

On December 18, 2002, the Department received a letter from Mr. Casebeer indicating that he had sold the land associated with the Allocation of Conserved Water Application to Earl Wiersma and Tom DeJong. On December 28, 2004, the Department received a letter from Mr. Wiersma and Mr. DeJong requesting the withdrawal of Allocation of Conserved Water Application, C-20.

Allocation of Conserved Water Application C-20 is withdrawn and of no further force of effect. There were no fees associated with this application.
