On May 13, 1986, Donald W. and Kathryn K. Craft submitted an affidavit that they are the owners of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that they have abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and request the same be canceled.

The water right in question is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 42002, Volume 34, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Ovill C. and/or Ruby Z. Vogt, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.075 cubic foot per second of water from a well, with a date of priority of January 6, 1969, for irrigation of 0.9 acre in SE 1/4 NE 1/4, as projected within Ketchum DLC 47 and 5.1 acres in SE 1/4 NE 1/4, as projected within Driggs DLC 48, both in Section 16, Township 11 South, Range 2 West, WM.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Commission that the water right has been abandoned by the owner and that the owner desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Commission shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 42002, Volume 34, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
