AMENDED ORDER

Now at this time this matter coming on, on the petition of Santiam Reclamation Company and Western Oregon Development Company, for the correction of clerical errors in the former order entered in this matter on the 23rd day of March, 1925, and after due consideration it appearing that said petition should be granted, it is hereby ORDERED that said former order be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:


"Now at this time this matter coming on for consideration by the State Engineer, on the application of the Santiam Reclamation Company and the Western Oregon Development Company, and the application of E. L. Thompson and associates, for an extension of time in which to complete construction work and completely apply the water to the proposed use under Permits Nos. E.82 and 1401, and it appearing that the time as heretofore fixed for the completion of such rights expired Oct. 1, 1920, and after full hearing on this matter held in Salem, Oregon, on January 15, 1925, the State Engineer being of the opinion that a sufficient showing of diligence in the prosecution of work under said permits has been made,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the time within which construction work shall be completed and the water completely applied to the proposed use under said permits Nos. E.82 and 1401, be, and the same is hereby, extended to Oct. 1, 1926.

And the State Engineer being of the opinion that the right of any owner of land in this State to appropriate water for the irrigation of his

own land is inherent, it is further ORDERED that Application No. 9789, of Henry C. Porter, Trustee, be duly approved when the same has been completed so as to conform to the regulations of this office."
