ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 TO 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves TRANSFER 6420 submitted by

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to use the waters of the SOUTH SANTIAM RIVER, a tributary of the SANTIAM RIVER, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 42.2 ACRES.

The right to be transferred, as evidenced by certificate 30007, was perfected under Permit 24238 with a date of priority of MAY 23, 1956. This right is limited to 0.53 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion: SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 33, T 10 S, R 2 W, W.M., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The new point of diversion is located as follows:

NW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 33, T 10 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 1310 FEET SOUTH AND 2000 FEET WEST FROM THE NE CORNER OF SECTION 33.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 20.4 ACRES
SE 1/4 NE 1/4 21.8 ACRES
SECTION 33
TOWNSHIP 10 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.


The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.
3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Certificate 30007 is hereby canceled. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
