ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6375 submitted by

FRED THOMAS AND KATHLEEN V. STARR 1205 OLD FERRY ROAD SHADY COVE, OREGON 97539.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 49684, was perfected under Permit 8776 with a date of priority of NOVEMBER 7, 1928. The right allows the use of ROGUE RIVER, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, for IRRIGATION OF 3.6 ACRES. This right is limited to 0.04 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: BRISTOW DITCH, SECTION 10, T 34 S, R 1 W, W.M., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

LOT 4 3.6 ACRES
SECTION 10
TOWNSHIP 34 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to:

LOT 4, SECTION 10, T 34 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 1155 FEET NORTH AND 30 FEET WEST FROM THE SOUTH & CORNER OF SECTION 10.

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.
- 3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Certificate 49684 has been cancelled. A new certificate will be issued to confirm that portion of the right NOT involved in this transfer and Transfer 6369. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
