OF A PORTION OF A WATER RIGHT ) ORDER  
IN THE NAME OF CHARLES D. WAVRA )

On March 13, 1986, Charles D. Wavra submitted an affidavit that he is the owner of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that he has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and requests the same be canceled.

The water right in question is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 46996, Volume 40, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Charles D. Wavra, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.31 cubic foot per second of water from a well, with a date of priority of March 18, 1976, for supplemental irrigation of 19.8 acres in SW 1/4 NE 1/4, 3.4 acres in SE 1/4 NW 1/4, 0.1 acre in NE 1/4 SW 1/4, and 1.4 acres in NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 15, Township 6 South, Range 1 West, WM.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Commission that the water right has been abandoned by the owner and that the owner desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Commission shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 46996, Volume 40, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
