FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Pursuant to ORS 540.580, HERMISTON IRRIGATION DISTRICT, 366 East Hurlburt Ave., Hermiston, OR, 97838, petitioned the Oregon Water Resources Department to permanently change the place of use of water within the boundaries of the irrigation district. The petition was received on February 7, 2002, and included the required fees.
2. The Department assigned the petition transfer application number T-9028.
3. The Department published notice of receipt of the petition in the Department's Weekly Notice dated February 25, 2002. The petition was noticed as a transfer within irrigation district boundaries.
4. No comments or timely protests were received in response to the published notice.
5. The right proposed to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Umatilla County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 3, at Page 127, as modified in re: Waters of Umatilla River, 88 OR 376; and as further modified by orders of the Water Resources Director approving the transfer of water rights.

The date of priority is November 14, 1894, and February 25, 1904, for the use of natural flow of the Umatilla River through the Maxwell Canal; and September 6, 1905, for primary

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2).

Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

irrigation from the Umatilla River and supplemental irrigation from water stored in Cold Springs Reservoir. The waters may be used jointly and interchangeably upon the lands described by the decree.

For those lands comprised of loam or fine sand or fine textured soil the amount of water diverted for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated each year. For those lands comprised of coarse sand or loose gravel subsoil or loose coarse texture soil the amount of water diverted for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of one-fortieth of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 6.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated each year.

6. Hermiston Irrigation District petitioned to permanently change the place of use of primary irrigation with a 3.0 acre-foot duty under the Umatilla River Decree, diverted through the Maxwell Canal, appurtenant to 0.30 acres. The petition proposed to change the place of use from the location identified in Table 1 to the location listed in Table 2.

The right to use water for the above purposes is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree. The use also shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

7. Pursuant to ORS 540.574 and ORS 540.580, in reviewing the petition submitted by Hermiston Irrigation District, the Department has determined the following:
 - a) The petition contains the information required under ORS 540.574(3).
 - b) The petition meets the requirements of ORS 540.580.
 - c) The petition contains maps which are satisfactory to the Department and which the District certified as being accurate.
 - d) The petition includes the required statement from the District that it has on file, and available for review, written authorization from each landowner affected by the transfer.
 - e) The petition was filed prior to the end of the calendar year in which the change occurs as required under ORS 540.580(2).
 - f) The rate, duty, and total number of acres proposed for transfer do not exceed that of the water right subject to transfer.
 - g) The lands from which the water right would be moved by the proposed transfer will not continue to receive water under the water right.
 - g) The use authorized by the water right subject to transfer will not change; and
 - h) The proposed change in place of use will not result in injury to other water rights.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The petition submitted by Hermiston Irrigation District proposing permanent changes in place of use within district boundaries included the information, and satisfied the criteria, required by ORS 540.574(3).
2. The proposed transfer complies with the requirements of ORS 540.580.
3. The Director should approve the transfer because the petition satisfies the criteria and requirements of ORS 540.574(3) and ORS 540.580 resulting in no injury to other water rights.


ORDER

It is hereby ORDERED :

1. The proposed changes to the water right evidenced by the Umatilla River Decree (Volume 3, Page 127 and as modified) may be made provided the following conditions are met by the water user:
 - a. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 2004.
 - b. The former places of use shall no longer be irrigated as a part of this water right.

- c. Proof, to the satisfaction of the Director, that the changes approved by this order have been completed must be submitted by Hermiston Irrigation District, on or before October 1, 2005.
2. Except as modified herein, all other conditions and limitations of the Umatilla River Decree remain in effect.
3. When the Director determines that it is necessary, or to facilitate records keeping, new certificates will be issued to confirm all completed changes for which satisfactory proof has been made and to confirm that portion of the right not modified by this or any other order.
