**Authority**

ORS 537.348 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to lease an existing water right for instream purposes. OAR Chapter 690, Division 077 implements the statutes and provides the Department’s procedures and criteria for evaluating instream lease applications.

**Findings of Fact**

1. On April 27, 2011, the KBRT and Wood River Lodge filed an application to lease all of Certificate 20364 for instream use. The Department assigned the application number IL-1162.
2. On July 26, 2011, the Department issued an order approving Instream Lease IL-1162, as evidenced by Special Order Volume 84, Page 873. Following issuance of the order, it was identified that the order incorrectly describes the termination date. This order is being issued to correctly describe the termination date.
3. The right to be leased is as follows:

**Certificate:** 20364 in the name of J.P. McAuliffee  
**Use:** Irrigation of 25.4 acres  
**Priority Date:** October 27, 1952  
**Quantity:** **Rate:** 0.51 Cubic Foot per Second (CFS)  
**Duty:** 127.0 Acre-Feet (AF)  
**Limit:** One-fiftieth CFS per acre, not to exceed 5.0 AF per acre per year  
**Source:** Wood River, tributary to Upper Klamath Lake and Klamath River

**Authorized Point of Diversion (POD):**

**Authorized Place of Use:**

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

4. Certificate 20364 does not specify the irrigation season. However, the irrigation season pursuant to the Wood River Decree is April 1 to October 1.
5. The lease application includes the information required under OAR 690-077-0076(3). The Department provided notice of the lease application pursuant to OAR 690-077-0077(1). No comments were received.
6. The application requests to protect water instream during the period June 1 through October 1, a 123 day period. The instream period requires modification to prevent injury and enlargement. The instream period also requires modification to take advantage of the amounts requested to be protected instream. The last day of the irrigation season is September 30 and the instream period may not extend past the end of the irrigation season. In addition, at the rate and volume requested, water may be protected instream for 125 days, 2 days longer than the requested instream period.

7. The instream use has been modified and clarified from the lease application to prevent injury and enlargement and is as follows:  
Wood River, tributary to Upper Klamath Lake

**Instream Point:** At the POD (as described in Finding of Fact #3)

8. If approved, this instream lease is not reasonably expected to significantly affect land use as prescribed by ORS 197.180, OAR Chapter 660, Divisions 30 and 31, and OAR Chapter 690, Division 5.
9. Based upon review of the application, comments received, information provided by the Department's Watermaster, and other available information, the Department finds that the lease will not result in injury or enlargement. This finding is made through an abbreviated review recognizing that the lease may be modified or revoked under OAR 690-077-0077 if the Department later finds that the lease is causing injury to any existing water right or enlargement of the original right.
10. If a right which has been leased is later proposed to be leased again or transferred to an instream use under ORS 537.348 and OAR 690-077-0070 or OAR 690-077-0075 a new injury review shall be required. Transfers will be subject to a full and complete review to determine consistency with the requirements of OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 and Division 077. Approval of this lease does not establish a precedent for approval of future leases or transfers.
11. The Lessor has requested that the lease terminate on October 1, 2015. The last day of the irrigation season is September 1. The lease may terminate on September 30, 2015. The lease

will commence the date the final order is signed and on April 1 of each succeeding calendar year that the lease is in place.

12. The Lessor has requested the option of terminating the lease early with written notice to the Department.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department concludes that the lease will not result in injury or enlargement, OAR 690-077-0077. The lease conforms to the applicable provisions of OAR 690-077-0015.

### ORDER

Therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. That the Lease as described herein is APPROVED.
2. This correcting order supersedes Special Order Volume 84, Page 873.
3. The former place of use will no longer receive water as part of these rights, any supplemental rights, or any other layered water rights for irrigation use, including ground water registrations during the term of the lease.
4. The lease will terminate on September 30, 2015. For multiyear leases, the lease shall commence on approval of the instream lease and on April 1 of each succeeding calendar year of the instream lease. The lessor *shall* have the option of terminating the lease each year with written notice to the Department. The lease may be terminated at any time during the calendar year. However, if the termination request is received less than 30-days prior to the period of allowed instream use (May 29 through September 30) or after the period of allowed use has begun for the water right being leased, water shall not be used under the right leased until the following calendar year, unless the Director determines that enlargement would not occur.
