ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER 5797

On May 12, 1986, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Sandra M. twigg and Richard L. Twigg for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from an unnamed stream, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 16729, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Omer Vuysteke, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.08 cubic foot per second from an unnamed stream, for irrigation of a certain 6.3 acres in NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 36, Township 1 South, Range 3 West, WM, with a date of priority of August 26, 1944.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1900 feet North and 1230 feet East from the South Quarter Corner of Section 36, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 36, Township 1 South, Range 3 West, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom to a point located 1100 feet North and 134 feet West from the South Quarter corner of Section 36, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 36, Township 1 South, Range 3 West, WM. The change in point of diversion is reported to be completed.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Hillsboro Argus, a newspaper having general circulation in the area in which the water right is located, for a period of three weeks in the issues of May 22, 29 and June 5, 1986.

Clayton J. Gardner, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.08 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 16729, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.

NOTE: Approval of a water right transfer application does not confirm the status of the right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

A party may file objections and exceptions to the Proposed Order with the Water Resources Commission. Such objections and exceptions must be filed within 45 days from the date of service (date of mailing) of the Proposed Order on the party. The Commission will provide opportunity for oral argument in support of written objections and exceptions. If no objections and exceptions are filed within the time allowed, the Proposed Order will automatically become the Final Order of the Commission.

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
