IN THE MATTER OF THE CANCELATION OF A WATER RIGHT

ORDER

On July 25, 1967, Mrs. Nellie Kuhn submitted an affidavit that she is the owner of the SET NET and NOT NET, Section 3, Township 2 South, Range 38 East, W.M., and the water right appurtenant thereto; that she has abandoned any and all interest in and to said water right and request the same to be canceled.

The water right in question was established by Decree of the Circuit Court for Union County in the Determination of the Relative Rights of the Various Claimants to the Use of the Waters of Grande Ronde River and its tributaries, entered August 8, 1925, for the use of not to exceed three acre feet per acre in any irrigation season, diverted at the rate of not to exceed one-fortieth of a cubic foot per second per acre, for the irrigation of 10.0 acres in WE and 10.0 acres in SE WE, Section 3, Township 2 South, Range 38 East, V.M., in the name of Lehi Wright and confirmed by certificate of water right recorded at page 6499, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, with a date of priority of 1872.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the State Engineer that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancelation thereof, the State Engineer shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby CRDERED that the right to the use of not to exceed three acre feet per acre in any irrigation season, diverted at the rate of not to exceed one-fortieth of a cubic foot per second per acre, of the waters of Grande Ronde River for the irrigation of 10.0 acres in \mathbb{HE}_{+}^{1} and 10.0 acres in \mathbb{E}_{+}^{1} NE $_{+}^{1}$, Section 3, Township 2 South, Range 38 East, $\mathbb{W}.M.$, with a date of priority of 1872, in the name of Lehi Wright, as

evidenced by certificate of water right recorded at page 6499, Volume 6, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.
