On February 22, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Phillip A. Hawman for changes in place of use and point of diversion under an existing water right of record, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Pursuant to the provisions of ORS 537.260(2) proof has been made to the satisfaction of the Water Resources Director that a right has been perfected under the terms of permit No. 36861, in the name of Phillip A. Hawman, which includes the use of not to exceed 0.75 cubic foot per second from Yamhill River for irrigation of 3.4 acres in NE½ SW½, 2.2 acres in SE½ SW½, 5.2 acres in NE½ SE½, 22.0 acres in NW½ SE½, 16.0 acres in SW½ SE½ and 11.4 acres in SE½ SE½ of Section 9, Township 4 South, Range 3 West, W.M., with a date of priority of April 19, 1972.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 4530 feet. South and 10 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 9, being within the SE4 SE4 of Section 9, Township 4 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to sever the right therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 38.0 acres in SW4 SW4 and 19.0 acres in SE4 SW4 of Section 9; and 3.2 acres in NE4 NW4 of Section 16, Township 4 South, Range 2 West, by a diversion of water from a point located 1440 feet South and 1050 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 16, being within the SE4 NE4 of Section 16, Township 4 South, Range 3 West. W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in the Dayton Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Yamhill County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of April 7, 14 and 21, 1977.

Mr. Benjamin E. Monroe, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.75 cubic feet per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred

shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that a certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding, and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
