DIVERSION OF WATER FROM LUCKIAMUTE
RIVER

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3035

On May 7, 1974, James H. Johnson filed an application in the office of the Water Resources Director for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Luckiamute River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to R. Schmelz and recorded at page 20658, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right to the use of not to exceed 0.38 cubic foot per second of water from Luckiamute River for the irrigation of, among other lands, 2.7 acres in SW2 SE2 and 7.6 acres in SE2 SE2, Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of June 21, 1948. These lands are irrigated from a point of diversion located 1375 feet North and 1500 feet West from the Southwest corner of Section 30, being within the NW2 SE2, Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located 800 feet North and 250 feet West from the Southeast corner of DIC 41, being within the SE2 SE2, Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Notice by publication as provided by ORS 540.520 was not given in connection with this application for the reason said section provides notice is not required on an application for a change in point of diversion of water of less than one-fourth mile where there are no intervening diversions.

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Mr. Gene McGinnis, Watermaster of District No. 2, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from Luckiamute River, to wit:

From a point located 1375 feet North and 1500 feet West from the Southwest corner of Section 30, being within the NW4 SE4 of Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

To a point to be located 800 feet North and 250 feet West from the Southeast corner of DLC 41, being within the SE4 SE4 of Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

for the irrigation of 2.7 acres in SW2 SE2 and 7.6 acres in SE2 SE1,
Section 30, Township 10 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority
of June 21, 1948, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1976.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.13 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to R. Schmelz and recorded at page 20658, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the lands not involved in this proceeding, and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of the authorized change in point of diversion, a certificate of water right shall be issued to James H. Johnson confirming the change in point of diversion.
