On March 14, 1978, R.W. Schram submitted an affidavit that he is the owner of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that he has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and requests the same be canceled.

The water right in question is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 35485, Volume 27, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Riverview Ditch Association, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.3 cubic foot per second of water from Thomas Creek, with a date of priority of May 20, 1952, for irrigation of 24.5 acres in SW 1/4 SW 1/4, as projected within Calavan DLC 65, Section 22, Township 10 South, Range 2 West, WM.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Commission that the water right has been abandoned by the owner and that the owner desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Commission shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 35485, Volume 27, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
