ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 7598 submitted by

FARMERS IRRIGATION DISTRICT 1985 COUNTRY CLUB ROAD HOOD RIVER, OREGON 97031.

The first right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for HOOD RIVER County as evidenced by Certificate 46954. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 17, at Page 333. The date of priority is 1874, DECEMBER 19, 1892, AND OCTOBER 6, 1902.

The right allows the use of DITCH CREEK AND DEAD POINT CREEK, tributaries of HOOD RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES THROUGH THE HIGH LINE CANAL. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.25 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.04 CFS FROM DITCH CREEK WITH A PRIORITY OF 1874, 0.13 CFS FROM DEAD POINT CREEK WITH A PRIORITY OF DECEMBER 19, 1892, AND 0.08 CFS FROM DEAD POINT CREEK WITH A PRIORITY OF OCTOBER 6, 1902, if

The date of priority is 1891 - DITCH CREEK AND PARKER SPRINGS, AND 1899 - NORTH FORK GREEN CREEK AND SPRING AT CAMP NO. 4.

The right allows the use of DITCH CREEK AND PARKER SPRINGS, NORTH FORK GREEN POINT CREEK AND SPRING AT CAMP NO. 4, tributaries of HOOD RIVER, for PRIMARY IRRIGATION OF 1.3 ACRES AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES THROUGH THE GREEN POINT CANAL. amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.053 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.011 CFS FROM DITCH CREEK AND PARKER SPRINGS AND 0.042 CFS FROM NORTH FORK GREEN CREEK AND SPRING AT CAMP NO. 4, if available at the authorized points of diversion: SE¼ SE¼, NE¼ SW¼, SECTION 14, LOT 7(NE¼ SW1/4), SECTION 30, NW1/4 NE1/4, SECTION 32, T 2 N, R 9 E, W.M.; DITCH CREEK - 1820 FEET SOUTH AND 1270 FEET WEST FROM THE E1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 14, PARKER SPRINGS - 1760 FEET NORTH AND 1480 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 14, NORTH FORK GREEN CREEK -6940 FEET NORTH AND 14820 FEET WEST, 6820 FEET NORTH AND 14720 FEET WEST, SPRING AT CAMP NO. 4 - 4400 FEET NORTH AND 8100 FEET WEST, ALL THREE FROM THE SE CORNER OF THE SW1/4, SECTION 34, T 2 N, R 9 E, W.M., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The remainder of these rights are described in Special Order Volume 51, Page 860, said order issued in accordance with ORS 541.329.

THIS CHANGE TO EXISTING WATER RIGHTS MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 2001.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion, together with that diverted at the old points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. When required by the Department, the water user or irrigation district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

- 5. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water sources as the original points of diversion.
- 6. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as a part of these water rights.

Certificates 46954 and 46956 are cancelled. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming these water rights will be issued.
