ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE, POINT OF APPROPRIATION,
AND DIMINUTION OF A WATER RIGHT

Pursuant to ORS 537.705, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 7146 submitted by

PAUL BOWERS
GENERAL DELIVERY
FORT ROCK, OREGON 97735.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by Certificate 68449, was perfected under Permit G-10760 with a date of priority of FEBRUARY 3 1987. The right allows the use of A WELL, in the FORT ROCK BASIN, for IRRIGATION OF 144.7 ACRES. The right is limited to 1.81 cubic foot per second, if available at the original well; NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 14, T 26 S, R 13 E, WM; 210 FEET SOUTH AND 1302 FEET EAST FROM THE W $\frac{1}{4}$ CORNER, SECTION 14, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is as follows:

SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$	26.1 ACRES
NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$	34.8 ACRES

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$	9.5 ACRES

SECTION 14
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

TOWNSHIP 28 SOUTH, RANGE 14 EAST, W.M.

The applicant proposes to change the point of appropriation to:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 13, T 28 S, R 14 E, WM; 10 FEET NORTH AND 55 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 13.


THESE CHANGES TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1996.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (well) shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of appropriation.
3. When required by the Department the water user shall install an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water used. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
4. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.
5. The former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as part of this water right.
6. This water right shall become supplemental to the water right perfected under Permit 11656, evidenced by Water Right Certificate 49857.
7. In the interest of conserving stored water, this water right may be exercised to satisfy the primary water right provided that the total quantity of water diverted from groundwater does not exceed ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet, and the quantity of water diverted from all sources does not exceed ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet, for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year

Certificate 68449 is cancelled. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
