T-12450, Washington County) CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE

Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

1. On July 29, 2016, JAMES M. AND JUDITH MAR ZALESKI, filed an application to change the place of use under an order of satisfactory proof as evidence by Special Order Volume 67 Page 627. The Department assigned the application number T-12450.
2. On August 11, 2015, Certificate 88122 was issued in the name of U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION.
3. Transfer Application T-12450 proposes to transfer a water right within the boundaries of Tualatin Valley Irrigation District (TVID). On April 5, 2016, the Applicant notified the district of the proposed transfer and provided TVID's concurrence with the proposed transfer.
4. Transfer Application T-12450 proposes to transfer a water right served by a Bureau of Reclamation storage project. On August 4, 2016, the Bureau was notified of the proposed transfer and did not provide any comments.
5. Notice of the application for transfer was published on August 9, 2016, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

6. On August 22, 2017, the Department contacted the Applicant's agent by phone regarding a deficiency with the application map.
7. On September 29, 2017, the agent for the Applicant submitted an updated map sufficient to satisfy the deficiency.
8. On December 14, 2017, the Department e-mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-12450 to the agent for the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of January 14, 2018, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
9. On March 22, 2018, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer T-12450 and emailed a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on March 27, 2018, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.
10. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 88122 in the name of the U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION
(perfected under Permit S-35792)

Use: IRRIGATION of 10.0 ACRES

Priority Date: FEBRUARY 20, 1963

Rate: 0.12 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year from direct flow and storage from the reservoir constructed under permit R-5777 and as evidenced by Certificate 81149; provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein. The right is further limited to the use of stored water on the lands described as supplemental irrigation.

Source: Scoggins Creek, Scoggins Reservoir/Henry Hagg Lake (constructed under Permit R-5777), and Gales Creek, Tributaries to the Tualatin River and the Tualatin River, tributary to the Willamette River.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

12. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
13. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12450.
14. The proposed change as conditioned would not result in enlargement of the right.
15. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
16. All other application requirements are met.


Conclusion of Law

The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12450 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

1. The change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12450 is approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 88122 and any related decree.
3. Certificate 88122 is modified. The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that it is necessary for record keeping.

4. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. **Before water use may begin** under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion (new and existing)
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
5. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
6. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2028**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
