On February 3, 1987, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Jane L. and Rena F. Neuner for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Rogue River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 55225, Volume 50, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of David M. Welch, et al, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.0125 cubic foot per second from Rogue River, for irrigation of a certain 1.0 acre in SE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 15, Township 34 South, Range I West, WM with a date of priority of May 7, 1937.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 340 feet North and 3240 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 15, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 15, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom to a point located 1054 feet North and 510 feet West from the South Quarter Corner of Section 15, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 15, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, WM.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper having general circulation in the area in which the water right is located, for a period of three weeks in the issues of February 13, 20 and 27, 1987.

Bruce R. Sund, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.0125 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the right to divert water from the point described in Certificate 55225 is hereby canceled, and water shall be used from the new diversion point on or before October 1, 1988.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 55225, Volume 50, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
