IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF A.K.DRYBOROUGH FOR THE APPROVAL OF A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER

ORDER

Now at this time the above entitled matter coming on for consideration before the State Engineer and it appearing that Certificate of Water Right No. 3384 was issued to A. K. Dryborough, confirming his appropriation under Permit No. 114 for the irrigation of 30 acres in the SE\(^1_4\)SE\(^1_4\) of Section 20, 1 acre in the SW\(^1_4\)SW\(^1_4\) of Section 21, Township 6 South, Range 38 East, W. M., through the Pilcher-Dryborough Ditch from Anthony Creek, with a date of priority of July 7th, 1911, the point of diversion of said ditch being located 110 feet south and 440 feet east from the NW corner of the NE\(^1_4\)NW\(^1_4\) of Section 20, Township 6 South, Range 38 East, W. M.;

That the applicant herein proposes to change the present point of diversion from the Pilcher-Dryborough Ditch to that of the old Punch and Kellog Ditch, for the irrigation of 20 acres in the SE4SE4 of Section 20, Township 6 South, Range 38 East, W. M., the point of diversion of the old Punch and Kellog Ditch being located near the center of Section 20, Township 6 South, Range 38 East, W. M.;

It further appears that a notice of publication was published in the Haines Record, a newspaper having general circulation in Beker County, for a period of three weeks and not less than one publication each week, as provided by Section 47-712 Oregon Code 1950. No objections having been filed to the approval of the application and it appearing that existing rights would not be injured by the transfer;

Now, therefore, it is hereby ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water be and the same is hereby approved without loss of the priority heretofore established.
