) APPROPRIATION

Authority

ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of appropriation, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

Background

1. On August 4, 2011, WESLEY AND DONNA BOYER filed an application to change the point of appropriation under Certificate 83197. The Department assigned the application number T-11276.
2. On February 8, 2012, the applicant amended the application clarifying the place of use.
3. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 83197 in the name of DENNIS AND JUDITH CULP (perfected under Permit G-12416)
Use: IRRIGATION OF 1.5 ACRES
Priority Date: JUNE 7, 1994
Rate: 0.02 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND
Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

4. Transfer Application T-11276 proposes to move the authorized point of appropriation approximately 400 feet from the existing point of appropriation to:

Twp	Rng	Mer	Sec	Q-Q	Measured Distances
5 N	28 E	WM	36	NW SE	660 FEET SOUTH AND 1170 FEET EAST FROM THE C¼ CORNER OF SECTION 36

5. Notice of the application for transfer was published on August 9, 2011, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
6. On February 10, 2012, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11276 to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of March 14, 2012, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.
7. On February 15, 2014, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11276 and sent a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department’s weekly notice on February 21, 2012, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

8. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610. Certificate 83197 was issued on February 23, 2007.
9. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-11276.
10. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
11. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.


Conclusions of Law

The change in point of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-11276 appears to be consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The change in point of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-11276 is approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 83197 and any related decree.
3. Water right certificate 83197 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation.
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at the new point of appropriation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
6. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
7. The approved change shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2013**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
8. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
