OF WATER FROM CANYON CREEK )  
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ORDER APPROVING  
TRANSFER NO. 4207

On April 25, 1979, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Margaret E. Adams for approval of an additional point of diversion of water from Canyon Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 25221, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Walter P. George, describes a right which includes the use of water from Canyon Creek for irrigation of a certain 2.0 acres in NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and 4.5 acres in NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 34, Township 15 South, Range 32 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1901.

Water for said right is diverted, through the Dore Mill Ditch, from a point located 1700 feet South and 1650 feet East from the Center Corner of Section 34, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 34, Township 15 South, Range 32 East, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to establish an additional point of diversion, without loss of priority, at a point located 280 feet South and 2450 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 34, being the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 34, Township 15 South, Range 32 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in The Blue Mountain Eagle, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Grant County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of May 3, 10 and 17, 1979.

Mr. Jerry Rodgers, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed additional point of diversion may be established without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed additional point of diversion may be established without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested additional point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not

exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the additional point of diversion of water established on or before October 1, 1980.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right recorded at page 25221, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
