O R D E RREVISING PANGBORN PERMIT

On May 2, 1947, Mr. Marvin Pangborn filed in the office of the State Engineer an application for a permit to appropriate 60 gallons of water per hour from Vaughan Creek for the irrigation of 2.1 acres.

Mr. Pangborn has just reported to the State Engineer that he now realizes that the 60 gallons per hour specified in his application was an error and that he intended to apply for 60 gallons per minute.

The fact that the applicant in his application described a $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch centrifugal pump with a 2 inch intake, powered by a 9 horse power engine, and the fact that he proposed to irrigate 2.1 acres of land indicates that his request for 60 gallons of water per hour was obviously an error because of the inadequacy of this quantity, which is equivalent to 1 gallon per minute.

The usual quantity of water allowed in a State Engineer's permit for the irrigation of land in the vicinity of Mr. Pangborn's appropriation is 1/80th cubic foot per second per acre to be irrigated, which is equivalent to 5.6 gallons per minute.

No rights to the use of the water of Vaughan Creek have been initiated since Mr. Pangborn's application was filed.

It is believed that in consideration of the facts as set forth above, the quantity of water allowed in the permit in question should be increased to 0.026 cubic foot per second, with a priority of May 2, 1947 for 0.002 cubic foot per second, being the 60 gallons per hour originally allowed, and a priority

of July 26, 1950, being the date of Mr. Pangborn's request for revision, for the increase of 0.024 cubic foot per second; making a total of 0.026, which is the quantity usually allowed for the acreage described in the permit in question.

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ORDERED, that Permit No. 17732, in the name of Marvin Pangborn, be revised to allow use of water from Vaughan Creek in the amount of 0.002 cubic foot per second with a priority of May 2, 1947 and 0.024 cubic foot per second with a priority of July 26, 1950, to correct the obvious error in the application as originally filed and approved, and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the records be revised to correspond to the revised permit.
