ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER NO. 3894

On March 7, 1978, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Preston and Lillian Lindhorst for approval of a change in point of diversion from Fifteenmile Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 3418, Volume 4, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of E. D. Roberts, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.08 cubic foot per second from Fifteenmile Creek for irrigation of 6.0 acres in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 2 South, Range 12 East, W.M., with a date of priority of May 24, 1919.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Roberts Ditch, from a point located North 80 degrees 51 minutes West, 638 feet from the Southeast Corner of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, being within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 2 South, Range 12 East, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 220 feet North and 220 feet West from the Southeast Corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 2 South, Range 12 East, W.M. (Pump No. 1).

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in The Dalles Chronicle, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Wasco County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of May 23 and 30; and June 6, 1978.

Mr. Thomas J. Paul, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1980.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to E. D. Roberts and recorded at page 3418, Volume 4, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
