ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER NO. 3747

On August 8, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Fred Currie for approval of a change in point of diversion from South Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 24411, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of G. N. Weaver, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second from South Umpqua River for irrigation of 0.2 acre in NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, 0.2 acre in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, 1.7 acres in SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and 0.9 acres in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of February 14, 1950.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1045 feet North and 1065 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 5, being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 760 feet North and 1280 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 6, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 6.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in The News-Review, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Douglas County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of October 17, 24 and 31, 1977.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring device:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to G. N. Weaver and recorded at page 24411, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding, and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant therein.
