O R D E R

On October 18, 1932, Fred Gray and Dora Glee Congleton, as provided by Section 47-712 Oregon Code, 1930, filed independent applications for a change in point of diversion of their water rights from Beaver Creek as awarded in the adjudication of the relative rights to the use of the waters of Crooked River and its tributaries. Subsequently C. S. Congleton, a water user from said creek, filed a protest to the allowance of the proposed change, contending that such would result in an injury to his right. On November 9, 1932, a hearing was held in the matter and evidence was received in support of and against the change. Prior to the decision of the State Engineer the parties to the contest entered into an agreement disposing of the points in controversy. The matter thus being satisfactorily settled by the terms and provisions of said agreement, (dated April 11, 1933);

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the change in point of diversion as applied for by Fred Gray and Dora Glee Congleton be approved subject to the provisions of said agreement.
