ORDER

On October 30, 1979, Thomas J. Willett submitted an affidavit that he is the owner of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that he has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and request the same be canceled.

The water right in question was established by Decree of Circuit Court for Wallowa County, entered January 20, 1919, in the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights of the Use of the Waters of Wallowa River, tabulated in the name of Estate of Addison L. Tulley, at Page 197, Volume 5, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, and is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at Page 3163, Volume 4, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Estate of Addison L. Tulley, and is for the use of not to exceed 1½ acre feet per acre during any period of 30 days prior to July 31st of each year, and there after not to exceed 1 acre foot per acre during the entire remainder of the irrigation season, with a date of priority of 1900, for irrigation of 2.0 acres in the NW4 SW4 of Section 20, Township 1 North, Range 43 East, W.M.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Director that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Director shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at Page 3163, Volume 4, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of the water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
