Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

ORS 540.621 establishes the process for the owner of land to which a water right is appurtenant to certify under oath that the water right, or a portion thereof, has been abandoned and to voluntarily request that it be cancelled.

Findings of Fact

Background

- 1. On December 7, 1998, Larry Winn in conjunction with Illinois Valley Soil and Water Conservation District filed an application to change the point of diversion, place of use and character of use under Certificates 2728, 6113, 10110, 19989, 57716 and 79469. The Department assigned the application number T-8126.
- 2. On April 9, 2007, an assignment was recorded in the records of the Department assigning John Bayless, owner of Little Elm Ranch to Transfer Application T-8126.
- 3. On March 15, 2007, the applicant submitted a revised map and application, identifying a change in point of diversion only.
- 4. On May 13, 2007, the applicant submitted another revised map, identifying additional acreage involved in the change in point of diversion and submitted affidavits of partial cancellation and diminution.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- 19. Notice of the application for transfer was published on, December 15, 1998, pursuant to OAR 690-015-080. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 20. On May 15, 2007, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-8126 to the applicant and the applicant's agent. The cover letter that accompanied the draft Preliminary Determination set forth a deadline of June 15, 2007, for the applicant to respond. The applicant's agent requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 21. On June 20, 2007, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-8126 and mailed a copy to the applicant and the applicant's agent. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on June 26, 2007 as per OAR 690-380-4020. Notice of the proposed transfer has been previously published in the Illinois Valley News newspaper on February 17, 24 and March 3, 1999, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-0090(5). No protests were filed in response to the notices.
- 22. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 23. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights, and there is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 24. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-8126.
- 25. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 26. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

Partial Cancellation of a Water Right

Partial Diminution of a Water Right

28. An affidavit certifying that a portion of a water right was requested to be diminished to Supplemental Irrigation and was received from Dalton Straus, Agent for Little Elm Ranch. The right to be diminished is as follows:

Conclusion of Law

The change in point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-8126 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000, the abandoned right should be cancelled, and the portion of the right described in Finding of Fact #26 should be diminished.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The change in point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-8126 is approved. The portion of the right that has been abandoned is cancelled.
- 2. The portion of the right requested to be diminished in Finding of Fact # 28 is diminished to Supplemental Irrigation and shall no longer be used as Primary Irrigation.
- 3. Water right certificates 2728, 6113, 10110, 19989, 57716 and 79469 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing those portions of the rights not affected by this transfer and cancellation.
- 4. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 2728, 6113, 10110, 19989, 57716 and 79469 and any related decree.
- 5. The quantity of water diverted at the new points of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning

- construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department. The water user shall maintain and operate the measuring device as required by the Department.
- 8. When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 9. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before October 1, 2010. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
- 10. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.
